That the indications of insanity manifested by him are as follows: (Here give fully the symptoms on which the charge of insanity is based.) has spells of laughing all by himself without any known cause. has spells of threatening to do great bodily harm to other persons. has threatened to commit suicide

That said alleged insane person will not appear in said Court voluntarily, and that it will be necessary to issue a warrant to bring him before the Court.

The said Charles Pichner was born in Sleepy Eye Minn; is about 30 years of age and the parent of 70 children.

That his residence and place of legal settlement is Steele County, Minnesota. (If not a resident of Minnesota, set out as fully as possible where came from; how long has been in this state and in the county.)

The father of said alleged insane person, was born in Bohemia and the mother in Bohemia.

That said alleged insane person manifests a disposition to injure others; has attempted suicide; is not filthy in his habits.

That neither of his parents were ever insane.

That he is stetly addicted to intemperance.

That he does not habitually use narcotics.

That his parents have been addicted to intemperance or the habitual use of narcotics.

That no restraint has been employed.

That the supposed cause of insanity is unknown

That said alleged insane person is the owner of and entitled to the following described personal property: about Five hundred dollars cash and the following described real estate: none
