Wednesday, July 5, 1972

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 a.m., pursuant to law.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the June 20, 1972, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, June 24, 1972.

Industrial Railway Co. in the Village of Golden Valley, was ordered filed.
