The petition of G. A. Meyer for an order of this Court directing an inspection and recount of the ballots cast at the general election held on November 6th, 1934, for the election of Representative in the Legislature from Washington County, Minnesota, composing the Forty-third Legislative District of said State, insofar as the contestant and contestee are concerned, and for the appointment of three persons as inspectors to inspect and recount said ballots, came duly on to be heard by and before the above named Court at a special term thereof held at the Court House in the City of Stillwater, Washington County, Minnesota, on November 12th, 1934. The contestant appeared by his attorney, Reuben G. Thoreon, Esq., and the contestee, W. C. Daly,

appeared in person and by his attorney, C. E. Carlson, Esq. Notice of hearing on said petition was waived by stipulation of the parties made in open Court.

It appeared to the Court that this election contest has been instituted pursuant to and in the manner provided by law, and that the contestant cannot properly prepare his case for the trial of said election contest without an inspection and recount of said ballots.

After hearing the matter and being fully advised,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

I.

That the ballots cast at the general election held on November 6th, 1934, for the office of Representative in the Legislature from Washington

County, Minnesota, composing the Forty-third Legislative District of said State, insofar as the contestant and the contestee are concerned, be inspected and recounted in the presence of J. F. Kilty, County Auditor of Washington County, Minnesota, the legal custodian of said ballots, by the inspectors, hereinafter named, at the time and as hereinafter provided.

II.

Said contestant having selected J. G. Armson as one of said inspectors, and said contestee having selected Thomas F. Daly as one of said inspectors, and said J. G. Armson and Thomas F. Daly having reported to the Court that they are unable to agree upon any person as the third inspector, and the parties hereto having failed to agree upon any person as such third inspector, said J. G. Armson and said Thomas F. Daly and Frank H. Osterlind, who is hereby appointed by the Court as the third inspector, are hereby appointed inspectors for the purpose of inspecting and recounting said ballots.

III.

By stipulation of both parties to this contest, made in open Court, said inspectors are required to meet at the office of the County Auditor of Washington County, Minnesota, on Monday, November 19th, 1934, at nine o'clock A. M. and enter upon the discharge of their duties to thereupon inspect and recount said ballots as expeditiously as possible and upon the completion of their duties to make a report of their findings as soon as practicable.

NOTICE OF CONTEST.

To W. C. Daly, Contestee.

Sir:

Please take notice that the undersigned, G. A. Meyer, hereby contests the validity of your election to the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota from the Forty-third Legislative District of said State composed of Washington County, and contests your right to a seat in said House of Representatives and hereby asserts and alleges that the undersigned was duly elected to the House of Representatives from said District at the election held November 6th, 1934, and claims the right to the seat in said House of Representatives by virtue thereof; that the points upon which this contest will be made are as follows, to-wit:

1. That the contestant, G. A. Meyer, and the contestee, W. C. Daly, were each duly nominated for the office of Representative in the Legislature from the Forty-third Legislative District at the primary election held on June 18th, 1934, and the names of contestant and contestee were duly placed and printed on the official ballot for said office in said county for the election to be held November 6th, 1934, and contestant and contestee were each candidates for election to said office of Representative in the Legislature at the election held November 6th, 1934.

That according to the report of the County Canvassing Board of said Washington County, made on November 9th, 1934, said contestee, W. C. Daly, received forty-six hundred and ninety (4690) votes for said office, and contestant, G. A. Meyer, received forty-six hundred and forty-nine (4649) votes for said office; that in truth and in fact this contestant, G. A. Meyer, received at least forty-seven hundred and forty-nine (4749) votes for said office, and said contestee did not receive to exceed forty-five hundred and ninety (4590) votes for said office, but the several judges and clerks of election in the election precincts of said county erroneously counted at least one hundred (100) ballots in favor of said W. C. Daly for said office, which said ballots were cast for and should have been counted for said contestant, and in making up the official returns from the several precincts in said county the judges and clerks of election in said precinct in said county erroneously returned at least three (3) votes from each precinct as being cast in favor of W. C. Daly, which votes were in fact cast for said contestant in each such precinct, and also erroneously returned at least three (3) votes from each precinct in favor of said contestant less than were in fact cast for said contestant in each such precinct, and by reason of the said errors of said judges and clerks of election in each precinct in said county in counting said ballots and in making said returns to the County Canvassing Board pursuant thereto, the said returns as canvassed by said County Canvassing Board erroneously showed that said W. C. Daly had received forty-six hundred and ninety (4690) votes for said office of Representative in the Legislature whereas in truth and in fact said W. C. Daly had not received to exceed forty-five hundred and ninety (4590) votes for said office, and said returns erroneously showed, as aforesaid, that said contestant had received forty-six hundred and forty-nine (4649) votes for said office whereas in truth and in fact contestant had received at least forty-seven hundred and forty-nine (4749) votes for said office, and that an inspection and recount of the original ballots cast for said office will disclose the said errors and mistakes of said judges and clerks of election in counting said ballots, as aforesaid, and in making said returns erroneously, as hereinbefore set forth.

2. That said contestee did on many occasions and in many places in said Washington County between the primary election, held on June 18th, 1934, and the general election, held on November 6th, 1934, violate the Corrupt Practices Act of this State relating to elections, which violations influenced many voters to vote for said contestee, who would otherwise have voted for this contestant; that said violations consisted of purchasing beer, intoxicating liquor and cigars in many places in Washington County for many persons who were legal voters in said county, with the intent and/or hope to influence said persons to vote for said contestee, contrary to the provisions of Section 547, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927.

That by reason of the foregoing the election of said W. C. Daly, as declared by said County Canvassing Board, is invalid and illegal, and in truth and in fact the said contestant, G. A. Meyer, is one of the duly elected representatives in the Legislature from said District and was duly elected at said election as such representative in the Legislature from said Forty-third Legislative District and should be declared elected to said office and to have good right to a seat in the House of Representatives by reason thereof.

WHEREFORE, Contestant prays the Court to determine the facts to be as herein alleged and to thereupon report the matter to the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, as provided by law.

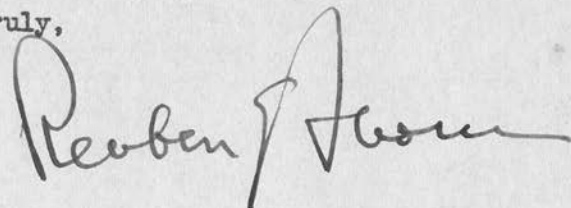

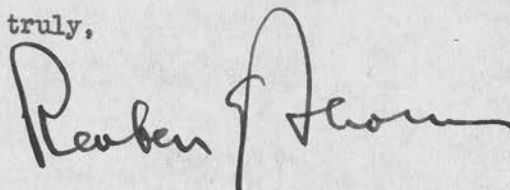
