MINNESOTA STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

Three Hundred Fifty-Sixth Meeting

January 13, 1958. The Board met at 7:45 A.M., College of Pharmacy, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. Members present - President Ivan E. Peterson, Vice-President Robert F. Berg, Angus H. Taylor, Floyd M. Alcott and James M. Gardner.

The following appeared to take the practical examination as they had passed the written examination at a previous examination given by the Board and at this time they had fulfilled the requirement of at least one year of apprenticeship training:

*This candidate appeared to retake the practical as he had failed to obtain a mark of 75 percent or better in that subject in a previous examination, hence he was not eligible for registration as a pharmacist as a minimum of 75 percent is required in the practical work.

The following having completed the one year of practical training took the entire Board examination:

The Board spent the entire day giving the practical examination. The students were given six prescriptions to compound in the morning.

The Board adjourned at 12:00 noon for lunch and reconvened at 1:00 P.M.

The students were given nine count-and-pour prescriptions in the afternoon. The class finished their prescriptions at approximately 3:30 in the afternoon. The Board members continued working until 5:00 P.M., arranging papers and prescriptions.

January 14, 1958. The Board met at Wesbrook Hall at 7:45 A.M., for the purpose of giving the written examination to 14 candidates. Each Board member was present to monitor his own examination and when any Board member was not giving his examination he spent that time at the College of Pharmacy marking prescriptions which had been filled by the candidates the day before.

In addition to giving the written examination to the nine candidates who were eligible to take the entire examination, the following candidates appeared but were eligible to take only the written examination as they had not yet obtained the required one year of apprenticeship training.

Total taking the written examination was 14.

January 15, 1958. The Board met with each candidate who had taken the entire examination and those who had previously taken the written examination and passed and took only the practical examination at this meeting. Fifteen minutes was devoted to each candidate during the oral interview and each Board member asked certain questions. The interviews began at 9:00 A.M., and the Board adjourned at 12:00 noon for lunch and reconvened at 1:30 P.M. The interviews were completed at 5:15 P.M.

January 16, 1958. The Board members spent the morning in marking part of their written examination papers.

At 2:00 P.M., Philip J. Stein of the Stein Drugs, 120 E. Fourth Street, St. Paul, appeared before the Board to explain why he was involved in a recent lawsuit in which he was charged with substituting on four different prescriptions. He was asked to bring these four prescriptions with him when he appeared before the Board and any other evidence he would care to bring. Mr. Stein was severely reprimanded by the Board members and he promised that he would never substitute again in any prescriptions. He was also informed if he violated any of the laws or regulations of the Board he would automatically be cited to appear before the Board to show casue why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked.

At 2:45 P.M., Erwin A. Brey of the South Park Drugs, 401 - 15th Avenue North, South St. Paul, appeared before the Board to answer charges that that he was not keeping his drug stores covered at all times by a registered pharmacist and also, that he had allowed unregistered persons to fill prescriptions. Mr. Brey was given an opportunity to explain his side of the case and he was informed that he must keep both of his stores covered at all times by a registered pharmacist and to allow no one to fill prescriptions in either store except a registered pharmacist. Mr. Brey promised that he would rigidly follow these orders.

At 3:15 P.M., Melvin Shink of Shink's Pharmacy, 4801 Minnetonka Blvd., St. Louis Park, appeared before the Board to explain about his recent lawsuit in which he was charged with substituting on a prescription. After Mr. Shink explained his side of the story and stated that he would never substitute on any prescription again, the Board reprimanded Mr. Shink and informed him that any future violations of the pharmacy laws or board regulations would cause him to be automatically cited to appear before the Board to show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked.

At 3:45 P.M., Leo A. Henn, pharmacist at U. S. Veterans Hospital Pharmacy, 54th Street and 48th Avenue South, Minneapolis, appeared before the Board to explain about his recent case in court because of excessive use of intoxicant liquors. Mr. Henn stated that he had been informed by his superiors that if he continued to use intoxicating liquors to excess he would be released from his position at the Veterans Hospital. Mr. Henn promised not to use intoxicating liquors because he believed that his future depended upon his abstaining from liquor.

At 4:15 P.M., Cyril Zweber, 908 W. Knapp, Rice Lake, Wisconsin, appeared before the Board asking that he be reinstated as a pharmacist in Minnesota as he had been dropped by action of the Board on July 19, 1949 for non-payment of dues. Mr. Zweber stated that he had owned his own drug store in Rice Lake, Wisconsin, during this entire period and that he had dropped his license as a pharmacist in Minnesota as he did not intend to move back. He also stated that he had sold his store and was contemplating working in Minneapolis. Mr. Zweber was advised that he would be notified of the Board's decision following the Executive Session.

January 17, 1958. The entire day was devoted to hearings on citations which had been issued previously according to law. Mr. William W. Essling appeared at all of the hearings as the Deputy Attorney General for the State of Minnesota. Miss Marjorie J. Hudson appeared as the court reporter and a transcript of each hearing was made.

At 9:00 o'clock A.M., (Mrs.) Barbara Ann (Rieschl) Wolf a registered pharmacist in Minnesota, appeared before the Board in answer to a citation served upon her on December 19, 1957, to show cause why her license to practice pharmacy in the State of Minnesota should not be revoked, cancelled and set aside for obtaining ther license by false representation and by means of fraud and deception as stipulated in the Citation as attached. (p. 3A).

Mrs. Wolf appeared with her brother-in-law and sister, Dr. and Mrs. (Dr.) Paul Stahler and her attorney, M. J. Daly, Belle Plaine.

Mrs. Wolf was sworn in and took the stand to answer the charges in the Citation.

The hearing was completed at 11:12 o'clock, A.M., and the Board members, thereupon, left the room for a discussion of the case.

The Board reconvened at 11.23 o'clock, A.M., and Mr. Alcott moved that Barbara Ann (Rieschl) Wolf's license be revoked until she has acquired one year of experience to be acquired under the supervision of a registered pharmacist and after this apprenticeship has been served, she will then be required to take the practical part of the examination and upon passing, will become a registered pharmacist. It will be necessary for Mrs. Wolf to re-apply for this examination after she has had the necessary experience. Motion seconded by Mr. Taylor. Motion carried. Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the State Board of Pharmacy duly convened this 17th day of January, 1958, in suite 562, Nicollet Hotel, Minneapolis, Minnesota, that the license of said Barbara Ann Rieschl Wolf to practice pharmacy in the State of Minnesota be, and hereby is revoked, and that the revocation of said license shall be effective on January 17, 1958.

At 11:35 A.M., Mr. George W. Murphy, Jr., who is now at the St. Cloud Reformatory, St. Cloud, Minnesota, appeared in answer to a citation to answer to the charges of a felony, to-wit: death by criminal negligence. Mr. Murphy was also charged with being guilty of unprofessional conduct, conduct endangering public health and the habitual indulgence in the use of drugs. (Copy of Citation attached (p. 4A)

Mr. Murphy told the Board Members that he was not interested in pharmacy and that after he had served his term in the St. Cloud Reformatory he expected to go back and work at the railroad. By unanimous decision of the Board, Mr. Murphy's license was revoked and he was informed that the could at some future date, apply for reinstatement of his license and the Board at that time would decide whether he was safe to practice pharmacy.

At 12:05 P.M., Mr. Joseph Hoffman appeared in answer to charges that he did knowingly, willfully, unlawfully and wrongfully sell and dispense narcotic drugs without first having obtained a written prescription from the physician, dentist or veterinarian authorizing such sale. (see copy of citation - p.4-b). Mr. Hoffman's attorney, Mr. Phillip J. Stern appeared with him.

After a very lengthy discussion between the Board members and Mr. Hoffman, the Board tabled the matter of the revocation of Mr. Hoffman's license until the next regular meeting in July, 1958.

The Board adjourned for lunch at 1:45 P.M., and reconvened at 2:45 P.M.

At 2:45 P.M., Mr. Clem F. Claseman appeared before the Board in answer to a citation served on him charging him with being found guilty of engaging in dispensing of drugs to diverse persons without first having obtained a written prescription from a physician or other authorized person. (see copy of citation - p. 4-c).

Mr. Claseman cited the case and it was decided to table any further action against Mr. Claseman until the end of his three-year probationary period.

At 3:08 P.M., Mr. Edward A. Pelant (of the Eureka Drug Co., Inc., 1701-4thTStreet, Mpls.) appeared before the Board in answer to a citation served on him to charges of having been guilty of unprofessional conduct and conduct endangering public health in that he dispensed drugs to diverse persons without first having obtained a written prescription from a physician or other authorized person and that he had been convicted of a felony in the United States District Court, District of Minnesota, 4th Division, on these charges. After considerable discussion with Mr. Pelant regarding these charges and also, to the charges that he was operating a dirty store.

Mr. Pelant promised that he would hereafter conform to all the state and federal laws and all Board regulations. He also promised to clean up his store immediately. (see p-4D for citation)

September 11, 1959. A special meeting was held at the Board Office, 3965 Minnehaha Avenue, Minneapolis. Members present - President Angus H. Taylor, Vice President Floyd M. Alcott, Max Bearman and Secretary Arthur L. Eide.

The meeting was called to order by President Angus H. Taylor at 12:00 o'clock p.m. Present were the following pharmacists: P. O. Sylvester, Marvin Friedman, Jack Buegen and Phillip Richter. These pharmacists were asked to be present to discuss the indiscriminate sale of Tussar (which contains dihydrocodeinone). The exempt narcotic registers kept by these pharmacists were also presented to the Board members for inspection.

A discussion with each pharmacist ensued. It was agreed by each one that they would cut down on the sale of exempt narcotics so as to protect the public health and welfare and to uphold the ethics of pharmacy.

Meeting with the above pharmacists was adjourned at 4:00 o'clock p.m., and the pharmacists were dismissed.

President Angus H. Taylor, Vice President Floyd M. Alcott, Max Bearman and Secretary Arthur L. Eide then discussed the case of the H. & S. Company (wholesaler) and J. F. Wallerius & Sons (wholesaler). H. & S. Company is located at 2139 Lowry North, Minneapolis and J. F. Wallerius and Sons operate at 153-12th Avenue N.E., Minneapolis.

After a discussion Mr. Alcott moved that the Board appeal the case of these two wholesalers to the Supreme Court. Mr. Bearman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The matter of again conducting an oral examination at the January, 1960 Board meeting was discussed. Mr. Alcott made a motion that the Board again give an oral examination with four or five candidates appearing at one time but no grade be given for this examination. Mr. Bearman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, meeting adjourned.
