Your letter full of detail concerning Carl Panzer duly received and I thank you very much for the information given. I did not write with the intention of debating the question so much as securing information which was not obtainable except by writing, as is frequently the case. Can say that Mr. Panzer has somewhat of feebleness of mind and dullness aside from the one idea concerning which evidence was wanted by us. I Hope, however, that unless he gets worse we will not be obliged to keep him steadily.

"His story" is that his father was poor and he thought the best way to help him was to let him have the farm as long as he lived, while he could strike out and earn a living elsewhere; that there was no rent affixed but that the grain, and things left upon the farm were valued at \$800. for which his father paid him; that he was back three years ago and at that time there was no hint but that he owned the farm as usual, but that on coming back this time there seemed to be a question; that they at first told him he owned the land and later denied it, but that his father kept trying to ask him how much money he would take to give up such claim, but feeling that he owned it he would take nothing in the way of a bribe.

He knows that the so called deed is a contract but cannot see why a contract should be regarded. He seems honest in his beliefs,


