The petition of Lewis A. Brown, one of the heirs of said deceased, for the correction and amendment of the final decree made and entered in the matter of said estate in said court on the 11th day of September, 1903, having come on to be heard duly before said court;

And it appearing from said petition and from the records and files in said court that said final decree is erroneous, incorrect in the description of ~~certain~~ real property in said final decree described; that the said real estate in question is described in said final decree as follows:

" An undivided one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the following described property to-wit: the south twenty and five twelfths (S 20 $\frac{5}{12}$) feet of lot No. seven (7), and the north two (N 2) feet of lot No. six (6) in block No. twenty one (21) in the village (now city) of Albert Lea, Minn., as the same is platted and recorded in the office of Register of Deeds in and for said Freeborn County. "

Whereas, the correct and legal description thereof is as follows:

The undivided one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the south twenty (20) feet and eight (8) inches in width off from the south side of lot seven (7) and the north two (2) feet in width off from the north side of lot six (6), all in block twenty one (21) in the city of Albert Lea, Minnesota, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of the register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County, being twenty two (22) feet and eight (8) inches frontage on Broadway and extending in parallel lines west to the alley.

And it appearing further that the said error occurred through the inadvertance and mistake on the part of this court in entering said description in said final decree.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed, and this court by virtue of the power and authority vested in the same by law does hereby order, adjudge and decree that said final decree be and the same hereby is corrected, modified and amended as in said petition prayed and so as to conform to the findings herein; and that said final decree be and the same hereby is this day amended as aforesaid.

It is further ordered that said decree so amended together with this order be forthwith filed and substituted for said final decree, and that when so filed and recorded the same shall in all things take the place of said final decree heretofore made and entered in said cause and matter.

IT APPEARING to the court now here, on satisfactory proofs and the evidence, that the necessary expenses of funeral, of last sickness of said deceased, and of administration of said estate, have been fully paid, and that all the debts existing against said deceased, or allowed by the court, pursuant to law, have been fully paid and satisfied, and that said estate has been fully administered, as by the final account of Harris N. Brown, administrator with will annexed of said estate, duly audited and allowed by this court, pursuant to due notice given and served, will appear, reference being had thereto.

AND IT FURTHER APPEARING that due notice of the application for this final decree in said matter, assigning the estate to the persons thereto entitled by law, has likewise been duly given and served pursuant to the law in such case made and provided.

AND IT FURTHER APPEARING that the said deceased died testate, and the residue of said estate consists of the following described real estate, to-wit:

The following property lying and being in the County of Freeborn and State of Minnesota.

1. Commencing seven (7) chains and fifty (50) links west of the quarter stake on the east side of section No. eight (8) in township No. one hundred and two (102), north of range No. twenty one (21) west, running thence north twenty (20) chains; thence east one (1) chain and ninety one (91) links, thence south twenty (20) chains, thence west one chain and ninety one (91) links to the place of beginning, subject to flowage, granted to A. Armstrong and George S. Ruble on the north side of said premises- except that portion of the above described land included in Cherry Street Addition to the city of Albert Lea, according to the recorded plat thereof in the office of the register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County- excepting also a piece of land heretofore deeded to Harris N. Brown described as follows: commencing at the northwest corner of block No. one (1), in the village (now city) of Albert Lea as the same is platted and recorded in the office of register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County, running thence north ten (10) feet; thence east one (1) chain and twenty two (22) links; thence south ten (10) feet, thence west one chain and twenty two (22) links to place of beginning; said deed being recorded in Book twenty five (25) of deeds on page five hundred and one (501), in the office of the register of deeds in and for Freeborn County. Also all that part of the following described property lying west of Cherry Street, and north of Fountain Street; commencing seventy five (75) links west of the quarter post on the east line of section No. eight (8), of township one hundred and two (102) north, of range twenty one (21) west, running thence west four (4) chains and eighty four (84) links, thence north twenty (20) chain, thence east four (4) chains and eighty four (84) links, thence south twenty (20) chains to place of beginning.

2. The south two (2) feet, of the north eighty two and one half (82½) feet, of lots No. six (6), seven (7), and eight (8), in block No. one (1), in the village (now city) of Albert Lea, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of Register of deeds, in and for said Freeborn County, being a strip of land two (2) feet in width north and south and ninety nine (99) feet in length east and west.

3. The south one hundred fifteen and one half (115½) feet of lots No. nine (9), ten (10) and eleven (11) in block No. one (1), in the village (now city) of Albert Lea, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of Register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County being a strip of land one hundred and fifteen and one half (115½) feet in width north and south and ninety nine (99) feet in length east and west.

4. The south nineteen (19) feet of lot No. seven (7) and the north six (6) feet, of lot No. six (6), in block No. eight (8) in the Village (now city) of Albert Lea as the same is platted and recorded in the office of Register of Deeds in and for said Freeborn County.

5- Lot No. five (5) and the south six (6) feet, of lot No. six (6), all in block No. seven (7), in the village (now city) of Albert Lea as the same is platted and recorded in the office of register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County.

6- Lots "C", "D", and "E", in Cherry Street Addition to the city of Albert Lea as the same is platted and recorded in the office of register of deeds, in and for said Freeborn County.

7- All of Fairview Addition to the City of Albert Lea, Minn., as appears by the plat of record in the office of the County Auditor in and for Freeborn County, Albert Lea, Minn., except a piece of land off from the same described as follows, to-wit: A part of the south one half ($S\frac{1}{2}$) of the northwest one fourth ($NW\frac{1}{4}$) of section No. eight (8), in township one hundred and two (102), north of range No. twenty-one (21), west, described as follows: commencing at a point on the south line of the right of way of the Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway, which point is four hundred and seventy seven (477) feet, east of the west line of section No. eight (8); thence south, four hundred and seventy one (S 471) feet; thence east two hundred and twenty (220) feet; thence north three hundred and eighty one (N381) feet, to a point on the said south line of said right of way; thence northwesterly along said right of way, to the place of beginning; said land being represented on the Auditor's plat above referred to as lots four (4) and five (5) in block four (4) of Fairview Addition.

8- The undivided one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the south twenty (20) feet and eight (8) inches in width off from the south side of lot seven (7) and the north two (2) feet in width off from the north side of lot six (6), all in block twenty one (21) in the city of Albert Lea, Minnesota, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of the register of deeds in and for said Freeborn County, being twenty two (22) feet and eight (8) inches frontage on Broadway and extending in parallel lines west to the alley.

9. The west one half ($W\frac{1}{2}$) of the northwest one fourth ($NW\frac{1}{4}$) and the southwest one fourth ($SW\frac{1}{4}$) of section No. twenty one (21) in township No. one hundred and two (102), north of range No. twenty one (21) west.

10- The south one half ($S\frac{1}{2}$) of the southeast one fourth ($SE\frac{1}{4}$) of section No. seventeen (17) and the north one half ($N\frac{1}{2}$) of the northeast quarter ($NE\frac{1}{4}$), of section No. twenty (20) in township one hundred and two (102) north of range No. twenty one (21) west, excepting that portion of the same constituting the right of way of the Burlington Cedar Rapids and Northern Railway, and other pieces more particularly described as follows: fifty (50) feet in width on each side of the center line of said Railway where the same is now definitely located, over and across the northwest one fourth ($NW\frac{1}{4}$) of the northeast one fourth ($NE\frac{1}{4}$) of section No. twenty (20), and also over the south one half ($S\frac{1}{2}$) of the southeast one fourth ($SE\frac{1}{4}$) of section No. seventeen (17); all in township one hundred and two (102) north of range twenty one (21) west. Also an extra strip of land twenty five (25) feet in width on each side of said right of way between sections No. two thousand two hundred and seventy nine (2279), and two thousand two hundred and eighty three (2283) containing in all six and twenty one, one hundredths ($6\frac{21}{100}$) acres.

Now come H. N. Brown, L. A. Brown and Fred Brown, heirs at law and next of kin of said H. D. Brown, deceased, and legatees under his will, and each and all of them object to the allowance and payment of that certain claim of \$2500.00, either in whole or in part, filed against said estate by The Albert Lea College, and which said claim is evidenced by a writing, bearing date May 23rd, 1901, purporting to have been signed by said H. (5) That said instrument purports to be and was intended as a gift mortis causa, and as such is and was at the time of the execution thereof illegal, null and void.

(6) That said instrument and claim is illegal, null and void on its face.

(7) That it appears upon the face of said instrument that it is and was merely an agreement to make a gift, and as such, was and is wholly ineffectual and invalid for any purpose, and as such was and is illegal, null and void.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That Mary L. Brown, widow of the above named deceased and Lewis A. Brown, Harris N. Brown and Fred C. Brown, being each sons of the above named deceased, said four persons being all of the legatees and devisees under the last will and testament of said deceased, and being all of the heirs of said deceased, do hereby ratify and confirm each and every satisfaction of mortgage and each and every assignment of mortgage heretofore executed by Harris N. Brown as administrator of the estate of Horatio D. Brown, deceased, regardless of whether executed prior or subsequent to Sept. 11, 1903.

The last will and testament of said deceased was duly admitted to proof and probate by and before said probate court on September 16, 1901, and no appeal was ever taken from said order. The final decree in said estate was duly and regularly entered September 11, 1903, and on the same day said Harris N. Brown, who had been duly appointed as administrator of said estate, with the will annexed, in the year 1901, was without the knowledge of either of the undersigned, discharged by order of the probate court.

This discharge was not known by said Harris N. Brown and was not known to any of the undersigned persons and said Harris N. Brown and each and every of the undersigned persons believed in good faith that he still continued as such administrator until the month of July 1911, when their attention was first directed to the fact that unknown to any of them he had been discharged by said order of the probate court on September 11, 1903.

From time to time since September 11, 1903, assignments of mortgages and satisfactions of mortgages have been executed and delivered by said Harris N. Brown as administrator of said estate. Such satisfactions and such assignments were executed with our approval and we hereby consent and agree that they shall be effective for all purposes the same as if said Harris N. Brown still continued the administrator of said estate and the same as if said order discharging him had never been made and as if each of the undersigned had joined in executing the same.

With particular reference to the mortgage assignment which is recorded in Book 20 of Mortgages in the office of said Register of Deeds at page 79 running to Peter Tonges, we state that the mortgage debt secured by said mortgage consisted of several promissory notes owned by said Horatio D. Brown at the time of his death which were listed as numbers 11, 12, 13 and 16 in the general inventory filed October 3, 1901, in said probate court in the matter of said estate; that each of said notes were duly sold to said Peter Tonges long prior to August 20, 1903, and that the proceeds of said notes were duly received by said Harris N. Brown as administrator aforesaid long prior to August 20, 1903, and that said proceeds are listed and included in his report filed in said probate court in said cause on August 20, 1903, that said assignment of mortgage last above mentioned was given simply to make the transaction clear of record.




