VILLAGE MINUTE BOOK.

The law requires to be recorded in this book: Full minutes of all proceedings of the village council, including all communications and petitions addressed thereto, all bills presented and the full titles of all ordinances, rules, regulations and by-laws adopted, entering upon the margin, opposite the record of adoption, a reference to the book and page of the ordinance book where the ordinance is recorded; and full minutes of all village elections and the statements of the judges thereof. Before making entries similar to the suggestive form given below it is assumed that the village council have previously met and organized and adopted the usual full and complete "rules and regulations" for systematically and legally conducting their business, and have appointed the several proper committees to take the oversight of each branch of village business, such as finance, streets and alleys, licenses, local assessments, etc., all of which have been duly enacted and recorded in the ordinance book.

In conducting a council meeting the rules which have previously been established should be strictly followed and business should always be taken up and disposed of in the exact order as prescribed by the rules adopted.

The entries of an ordinary council meeting might be in substance as follows:

Clearwater Volunteer Fire Dept.

RURAL SERVICE DIVISION
Clearwater, Minn.

What is, and who controls, the Volunteer Fire Dept.?

Minnesota State Law provides that villages and cities may establish fire departments which are under the control of the governing body of the village or city, that is the Village Council in our case, and the governing body shall be under the supervision of the State Fire Marshall. The Clearwater Volunteer Fire Department is under the control of the Village Council, and the council is under the supervision (in this matter) of the State Fire Marshall.

What \$25.00 for ten years (or one fire) will buy.

1. THE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT is totally volunteer in nature, organized to render service, save lives and save property. Its membership of twenty (20) men is on call not eight hours each day—but twenty-four hours each day every day of the year.
2. Complete Fire Fighting equipment of the department when you, or your family are endangered, plus 20 well-trained men to operate the equipment.
3. Life saving and first aid equipment, and men trained in first aid to operate it.
4. Salvage equipment to recover bodies of drowned victims.
5. Men and equipment when needed to find a lost child or adult.

Why do you get this service for ten years for \$25.00?

These men realize that this community needs this service. They are all volunteers and draw no salary. The village keeps up the equipment, and pays the insurance on the men.

What do the men get for their service?

1. None of the men get any pay for this service. All are volunteers.
2. They attend twelve regular meetings, plus many special meetings, and in addition they pay, from their own pockets, 25c fine for each and every regular meeting they miss.
3. They drive their own cars hundreds of miles yearly, without expense allowance to attend fire schools, firemen's meetings and learn the latest methods of fire-fighting and life saving.
4. Within minutes after the siren sounds they are ready to go, regardless of time of day or night, week-days or holidays, winter or summer, rain or shine.
5. They are required to go regardless of how they are dressed, and regardless of the laundry and cleaning bills, and torn clothing, for which they pay personally.

Why is there a charge?

This is a co-operative undertaking whose cost is shared by the village and the community. There is never enough of the best equipment.

What is the \$25.00 used for?

The money is spent for new equipment, to give you the newest in fire fighting equipment, and to make the job SAFER for the firemen.

If you ever need this equipment —

This twenty-five dollars for ten years or one call is cheap. If you do not need it, it will be worth this amount and more, to know that it's available.

SHOULD YOU HAVE A FIRE—CALL "CLEARWATER OPERATOR"
Tell her your name and the fire call NUMBER on your contract, or assigned to you to be kept near your phone, and she will take care of the rest.

THINK IT OVER — TALK IT OVER — at home, with your neighbor, and with a fireman.

This membership for twenty-five dollars may save your life or the life of your family.

Ordinance #17

An Ordinance Providing for the
Establishment and Government of

A Volunteer Fire Department For
The Village Of Clearwater, Minn.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CLEARWATER, MINN.
THAT TO BETTER PROTECT THE LIVES AND PROPERTY OF ITS CITIZENS, A DEPARTMENT
TO BE HEREAFTER KNOWN AS THE "CLEARWATER FIRE DEPARTMENT" IS HEREBY
CREATED. ITS OBJECT SHALL BE THE PREVENTION OF FIRE AND THE PRESERVATION
AND PROTECTION OF LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM AND DURING SUCH FIRES AS MAY
OCCUR. TO THIS END THE FOLLOWING RULES SHALL GOVERN AND BE A PART
OF THIS ORDINANCE.

1. The department shall consist of as many volunteer members as the Council may from time to time determine upon.
2. Operation officers of the department shall consist of a chief, an assistant chief and such other officers as the chief may deem necessary.
3. The Chief shall be appointed by the council for an indefinite period, dependent upon his good conduct, and efficiency, and shall be accountable to the Council only.
All other company officers shall be accountable to the Chief of the department only.
4. Assistant Chief and ~~such~~ other operation officers shall be appointed by the Chief and be accountable to the Chief only, removable by him at his discretion.
5. The active membership of the department shall consist of such male citizens as the Chief may appoint, or the Council may appoint with the approval of the Chief. Any member may be suspended or discharged by the Chief at any time he may deem such action necessary for the good of the Department.
6. The Chief shall call the entire department together at least twice a month for the purpose of conducting suitable drills, Building inspection, First Aid and Rescue work, and such other practises as are generally accepted as having bearing upon good firemanship.
7. The Chief shall formulate and establish such rules and regulations to govern the department and shall be responsible to the council for personnel and efficiency of the department.
8. The Chief shall be the Fire Marshall of the village and shall cause inspections to be made of all non-residential buildings in the village, not less than twice each year. Where fire hazards are found, written notice to abate such hazard shall be served upon the owners, who shall comply within a specified time, and report to the chief of such abatement of hazard.
9. No unauthorized person shall ride upon, race with, trail or follow within 600 feet, any apparatus belonging to the fire department, when actively responding to a fire alarm.
10. All personal cars of fire department members shall have right of way over all other traffic when responding to an alarm.

- (A) The Council of the Village of Clearwater hereby authorizes the fire department of this village to answer when called to fires outside corporate limits of the village, as the council may direct, not to exceed ten (10) miles from said village.
- (B) The Council authorizes and empowers the Chief of the Clearwater Fire Department to take, (or order to be taken) not to exceed six (6) men, and such equipment as may be needed and would not jeopardize the safety of the residents of the village, in answer to any and all calls outside the corporate limits of the village, within the limits set forth above (A)
- (C) The Council charges the responsibility for the use and care of the equipment to the Chief of the fire department. He shall keep accurate record of the time of departure and return, and report same to the village clerk.
- (D) The village clerk shall then prepare a statement in triplicate, of the amount due the fire department and/or the village and mail or cause to be delivered to the proper person responsible for payment for the service the original statement, the duplicate to be delivered to the secretary of the fire department, and the triplicate copy to be retained in his file.
- (E) The rate to be charged for such runs outside the village shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) for the first hour, including the trip, and fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each additional hour.

11. NO person shall park any vehicle of any description, or place any material or obstruction within twenty feet of the entrance to the fire station, nor park within 300 feet of a fire.
12. No person shall maliciously sound a false fire alarm.
13. No person shall use any fire department apparatus or equipment for any private purpose, nor shall any person willfully and without proper authority remove, take away, keep or conceal any tool, Extinguisher, or other appliance or article used in any way by the fire department.
14. No person shall drive any vehicle over a fire hose except by specific orders from the chief, and then with due caution.
15. Any person violating the provisions of the sections 10-11-12-13-or 14, singly or severally, shall upon conviction in the justice court of the village, pay a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00
16. All regular appointed members of the fire department are hereby given the necessary special police powers to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.
17. It shall hereby be the special duty of the Chief of Police and other peace officers to respond to all fire alarms and assist the fire department in the protection of life and property of the citizens, and the property of the fire department, and controlling traffic, and maintaining order, particularly in reference to the violations of sections 10-11-12-13-and 14 of this ordinance.
18. All ordinances and sections of ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.
19. The Department may organize a Relief Association in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota.
20. The Council shall determine the radius of service to the surrounding Community, and shall establish rates for calls answered outside the village limits. This information shall be publicized.


