28 Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a quorum being present, a Regular Meeting of the Rice Creek Watershed District Board
29 of Managers was called to order by President Waddell on March 13, 2002, at 7:02 p.m.

SETTING OF THE AGENDA

32 Under ACTION ITEMS, Torpe added Item 12. Engineer Weidenbacher's Request for Permission to Release to WSB a copy of
33 Digital Modeling Information owned by RCWD. Under INFORMATION ITEMS, Naber added Item 7a. EOR Memo Summarizing
34 WCA Changes. *The Board adopted the amended Agenda by consensus.*

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND/OR PRESENTATIONS

37 There were none scheduled.

READING OF THE MINUTES AND THEIR APPROVAL

41 1. **Minutes of February 27, 2002, Board of Managers Meeting.** *Motion by Manager Cardinal to dispense with the*
42 *reading of the minutes and approve as mailed. Seconded by Manager Leroux.* During discussion, Manager Doege requested
43 removal of "...work on..." to be replaced with "...mitigation plan for..." to clarify his intent at Line 254. Motion and second agreed
44 to incorporate this change. *Motion carried 5-0.*

52 Regarding Applicant's plan to totally fill a wetland on his property and compensate by purchasing wetland credits,
53 Inspector Daleiden, Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP) member, presented the Managers with the TEP's Findings of Fact: "The
54 sequencing argument provided is not sufficient and the applicant can avoid most, if not all, of the wetland impacts on this site."
55 Applicant made a full presentation to the Board stating all of the reasons why he should be allowed to fill the wetland.

56 *Motion to deny filling of wetland: Haake/Leroux. Motion failed 2-3 (Nays: Leroux, Doege, Cardinal).*

57 *Motion to adopt the District Engineer's Findings and Recommendation as contained in the Engineer's Report dated 3-6-*
58 *02 to TABLE PA#02-012 pro 3 items to the 3-27-02 Board meeting with an alternate design: Haake/Cardinal. Carried 5-0.*

61 **OPEN MIKE** *Individuals may address the Board of Managers about any item not included on the regular agenda. Speakers are requested to*
 62 *come to the podium, state their name and address for the record, and limit their remarks to three minutes. Generally the Board of Managers will*
 63 *not take official action on items discussed at this time, but may typically refer the matter to staff for a future report or direct that the matter be*
 64 *scheduled on an upcoming agenda. At 8:04 p.m., President Waddell opened the microphone to those present.*

65 a) John Trost, 12760 Hanson Blvd. NW Coon Rapids, inquired whether RCWD is going to give a permit for construction of a golf
 66 course north of the Anoka County-Blaine Airport. Haake responded that the proposed 30 acres of filled wetland is now down to
 67 six acres which is located in the Coon Creek Watershed District, so the RCWD will not be asked to issue a permit. Secondly Mr.
 68 Trost stated that Circle Pines is dumping water through a pipe under 35W set at elevation 894.0 or 895.0 from a new shopping
 69 center and a park down onto "us", but the City objects to having Ditch 53-62 lowered to 890.0. and he seeks relief from that
 70 flooding. Manager Doege will meet with Mr. Trost and go see the referenced culvert. Trost asked what the latest information is
 71 on Ditch 53-62. Doege invited him to sit in on the discussion later in the agenda which addresses that ditch.
 72

73 b) John Waller, 14010 Homestead Avenue N, Hugo, stated that his brother Ed, asks two questions: 1. Will the RCWD identify
 74 and delineate incidental wetlands that existed when the it was given jurisdiction over the judicial ditches? Do we know the sizes
 75 that were in existence so that we can determine and identify when flooding takes place? John Waller stated that his brother
 76 suggested two checks for this information: one would be aerial photos, and the other would be the physical evidence of trees, for
 77 example whether they are alive or dead. 2. Is the watershed district still exempt for minor maintenance on Judicial Ditch #2?
 78 Does the WD still have authority to dump the spoils from minor maintenance on the side of the wetland? John said Ed would
 79 appreciate an answer to those questions in the near future.

80 Waddell asked Waller about a comment he had made as the two were leaving the Advisory Committee meeting on 3-6-
 81 02. Waddell went on to recall the situation: the two were following up their discussion of policies and what is proposed for JD2,
 82 and Waller said something about making sure the Board decides at 3/13/02 meeting, and Waddell recalled laughing and saying
 83 he wasn't going to have to worry about it, whereupon Waller's response was "I hope your insurance is paid up." Waddell
 84 remembered telling Waller that yes, it was, and after thinking about it later, wondered what exactly had been meant by that; he
 85 asked Waller for clarification. Waller informed it was a comment about security, adding that insecurity is always best insured.
 86 Waddell informed Waller that such a comment was completely inappropriate, since it could have been interpreted as a threat,
 87 although he was not worried about it. Mr. Waller apologized and said that it was not meant as a threat toward an individual, but
 88 was directed at the Watershed Board's decision responsibility, which was what was under discussion at the time.
 89

90 c) Roger Aiken, Advisory Committee Liaison, 4360 Hamline, Arden Hills, thanked Manager Waddell on behalf of the Advisory
 91 Committee and himself for the good work that he has done, having "fallen into a difficult situation" with the previous Board
 92 president passing away at a critical juncture in the Board's history, but Waddell has done well with the responsibility, in the AC
 93 opinion. Aiken went on to compliment the Board as a whole, stating they have been through some hard times, have come to
 94 grips, and shown some good decision-making abilities.
 95

96 Open Mike ended at 8:20 p.m. with no other persons wishing to address the Board.
 97

98 **ADDITIONAL ITEMS REQUIRING BOARD ACTION**

99 1. **Consider Cooperative Agreement with City of Hugo for XP-SWMM Model for JD2 reach West of Highway 61**
 100 (Agmt fm Hugo). Managers reviewed the Draft Agreement and a memo from Brett Emmons, EOR, suggesting two additions be
 101 made. *Motion by Haake, seconded by Leroux, to authorize President Waddell to sign the Agreement upon suggested changes*
 102 *being made. Carried 5-0.*
 103

104 2. **Consider Authorization to Disburse \$10,000 Grant to City of Forest Lake for Wetland Inventory (B.Torpe memo).**
 105 The Board reviewed a memo which detailed the transmittal of the assessment report, the request for additional funding
 106 contribution, history of the Board's original action (see minutes of 5-9-01, Line 123), and the 2002 Operational Plan segment that
 107 is applicable. Engineer Emmons described the portion of RCWD that is involved in this MUSA 2020 expansion area. *Motion*
 108 *made by Cardinal, seconded by Leroux to approve disbursement of the \$10,000 grant to the City of Forest Lake. Discussion*
 109 *followed. Motion carried with 4 Ayes, no Nays and 1 abstention (Waddell).*

110 (a) **Request of Bonestroo Rosene Anderlik for Additional Funds in the Amount of \$2,800.** *Motion by Haake to*
 111 *deny the request for \$2,800 additional funding for the additional wetlands assessed by Bonestroo. Seconded by Leroux for*
 112 *discussion purposes. Discussion followed. Leroux queried what Forest Lake has done regarding the 190th Street Drainage*
 113 *problem (the Washington JD7 Tile clean-out/repair). Budelis informed that they await RCWD's direction, and will proceed once*
 114 *they receive data from RCWD. Budelis will confer with the City, discuss with our Inspector and Engineer, and give the Board a*
 115 *complete report in two weeks. Motion failed with 2 ayes and 3 nays. Leroux requested reconsideration on the 3-27-02 Agenda.*
 116

117 3. **Consider Wenck & Associates Agreement for Computer Services (see Agmt).** *Motion by Haake, seconded by*
 118 *Cardinal, that the Board sign the revised Wenck Agreement. Carried 5-0.*
 119

120 4. **Report by Liaison Waddell and Minutes of 3/6/02 Advisory Committee Meeting: Consider Advisory Committee**
 121 **Recommendations for Board Action:** Liaison Waddell reported on matters discussed at the AC meeting, and referenced
 122 printed minutes for details.

- 123 a) **Authorize Administrator to assist AC in writing LCMR Grant Application for possible Greenways**
 124 **Projects in the District: AnCo D53-62, Schuneman Marsh, Hardwood Creek.** *Motion by Haake, seconded by Cardinal, to*
 125 *approve the Administrator assisting in writing an LCMR Grant Application for Greenways Projects. Carried 5-0.*
- 126 b) **Appoint John Waller to Advisory Committee Membership.** *Motion by Cardinal, seconded by Haake, to*
 127 *appoint John Waller to membership on the Advisory Committee for year 2002.* During discussion, Waddell commented that he
 128 does not want John to be our formal person representing the District when he is capable of making such comments as he made
 129 to me, be it hastily said or however, (Waddell stated his appreciation for Waller's apology), he felt the comment was way out of
 130 bounds, and he does not want that type of remark to be what we are known for in this District. Both Managers Leroux and
 131 Cardinal, having known John Waller and his family for many years, had supportive comments to make about him. Question
 132 called, *motion carried with 4 Ayes and 1 Nay.* Waddell welcomed Waller to the Advisory Committee; John thanked the Board
 133 President, and stated that he felt he would be able to represent the District in an appropriate manner.
- 134 c) **Authorize EOR to monitor [water quality] btwn Rice Lake & Hardwood Creek outlet until the end of '02**
 135 **and evaluate at that time for further monitoring.** *Deferred until discussion of Action Item 7.*
- 136
- 137 5. **Consider Proposal for Hugo City Hall Infiltration Monitoring and Education Project + Authorization of \$10,250 for**
 138 **Engineering (EOR memo).** Managers reviewed a Memorandum from EOR dated 3-1-02. *Motion by Cardinal, seconded by*
 139 *Leroux, to authorize EOR in the amount of \$10,250 to work with RCWD and City Staff to monitor and promote education of*
 140 *infiltration practices at the Hugo City Hall Infiltration Demonstration Site. Discussion. Carried 5-0.*
- 141
- 142 6. **Consider Proposal for Anoka Co. Ditch 53-62 Alternative Mitigation Options Scoping Effort + Authorization of**
 143 **\$7,300 for Engineering (EOR memo).** Managers reviewed a Memorandum from EOR dated 3-1-02. *Motion by Doege,*
 144 *seconded by Cardinal to authorize EOR in the amount of \$7,300 to research and analyze mitigation alternatives for the Anoka*
 145 *Co. Ditch 53-62 project.* Haake queried why RCWD is paying for this. Attorney Sheff responded that this is data gathering to be
 146 used later in negotiating the bill. *Motion carried 5-0.*
- 147
- 148 7. **Consider Proposal for Hardwood Creek Watershed-Phosphorus Investigation Approach and Potential Costs**
 149 **(EOR memo).** Managers reviewed a Memorandum from EOR dated 3-6-02. *Motion by Doege, seconded by Leroux, to approve*
 150 *the approach and authorize EOR in the amount of \$19,300 for this Study. Carried 5-0.*
- 151
- 152 8. **Consider Entering into Agreement w/Wash. SWCD for Lake Gauging during 2002 at a cost of \$2,025.** *Motion by*
 153 *Leroux, seconded by Cardinal, to enter into agreement with the Wash. SWCD for 2002 Lake Gauging Program. Carried 5-0.*
- 154
- 155 9. **Consider Approval of Accounts Payable in the amount of \$47,744.43 dated 3-7-02, as Prepared by Boyum &**
 156 **Barenscheer, CPAs.** *Motion by Haake, seconded by Doege, to approve Checks #11150 thru 11153, and 11158-11168 for a*
 157 *total amount of \$47,744.43. Carried 5-0.*
- 158
- 159 10. **Consider Wash. JD2 Culvert Plans & Specifications, including Authorization of \$11,000 for Engineering (EOR**
 160 **memo).** Managers reviewed a memorandum from EOR dated 3-5-02. *Motion by Leroux, seconded by Cardinal, to authorize*
 161 *\$11,000 for EOR's preparation of application to MnDOT for State Bridge Bond funding to replace four culverts in JD2.* Managers
 162 reviewed a Draft Technical Memorandum dated 3-12-02, reviewed by J.Polzin. Haake requested that the minutes clearly state
 163 that the RCWD expects to receive cooperative funding for engineering work, supported by a cooperative funding agreement from
 164 the other entities on the Blue Ribbon Task Force. *Carried 5-0.*
- 165
- 166 11. **Consider Recommendation/TEP Findings for Village Hills Commercial: Permit Appl #02-025 (L.Daleiden**
 167 **handout).** Managers heard Daleiden review the *Technical Evaluation Panel Findings and Comments* dated 3-13-02, which
 168 detailed latest information and discussions. The TEP recommended denial of application for Incidental Wetland Exemption and
 169 denial of application of No-Loss Exemption, but recommended acceptance of the Wetland Replacement Plan with the newly
 170 determined square footage determined in the field on 3-13-02 with the understanding that a re-delineation may be conducted in
 171 Spring 2002. Administrator Hobbs and Manager Doege both complimented Daleiden on his work. *Motion by Haake seconded by*
 172 *Doege, to deny the applications for Incidental Wetland and No-Loss WCA Exemptions on this site. Carried 5-0.*
- 173
- 174 12. **Engineer Weidenbacher's Request for Permission to Release to WSB a copy of Digital Modeling Information**
 175 **owned by RCWD.** WSB has requested the HEC-RAS modeling of Washington JD2 performed by Montgomery Watson
 176 Engineers for the District, both existing and after cleaning, for the area from Hardwood Creek to 20th Avenue Hugo. *Motion by*
 177 *Leroux, seconded by Cardinal, to direct Engineer Weidenbacher to release a copy of the requested information to Hugo's water*
 178 *quality/quantity engineers. Carried 5-0.*

193 Continue coordinating on City of Hugo local plan, Continue coordination re: Hugo and Forest Lake modeling, Submit 2nd round of
194 comments to Arden Hills.
195 **Infiltration BMP Evaluation Study.** Identified potential demonstration sites in Lino Lakes, coordinated with City re:
196 feasibility of potential sites. Next: Determine feasibility and timing of potential demonstration sites, Provide input on revising
197 infiltration standards for future Rules revisions.
198 **Hardwood Creek Outlet Treatment System Options Analysis.** Scoping effort to look at upstream pollutant loading
199 sources, Set up meeting with landowner to discuss report. Next: Present and obtain feedback at city level, Consider analyzing
200 upstream sources of pollutants.
201 **Highway 61 Water Quality Improvement Wetland Project.** MPCA issued permit waiver. Next: Initiate easement

212 survey. Next: Provide contract management services, Prepare punch list after spring runoff, Prepare as-built drawing.
213 **Mounds View-Highway 10 Regional Pond.** Press Release issued to *Mounds View Bulletin* on 1-25-02, Notice
214 published in EQB Monitor on 2-18-02 and 30-day public comment period began. Next: Review and provide written response to
215 all comments received, Discuss comments received and consider need for EIS at 4-10-02 Board mtg.
216 **Ditch Operation and Maintenance Program.** Prepared CADD drawing of surveyed JD7 tile alignment, Reviewed JD
217 tile line video w/District Staff. Next: Continue engineering assistance (as requested).
218 **2001 Clearwater Creek Bank Stabilization Projects.** Continued preliminary design drafting, Held prelim. design DNR
219 coordination mtg. Next: Draft preliminary plans, Coordinate access.
220 **AnCo D53-62 Mitigation Design.** Met w/landowner, workgroup, and conservation groups, Submitted draft Technical
221 Memo to TEP. Next: Obtain agency feedback/approval of project approach, Define landowner compensation expectations.
222 **2000 Long Lake Sediment Removal Project.** Met w/landscaping sub-contractor on-site to discuss restoration,
223 Recommended approval of Pay Request #1. Next: Work with Contractor Veit to change restoration plan as requested by
224 RamCo Parks, Change Order for EOR as Engineer.
225 **Wash. JD2 Hydraulic Analysis and Culverts Design.** Draft cooperative agreement presented to Hugo, WashCo and
226 Forest Lake, Final list of alternatives presented to Hugo staff on 2-27-02, Draft construction plans for Harrow Avenue all
227 crossings completed. Next: Finalize technical memorandum summarizing results of modeling, Finalize construction plans,
228 Finalize cooperative agreement, Present 90% draft plans at 3-13-02 Board mtg.

231 consider holding a workshop meeting to determine if additional efforts should be focused on approval of local plans, and discuss

235 reviewed Memorandum dated 3-5-02 and used profile map for clarity in providing summary historical information.

- 239 7a. **EOR Memo Summarizing WCA Changes.** Managers reviewed a Memorandum from EOR dated 3-13-02, and heard J.
240 Naber recommend the Board review the bolded changes and provide direction to EOR re: desire to comment on these changes
241 by the deadline: 3-15-02. If all are approved, there will be more Staff involvement, more TEP meeting requirements.

- 243 8. **Closed Session re: Matters in Litigation.** There was no need for a closed session at this time.


245 Cardinal inquired when a workshop will be scheduled to discuss policy for ditch maintenance and repair, instead of an
246 hour before the meeting. Haake suggested we meet in another month, allowing new Administrator time to get up to speed.

248 Waddell informed he will be distributing a questionnaire to all for comments on engineering staff because they are due a
250 performance review. He also suggested reorganization of offices since 3-27-02 will be his last Board meeting.

251 Cardinal announced that Loren Hentges will be returning to Minnesota April 1, and would like to be included in
252 discussions of anything pertaining to AnCo Ditch 53-62.
