MINNESOTA STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

Three Hundred Eighty-Sixth Meeting

April 22, 1963. At 10:00 o'clock A.M., the Board met in the company of certain members of the Executive Committe of the Minnesota State Pharmaceutical Association, legislators and legal advisers in rooms at the St. Paul Hotel, St. Paul. Members of the Board present were: President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice C. Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard and Secretary Arthur L. Eide. Board's legal counsel, Mr. Robert W. Mattson was present also.

A general discussion regarding proposed legislation on behalf of the profession of Pharmacy was carried on and legislation submitted affecting the profession of Pharmacy was discussed thoroughly.

Following a brief recess for lunch the discussions as mentioned above continued until approximately 3:00 o'clock P.M.

At 3:00 o'clock P.M., the Board met briefly by itself for discussions of its general problems - such discussions in broad terms.

At approximately 4:00 o'clock P.M., on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.

Three Hundred Eighty-Seventh Meeting

June 4, 1963 (Tuesday). The Board met in its offices at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul, at 9:00 o'clock A.M. Members present were: President Max Bearman, William F. Appel and John H. Nelson. Also present were Secretary Arthur L. Eide and legal counsel, Robert W. Mattson.

At 9:30 o'clock A.M., Mr. James Parkins, Manager of Target Pharmacy in the Crystal area; Mr. Donald Gronlund, Manager of the Target Pharmacy in the Duluth area and Mr. Byron A. Farley, Manager of the Target Pharmacy in the Maplewood area, appeared before the Board in response to letters from the Secretary to each of them as managers of their respective pharmacies. A letter had also been directed to Mr. Alvin Towle, a pharmacist listed as the majority stockholder of Target Pharmacies, Inc., but he was unable to attend as he was out of town. The pharmacist managers listed above had been requested to appear before the Board to discuss certain advertising that had recently appeared on behalf of Target Pharmacies, Inc., and the relation of such advertising with Board of Pharmacy Regulation No. 21. A thorough discussion regarding past advertisements and future advertisements was had with the Board. Regulation No. 21 was reviewed and the Board's interpretations of violations of that regulation were made known. At approximately 10:45 o'clock A.M., the pharmacists from Target Pharmacy, Inc., departed.

At 11:00 o'clock A.M., Mr. Edward R. Perso, local district manager for Walgreen Drugs, appeared before the Board in response to a letter to him by the secretary. The original time for Mr. Perso's appearance had been set for 2:30 P.M., but by mutual agreement the time was changed to 11:00 o'clock A.M., to conform to other commitments of Mr. Perso. The Board had a thorough discussion with Mr. Perso regarding past and future advertising by Walgreen Drugs. Mr. Perso stated that most of the Walgreen ads originated in the Chicago office of Walgreen Drugs and that due to Board Regulation No. 21 there were differences in the Walgreen ads appearing in Minnesota as opposed to ads prepared for other states. He stated that the ads were checked by their legal department and cleared by them before being released. After a thorough discussion of Regulation No. 21, Mr. Perso stated that he would speak to the advertising and legal departments of Walgreen Drugs and explain to them the Board's interpretation of Regulation No. 21

and its application. At approximately 12:15 P.M., Mr. Perso departed and the Board recessed for lunch.

At approximately 1:00 o'clock P.M., Mr. James R. DeFore, Manager of SupeRx Drugs in the St. Louis Park area; Mr. Robert W. Green, Manager of SupeRx Drugs in the North Minneapolis area and Mr. James A. Erckenbrack, Manager of the SupeRx Drug in St. Paul, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to them by the Secretary. A Mr. Gordon Saue of Mason, Michigan, pharmacist on record as being majority stockholder of SupeRx Drugs had also been requested to appear but due to the distance involved and the press of other business, he did not appear. thorough discussion of the recent and future advertisements on behalf of SupeRx Drugs was had with the pharmacists listed above. The managers of the SupeRx Drugs stated that in all cases the ads appearing on behalf of SupeRx Drugs were cleared through them and that they would cooperate fully in the future in adhering to Board Regulation No. 21 regarding advertising. At approximately 2:45 o'clock P.M., the above mentioned pharmacists departed.

At approximately 3:45 o'clock P.M., Mr. Richard D. Carlson, Pharmacist in charge at the Dayton Company Pharmacy, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the Secretary. A thorough discussion of Board Regulation No. 21 and its application to past and future advertisements by the Dayton Company was bad. The Board and Mr. Carlson noted that there had apparently been no violations by the Dayton Company of Regulation No. 21. Mr. Carlson further stated that he understood Board Regulation No. 21 and intended to obey it. At approximately 4:30 o'clock P.M., Mr. Carlson departed.

The Board members present then had a short discussion during which it was suggested that the secretary write a letter to Mr. Douglas Dayton as general manager of the various Target Stores, setting forth in such letter, Board's Regulation No. 21, the general tone of the meeting with the pharmacists from Target Pharmacies and the possible consequences of violations of Board Regulation No. 21.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at approximately 5:00 o'clock P.M.

July 14, 1963 The Board met in its rooms at the Nicollet Hotel at 4:00 o'clock P.M. Members present were: President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson and Jack E. Quistgard. Also present was Board Secretary Arthur L. Eide.

A general discussion developed during which plans for the meeting of the coming week were discussed. The Board also discussed in general terms the sale and misuse of exempt narcotic preparations and other matters affecting the Board and the profession.

Plans for giving the Board examinations to candidates for licensure in Pharmacy at the College of Pharmacy on Monday and Tuesday were made.

July 15, 1963 The Board met at 8:30 o'clock A.M., at the College of Pharmacy, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. Members present were President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice C. Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson and John E. Quistgard. Also present was Secretary Arthur L. Eide.

The following having fulfilled the legal requirements for examination and submitted properly executed applications were present to take the practical examination:

Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy - 388th Meeting - July, 1963 Mrs. Evelyn Rayl, a reciprocal candidate, also appeared to take the practical examination. The Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 o'clock noon and reconvened at 1:00 o'clock P.M. The practical examination was completed in the afternoon. Total number of candidates taking the practical examination was 36. In the evening the Board met informally in its rooms where general discussions regarding the profession and specific plans for giving the written examination were discussed. July 16, 1963. The Board met at the College of Pharmacy, University of Minnesota, at 8:30 o'clock A.M., to give the written examination in the following subjects: Pharmacy, Pharmacology, Pharmaceutical and Chemical Mathematics, Chemistry and Jurisprudence. Thirty-five candidates were present to take the written examination. The examination lasted the entire day. In the evening the Board met in its rooms informally where once again general discussions about the profession were held. July 17, 1963. The Board met in its offices at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul. Members present were: President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice C. Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard and their secretary, Arthur L. Eide. At 8:30 o'clock A.M., the Board began to interview candidates that had taken the entire examination. These candidates in groups of five spent 15 to 20 minutes with the Board members and short discussions were had with each group. Following a short recess for lunch the Board then conducted a series of hearings as enumerated below: At 1:45 o'clock P.M., Mr. John Arnold appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the Secretary. The purpose of this appearance by Mr. Arnold was to discuss with him some recent sales of exempt narcotic preparations at Lind Pharmacy, 347 East Lake Street, Minneapolis, of which Mr. Arnold is part owner. A thorough discussion ensued during which Mr. Arnold explained his understanding of the laws regarding the - 2 -

sale of exempt narcotic preparations and also during which the Board through its members and secretary made the meaning of the law clear to Mr. Arnold. At approximately 2:30 o'clock P.M., Mr. Arnold departed.

At approximately 2:45 o'clock P.M., Mr. Lind appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. The purpose of this appearance by Mr. Lind was to discuss with him some recent sales of exempt narcotic preparations at Lind Pharmacy, 347 East Lake Street, Minneapolis, of which Mr. Lind is part owner. A thorough discussion of the exempt narcotic laws was had during which the Board's suggestions regarding the proper handling of these preparations were imparted to Mr. Lind. At approximately 3:30 o'clock P.M., Mr. Lind departed.

At approximately 3:45 o'clock P.M., Miss M. Jane Brennan from Lind Pharmacy in Minneapolis, appeared before the Board in response to a letter from the Secretary. The purpose of this appearance was to discuss the proper handling and distribution of exempt narcotics. A thorough discussion of these preparations, centering about the laws governing them, ensued. The Board made suggestions to Miss Brennan relative to the proper handling of exempt narcotic preparations. At approximately 4:30 o'clock P.M., Miss Brennan departed.

At 4:45 o'clock P.M., Mr. Gautum Gupta, a graduate student at the College of Pharmacy whose home is in India and who is employed at Lind Pharmacy in Minneapolis, appeared before the Board in response to a letter to him from the Secretary. The Board reviewed with Mr. Gupta the laws of the state regarding the distribution of exempt narcotic preparations. After a thorough discussion on this subject Mr. Gupta departed.

The Board then recessed for the day and departed from its office.

July 18, 1963 The Board met in its offices at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul, at 8:00 o'clock A.M. Members present were: President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice C. Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard and their secretary, Arthur L. Eide. At 8:30 o'clock A.M., the Board began individual interviews with the candidates for reciprocity. Each candidate spent approximately 15 to 20 minutes with the Board following which they were required to write the examination

At 3:45 o'clock P.M., Pharmacist Alice Blaustone and Pharmacist Leonard Chesler from Snyder's Drug on Lake and Hennepin Avenue in Minneapolis, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to them by the secretary. This appearance was for the purpose of discussing exempt narcotic sales at the Snyder Drug store listed above and also for the purpose of reviewing thoroughly the laws governing the distribution of these preparations with these pharmacists. After a thorough discussion and at about 4:30 o'clock P.M., the above-named pharmacists departed and the Board recessed to its rooms at the Nicollet Hotel where the Board members spent the evening correcting examination papers. July 19, 1963 The Board met in its offices at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul at 8:00 o'clock A.M. Members present were: President Max Bearman, Vice President Maurice C. Hillestad, William F. Appel, John H. Nelson and John E. Quistgard. Also present were the Board's secretary and legal counsel, Robert W. Mattson. At 8:30 o'clock A.M., Mr. Sam Langfus, a pharmacist and former owner of Langfus Pharmacy, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. The purpose of this visit was to discuss certain sales of exempt narcotics at Langfus Pharmacy. Certain evidence was presented to the Board and a thorough discussion was had with Mr. Langfus regarding this evidence and the laws governing the distribution of exempt narcotics in this state. At approximately 9:30 o'clock A.M., Mr. Langfus departed. At 9:30 o'clock A.M., Mr. Louis Wolter Jr., a pharmacist and partner with his father in Wolter Drug, St. Paul, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. The purpose of this appearance was to discuss with Mr. Wolter the distribution of exempt narcotic preparations in this state and to review the laws with him. After a thorough discussion and at approximately 10:15 A.M., Mr. Wolter departed. At 10:30 o'clock A.M., Pharmacist Carl Rudeen, owner of two Rudeen Pharmacies in St. Paul, appeared before the Board in response to a letter to him by the Secretary. This appearance by Mr. Rudeen was for the purpose of discussion with Mr. Rudeen the sales of exempt narcotics in his pharmacy on East Seventh - 4 -

Street in St. Paul. After certain statements made by Mr. Rudeen and questions put to him by the Board, the laws governing the distribution of exempt narcotics were discussed thoroughly. Further discussion was had until approximately 11:30 o'clock A.M., at which time Mr. Rudeen departed.

At 11:30 o'clock A.M., Pharmacist Gilbert Granat, who is employed at Rudeen Pharmacies in St. Paul, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. A discussion with Mr. Granat ensued regarding the sales of exempt narcotics at Rudeen Pharmacies and a review of the laws regarding these preparations was included in the discussion. At approximately 12:15 o'clock P.M., Mr. Granat departed.

At 12:30 o'clock P.M. the Board recessed for lunch and returned at 1:45 o'clock P.M.

The Board then began a discussion regarding the various pharmacists who had appeared before them on July 17th and 18th and this morning. Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the Secretary direct a letter to Pharmacists M. Jane Brennan, Carl J. Lind and student G. Gupta, stating that the Board could see no reason at this time for further action in the matter involved and also include warnings that these persons review the laws governing the distribution of exempt narcotic drugs and adhere to them, and further that all correspondence regarding their appearances before the Board be made a part of their jackets on file at the Board office. Motion carried.

At 2:30 o'clock P.M., a delegation representing hospital pharmacists appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to the president of the local chapter of the Association of Hospital Pharmacists, Mr. John T. Bush. In addition to Mr. Bush this delegation included among others - Dr. Hugh Kabat, professor at the College of Pharmacy, who is in charge of the hospital pharmacy department at the College - Mr. Russel Strom, chief pharmacist at St. Barnabas Hospital in Minneapolis, Mr. Gordon Wittich, chief pharmacist at Mt. Sinai Hospital in Minneapolis and Mr. Neal Schwartau, chief pharmacist at Rochester Methodist Hospital, Rochester. A discussion ensued with the delegation of hospital pharmacists relative to the use of machines to dispense drugs on floor stations or nursing stations in hospitals. Following this

discussion and at about 3:30 o'clock P.M., the delegation departed.

Following the departure of the delegation of hospital pharmacists, the Board resumed its deliberations regarding the pharmacists which had been requested to appear before them regarding exempt narcotic sales. During this discussion Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that a letter be directed to Mr. Gilbert Granat by the secretary to the effect that the Board did not at this time see any reason for further action by them in the matters involved, and that in addition to a reminder to adhere to the laws governing the distribution of exempt narcotic preparations, such letter shall also commend Mr. Granat for certain of his actions in this area.

Motion carried.

Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that Pharmacist Leonard Chesler be sent a letter from the secretary regarding his appearance before the Board. The letter to Mr. Chesler was to advise him that no further action by the Board in the matters involved was contemplated by the Board at this time, and further, that Mr. Chesler be advised to review the laws governing the distribution of exempt narcotic preparations and adhere to them, and further, that this letter be made a part of Chesler's jacket or file at this office. Motion carried.

Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that the secretary direct a letter to Mr. Louis Wolter, Jr., to the effect that the Board did not contemplate any further action on the matters involved in his appearance before the Board and that he remain cognizant of the laws regarding the distribution of exempt narcotic preparations and abide by them and further, that Mr. Wolter be commended for his manner in handling certain situations regarding the sale of exempt narcotic preparations. Motion carried.

Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that Pharmacist Alice Blaustone be sent a letter by the secretary which should be in the form of a severe reprimand to her for certain actions as a pharmacist and further, that she be advised that such letter would be made a part of her jacket or file at this office. Motion carried.

Mr. Hillestad moved and Mr. Appel seconded that a letter be sent to Mr. John Arnold which letter is to be in the form

Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy - 388th Meeting - July 1963 of a most severe reprimand regarding certain of his actions which resulted in his appearance before the Board and further, that Mr. Arnold be advised that such letter will be made a part of his permanent record or file in this office. Motion carried. Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that Mr. Carl Rudeen be cited to appear before the Board to show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked based upon statements made at Mr. Rudeen's recent appearance before the Board and other evidence obtained in previous investigations. Motion carried. Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that Mr. Sam Langfus be cited to appear before the Board to show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked based upon statements made at Mr. Langfus' recent appearance before the Board and other evidence obtained in previous investigations. Motion carried. Mr. Appel moved and Mr. Nelson seconded that the Board direct the secretary to study the inspection program of the Board now in effect and make recommendations to the Board members located in Minneapolis and St. Paul on the feasability of increasing the number of inspections of pharmacies to twice per year. The report of the secretary to be taken up by the full Board at its next meeting. Motion carried. Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the charges contained in the citation issued to Powers Dry Goods Company be dismissed and that their license be issued and that they be so notified. Motion carried. After a review of the transcript of the hearing on March 21, 1963, resulting from the citation issued to Ellis D. Williams on March 1, 1963, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that the matters contained in such transcript and citation be continued until the next regular meeting of the Board. Motion carried. At approximately 5:30 o'clock P.M., the Board recessed its meeting to its rooms at the Nicollet Hotel. July 20, 1963. The Board met in its rooms at its offices - 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul, at 8:30 o'clock A.M., - 7 -

all members were present and the secretary.

President Bearman called the meeting to order and the following business was had.

President Bearman instructed the secretary to read the minutes of the July 1962 meeting. Following the reading of the minutes Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that they be approved as read. Motion carried.

Mr. Appel moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that all Board members and the secretary be delegated to attend the 5th

Mr. Appel moved and Mr. Hillestad seconded that all Board members and the secretary be delegated to attend the 5th District Meeting of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy to be held in Iowa City, Iowa, on September 29th and 30th, 1963. Motion carried.

Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the date for the July 1964 meeting be set for the week beginning July 13th. Motion carried.

Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the Board pay to the Minnesota State Pharmaceutical Association the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of the advancement of the science and art of pharmacy as provided for in Minnesota Statutes - Section 151.28. Motion carried.

Copies of the financial statement of the Board were distributed to each member. After a thorough review of the matters contained therein, Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that the financial statement be approved. Motion carried.

The names of 16 pharmacists who were delinquent in the renewal of their registrations for the years 1961-1962 were read. Notices had been sent to them relative to their being in arrears and on February 11, 1963, letters were sent to them by certified mail advising them that they would be dropped from the records unless renewals in arrears were paid.

Mr. Appel moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that the following pharmacists be dropped from the records as they had failed to renew their registrations for the years 1961-1962. Motion carried.

After a short discussion President Hillestad, Mr. Quistgard and Mr. Bearman together with Secretary Arthur L. Eide proceeded to visit some of the pharmacies in Minneapolis for the purpose of partial inspection. The first stop was McRay Pharmacy on the corner of 36th and Bryant Avenue South. We met and talked with Mr. Raymond F. Kostick who was the pharmacist on duty. A courtesy call at the Pharmacy of Board member William F. Appel was made. The Board members met and talked with Mr. William I. Appel and Mr. Robert Appel. A visual inspection was next made at Diamond Lake Drug on 54th Street and Nicollet Avenue South in Minneapolis. The inspection party then proceeded back to the Capp-Towers. At 6:00 o'clock P.M. the Board reconvened in its rooms at the Capp-Towers. Members present were: President Maurice C. Hillestad, Vice President William F. Appel, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard and Max Bearman. Also present were the Board's attorney, James J. Trench and their secretary, Arthur L. Eide. President Hillestad called the meeting to order. The Board noted with pleasure that Governor Karl F. Rolvaag had reappointed Board member Max Bearman to the Board for another five year term beginning January 30, 1964 and terminating the first Monday in January, 1969. The Board then heard an oral report from its attorney relative to developments in the Mueller case. The attorney pointed out that Richard Parish, attorney for Mueller's Pharmacy, Inc. had filed a Writ of Certiorari in the matter of the ten day suspension of the license of Mueller's Pharmacy, Inc. He further explained that he had upon instruction from the Board changed the proceedings of the case from Hennepin County District Court to Ramsey County District Court. He explained the next steps necessary on the part of the Board such as the necessity of filing certain papers with the court and assured the Board that this would be done within the specified time limit. Kostick appeared before the Board in response to a citation issued to him by the Board on February 13, 1964 to show cause why the license previously issued to him to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked for the charges contained therein. A duly constituted hearing was held during which testimony was taken and evidence submitted. At approximately 10:00 o'clock A.M. the hearing ended.

At 10:41 o'clockA.M. Mr. Charles McCall and Mr. Raymond F. Kostick appeared before the Board in response to letter directed to them by the secretary. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss certain aspects of the operation of McRay Pharmacy, which is jointly owned by pharmacists McCall and Kostick. At approximately 11:30 o'clock A.M. the hearing concluded.

Following a recess for lunch and at approximately 1:30 o'clock P.M. the Board reconvened in its offices.

The matter of certain offers and advertising of a firm known as Commercial Travelers came to the attention of the Board. Following a discussion of this matter, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Bearman seconded that the secretary send a letter to this firm calling their attention to

Regulation Number 21 insofar as their activities may affect pharmacists and pharmacies in relation to certain advertising. Motion carried.

The Board's attention was directed to the February inspection report and more particularly to certain statements by pharmacists regarding their intention to comply with Regulation Number 19.

Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the secretary be instructed to contact the pharmacists in charge of Town Drug (Bloomington), Quality Drug (South St. Paul) and Snyder Bros. Drug (Sun Ray - St. Paul) and discuss their compliance with Regulation Number 19. The secretary was further instructed to report the attitudes of these pharmacists in regard to Regulation Number 19 to the local Board members for a determination as to possible further action if necessary. Motion carried.

The Board then began a discussion of the recent recall of a drug known as Parnate and manufactured by Smith, Kline and French. After a thorough discussion the Board concluded that due to the nature of the recall (voluntary on the point of Smith, Kline and French) that it had no responsibility to enter into the activities of the recall itself.

A discussion ensued regarding the dates of a proposed meeting for the month of April. This discussion resulted in the setting of the dates of April 27, 28 and 29 for business which may have to come before the Board.

A discussion began relative to the formal hearing which resulted from the citation issued to Raymond F. Kostick. After thoroughly reviewing statements made and evidence introduced at the hearing, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Nelson seconded that the license previously issued to Mr. Raymond F. Kostick by this Board be suspended for a period of 150 days beginning April 1, 1964. Motion carried unanimously.

In regard to the informal hearing at which Mr. Charles McCall and Mr. Raymond F. Kostick were present by request of the Board, the Board instructed the secretary to send each of them severe letters of reprimand relative to certain aspects of the practice of Pharmacy in McRay Pharmacy.

An additional discussion of the operation of Roufs' Pharmacy in Winsted, Minnesota. Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that after further investigation is completed that the facts involved in such investigation be submitted to Board members William F. Appel and Max Bearman for a determination of the proper disposition of the case. Motion carried. (This action supercedes the action taken by the Board in this matter on Mar.4th)

The Board then turned its attention to the proposed amendment to Regulation Number 21. Following a very thorough discussion, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Nelson seconded that no action be taken on the proposed amendment to Regulation Number 21. Motion carried.

In this regard, the Board instructed the secretary to refer to recent correspondence from Mr. Joseph Robbie, Executive Secretary of the

Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy -- 392nd Meeting -- March, 1964 Minnesota Society of Pharmacists and notify him of the Board's action and in addition advise him of the disposition of certain records regarding this proposed amendment. A discussion began regarding the proposed amendment to Regulation Number 22. Following a thorough reveiw of the matter Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Bearman seconded that action on the proposed amendment to regulation Number 22 be tabled. Motion carried. The Board then directed its attention to an application for a license to operate a pharmacy submitted by the St. Paul Outpatient Center. After noting the facts submitted on the application and also other documents submitted in support of said application, Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Appel seconded that the application be denied. Motion carried. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.

You are hereby cited to appear before the Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy, 1965 Ford Parkway, in the City of St. Paul, County of Ramsey and the State of Minnesota, on the 5th day of March, 1964, at 2:00 o'clock P.M., to make such answer to the charges herein contained as you may be advised or deem expedient, and to show cause, if any you have, why the license to practice pharmacy, heretofore granted to you by the Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy as a pharmacist, should not be revoked or suspended and you be debarred from practicing pharmacy in the State of Minnesota for unprofessional conduct or conduct endangering public health as follows:

- 1. That you did on the following days in 1964, dispense and sell at retail without benefit of prescription, to one Everett Weidling, the following amounts of exempt narcotic preparations:
 - (a) January 31, two four-ounce bottles of Cheracol at one time without entering said purchase in the exempt narcotic register.

- February 3, two four-ounce bottles of Cheracol (b) at one time without entering said purchase in the exempt narcotic register.
- (c) February 4, two four-ounce bottles of Cheracol at one time without entering said purchase in the exempt narcotic register.

That the sale of two four-ounce bottles at one time is contrary to law and not within the exemptions contained in Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 618.08, as amended.

That the failure to enter the aforesaid purchases in the exempt narcotic register is contrary to law and is in violation of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 618.09, Subdivisions 4 and 5.

This citation is issued by order of the Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy on this 13 day of February, 1964, pursuant to power vested in this Board according to law.

April 27, 1964. The Board met in its rooms at the Sheraton Ritz Hotel at approximately 4:00 o'clock P.M. Members present were President Maurice Hillestad, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard, Max Bearman and secretary Arthur L. Eide.

The Board held a general discussion of various items of business which would likely come before it at this session. In addition a review of the hearings scheduled for the next day was held and agreement was reached that the schedule could be adhered to.

The secretary reported to the Board that Miss Kathie Olson of the office staff had given notice of her intention to leave the service of the Board due to other employment.

Reports to the Board members regarding certain activities of the Board office and complaints which had been received were given at this time.

April 28, 1964. The Board met in its office at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul at 8:30 o'clock A.M. Members present were President Maurice C. Hillestad, Vice President Willima F. Appel, John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard and Max Bearman. Also present were the Board's secretary Arthur L. Eide and their legal counsel James J. Trench.

At 9:00 o'clock A.M., Pharmacist Harry H. Lebow appeared before the Board in asswer to a citation issued to him on February 13, 1964. This citation originally requested Mr. Lebow to appear before the Board on March 5, 1964 but due to certain conditions beyond his control the hearing was continued by the Board until April 28, 1964. The citation requested that Mr. Lebow show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked for the charges contained therein.

Mr. Lebow was accompanied by his attorney, Mr. Melvin Orenstein.

A duly constituted hearing was held during which testimony was taken from witnesses, statements were made by pharmacist Lebow and his attorney and questions were asked by the Board of all witnesses and Mr. Lebow. At approximately 12:20 o'clock P.M. the hearing ended.

At 12:30 o'clock P.M. Mr. Baron Desnick, part owner of Desnick's Drug on Lexington and University Avenues in St. Paul, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss certain irregularities in the practice of pharmacy at Desnick Drug. Statements were made by Mr. Desnick and questions were asked by the Board. At approximately 1:20 o'clock P.M. the hearing ended.

At 2:00 o'clock P.M. Mr. Herbert H. Roufs of Winsted, Minnesota, owner and operator of Roufs' Pharmacy, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. The purpose of this hearing was to discuss certain apparent discrepancies in the practice of pharmacy at Roufs' Pharmacy. Statements were made by Mr. Roufs and the Board directed questions to him which he answered. At approximately 2:30 o'clock P.M. the hearing ended.

At 2:35 o'clock P.M. a delegation from the St. Paul Outpatient Center appeared before the Board in response to a request for such appearance by the St. Paul Outpatient Center for a rehearing on their application for a pharmacy license. The delegation consisted of Mr. William N. Wallace, Administrator of Miller Hospital, St. Paul, Mr. Edward F. Patula, chief pharmacist at Miller Hospital and Mr. Glen Taylor, secretary of the Minnesota Hospital Association. Documents and oral statements were made by the members of the delegation and questions by the Board were also answered by them. At approximately 3:05 o'clock P.M. the hearing ended.

The Board was then called into executive session by the President to consider business which would come before it.

A thorough discussion of the facts involving Mr. Lebow was begun. Following a lengthy review of the matters contained therein, Mr. Bearman moved that the license to practice pharmacy previously issued by the Board to Mr. Harry Lebow be suspended for 30 days. Following this additional discussion, Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that the license to practice pharmacy previously issued to Mr. Harry Lebow by the Board be revoked as of June 1, 1964. Motion carried.

A discussion ensued regarding the facts submitted by the St. Paul Outpatient Center in support of their request for a pharmacy license. The Board agreed informally that each Board member would review the lengthy documents submitted in this case and would be polled by the secretary by phone as to his opinion and action on the issuance of the license would be governed by the results of such polling.

Following a thorough discussion of the matters brought to the attention of the Board at the hearings in which Mr. Baron Desnick and Mr. Herbert H. Roufs appeared, the Board agreed informally and so instructed its secretary that letters of reprimand be sent to Mr. Desnick and Mr. Roufs. It was further stipulated that these letters also contain suggestions which may be helpful to the pharmacist involved.

Mr. Wayne M. Carlson who was seeking licensure by reciprocity was included in the practical examination as he had not actually engaged in the practice of pharmacy in recent years.

Motion carried.

At approximately 10:15 A.M., Mr. Earl W. Schneider, Schneider Drug, Minneapolis, appeared before the Board in response to a letter directed to him by the secretary. At approximately 10:45 A.M., Mr. Schneider departed. The Board then discussed the matters brought to their attention at this hearing and Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Bearman seconded that a letter be written to Mr. Earl Schneider thanking him for appearing in regard to alleged exempt marcotic irregularities and recognizing that he took steps to clear up the irregularities on his own. Further discussions of Mr. Wayne Carlson's application for reciprocity of his pharmacist license from the State of Iowa to Minnesota were held. Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Nelson seconded that Mr. Carlson be sent a letter stating that the Board is aware

Short general discussions on various matters were then held following which upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, the meeting adjourned.

Four Hundred-Sixth Meeting

August 16, 1965. The Board met in its rooms at the Ambassador Motel at approximately 8:00 o'clock P.M. Members present were: President William F. Appel, Vice President John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard, Max Bearman and Mrs. Kitty Alcott. Also in attendance were the Board's legal counsel, Mr. James J. Trench and its secretary pro tem, Mr. Paul G. Grussing. The meeting was called to order by President Appel.

The Board discussed various topics with the secretary pro tem including: his contributions to a panel during the 1965 Juvenile Court Judges Institute on September 1, 1965, a radio interview relating to the consumer-protection activities and responsibilities of the Board and a brief report on the inspection activities to insure coverage of pharmacies operated by pharmacists whose licenses were recently suspended.

After some discussion concerning the summer 1966 Board meeting, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mrs. Alcott seconded that tentative plans be made for holding the examinations during the third week in June, subject to clearance by the secretary pro tem, of dates with neighboring states and the colleges. Final plans to be made at the next meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The secretary pro tem was instructed to make arrangements for accommodations and travel information with respect to the District 5 meeting of the NABP, in Watertown, South Dakota on October 3 and 4.

Mr. Bearman moved and Mrs. Alcott seconded that the reinstatement of licensure be granted to Mr. Charles S. Ecanow, whose license had been dropped for non-payment of dues.

After some discussion of the overdue pharmacy license renewal for Schapiro Sylvan Drug, South St. Paul, the secretary pro tem was instructed to send a second reminder letter.

After a thorough review of the statements made and the evidence presented in the hearing, and after a discussion, Mr. Quistgard moved and Mrs. Alcott seconded that Mr. Morton S. Elboom be found guilty of the charges contained in the citation issued to him on June 15, 1965, and that his license be revoked. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Bearman did not participate in the hearing, discussion or voting.

Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded that the date of revocation be set at October 1, 1965. Motion passed unanimously. The secretary pro tem was instructed to so notify Mr. Elboom and his attorney.

After some discussion of H.R. No. 2, an act to regulate the distribution of certain stimulant and depressant drugs, the secretary pro tem was instructed to draft a communication outlining the pharmacists' responsibilities under the new act.

Mr. Max Bearman entered and participated in discussions of various administrative topics. Included in the discussions was a suggested approach to a study of existing drug practices in hospitals without pharmaceutical services.

- 2. That you did on or about the 9th day of August, 1965 dispense, give and furnish to one David Kluck a certain drug phenergan with codeine without benefit of prescription in violation of the Regulation of the Board of Health of the State of Minnesota namely 11061 and in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 353 (b) (1) B.

3. That you did on or about the 11th day of August, 1965 dispense, sell and furnish to one David Kluck a certain drug, namely Demerol 50 mg. allegedly upon the authorization of W. E. Jacobson, M.D. for a said patient Opal Hultkrans without consulting said physician in order to ascertain whether such prescription was forged.

This citation is issued by order of the Minnesota State

Four Hundred-Seventh Meeting

October 2, 1965. The Board met in its rooms at the Guest House Motel, Watertown, South Dakota, at approximately 7:30 o'clock P.M. Members present were: President William F. Appel, Vice President John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard, Max Bearman and Mrs. Kitty Alcott. Also in attendance was the Board's secretary, Paul G. Grussing.

The meeting was called to order by President Appel.
The Board discussed the matter of the alleged narcotic sale, as reported by the police, involving registrant Vernal R.
Durand. The secretary reported that while the Board attended its out of town meeting, Brooklyn Center police were instructed to contact the Board's legal counsel, Mr. Trench. Mr. Trench was to discover the exact facts of the case, the charges preferred, and learn, if possible, whether the matter would be referred to the County Attorney for prosecution, or referred to this Board. The Board expressed concern for "coverage" of the store, and about the degree of involvement of Pharmacist David J. Strate. The store will be inspected repeatedly for coverage and Pharmacist Strate will be interviewed by the secretary, and if possible, by the entire Board during its next meeting.

The matter of an appeal to the revocation of the license of Mr. Morton S. Elboom was discussed. It was noted that this action has the effect of "staying" the license of Mr. Elboom. Legal Counsel will reply to the Writ of Certiorari.

The Board discussed means of cooperating with the State Department of Health for the purpose of inspecting rest homes to insure that rest homes and/or pharmacies are not substituting pharmaceuticals.

The secretary related a discussion with Mr. Ernest Hall, District Director of the Bureau of Narcotics, in which Mr. Hall strongly advocated that pharmacists use greater security measures in the storage of their narcotics. It was pointed out that because of the shortage of heroin in the metropolitan

area, addicts have turned to an unusually high amount of burglarizing in attempts to obtain strong narcotics as substitutes for heroin. It was reported that the District Director recognizes that absolute security cannot be insured by the use of storage of narcotics in a locked safe, but that this practice does act as a deterent. After a brief discussion the secretary was instructed to communicate that pharmacists be urged to voluntarily comply with more secure narcotics storage practices. It was felt that such a communication could be a part of the next mailing rather than a separate mailing.

The secretary reported that it was determined by communication with secretaries of Boards of Pharmacy from neighboring states that there would be no conflict in examination date if the Minnesota Examination date were advanced into the latter part of June. It was also reported that the NABP does not object to the recording of internship time during Christmas and Easter vacations, but that the NABP reminded us of the added administrative difficulties created by allowing this time to be accepted. The problem experienced by the University in collecting grades from other colleges before certifying graduates was discussed. A motion was made by Mr. Nelson and seconded by Mrs. Alcott that the summer 1966 examinations be given on the third Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in June. Mr. Bearman offered an amendment requiring that this date be subject to a report from the dean of the College of Pharmacy, indicating if the advancement of the examination dates would penalize any senior students because it would not allow them to complete their internship time as previously planned. The amendment was not seconded. The motion passed, members Alcott Nelson, Quistgard voting in the affirmative and Mr. Bearman voting in the negative. The secretary was instructed to contact the dean of the College of Pharmacy, to determine whether students would be penalized because of the change in the examination date.

After a very lengthy discussion about the role of the Board inspectors, a motion was made by Mr. Nelson and seconded by Mrs. Alcott, that this discussion be tabled. The motion passed.

After some discussion about the need for inspecting certain stores for adequate coverage, Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Quistgard seconded a motion for adjournment. Motion passed. Time of adjournment was 10:30 o'clock P.M.

Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy - 407th Meeting, October 1965. October 3, 1965. The Board met at approximately 9:35 o'clock P.M., in its rooms at the Guest House Motel in Watertown, South Dakota. The meeting began with the general discussion of the need for revision of Regulations 18 and 19. discussion was based on two separate draft versions of an official notice to repeal the existing Regulations 18 and 19 and consider an alternate proposal. The pertinent portion of the first draft reads as follows: The following categories of drugs shall not be displayed or offered for sale in any manner designed to permit the purchaser to serve himself and shall be sold only by a pharmacist: a. A drug which exceeds 30% of the dosage of a drug requiring a prescription. b. Injectables.

<u>c</u>. A drug which bears upon its label a warning against its use in high blood pressure, heart disease, thyroid disease, diabetes, kidney disease and pregnancy.

The pertinent part of the second draft reads as follows:

No drug with a recommended dosage which exceeds 30% of the dosage of a drug requiring a prescription shall be displayed or offered for sale in any manner designed to permit the purchaser to serve himself.

A motion was made by Mr. Quistgard that the Board proceed in its consideration of the modification of these regulations by meeting with Mr. Moen and Mr. Earl Cudd. The motion was not seconded.

It was the general consensus that the words "or pharmacist-intern" be added to the phrase in the first draft as follows: "shall be sold only by a pharmacist". President Appel polled the Board members with respect to their views on proceeding with the first draft describing the three categories. There

was unanimous advocacy for proceeding with this three category version. It was noted that the role of the pharmacist-intern might have to be defined with a simultaneous regulation.

The secretary was then instructed to contact legal counsel and inform him of the Board's decision to proceed with the three category draft of the revision. Mr. Trench is to be asked if this draft of the regulation would be suitably written so as to obtain approval by the Attorney General. Mr. Trench is also to communicate with the legal counsel of the State Pharmaceutical Association, indicating the action taken by the Board, so that the Association might have the opportunity to respond by meeting with the Board of Pharmacy during its next scheduled meeting on October 5th.

At approximately 12:30 A.M., Mr. Quistgard moved and Mr. Nelson seconded that the meeting adjourn. Motion passed.

October 5, 1965. At approximately 8:30 A.M., the Board met in its offices to review the citation and supporting documents in the case of Mr. Lawrence G. Johnston. Members present were: President William F. Appel, Vice President John H. Nelson, John E. Quistgard, Max Bearman and Mrs. Kitty Alcott. Also present were the Board's secretary, Paul G. Grussing and legal counsel, James J. Trench.

At approximately 9:10 o'clock A.M., Pharmacist Lawrence G. Johnston appeared before the Board in response to a citation issued to him on September 14, 1965, to show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked for the causes specified therein. Mr. Johnston was represented by Mr. Wendell R. Anderson, attorney at law.

A duly constituted hearing was held and a transcript made. At approximately 10:10 o'clock A.M., Mr. Johnston and his attorney departed.

Mr. Earl Schlekau, inspector, entered the meeting and was asked to describe the investigation leading to the alleged illegal narcotics sale by Pharmacist Durand. Mr. Trench, legal counsel, reported on the usual legal proceedings following investigations of this type. Mr. Schlekau departed.

The secretary reported that the license reinstatement fee, proceedings costs, and store license renewal, collected from Mr. Schapiro during his personal visit to the Sylvan Pharmacy resulted in a check returned from the State Treasurer's

Office marked "non-sufficient funds". A letter has been written to Mr. Schapiro reminding him that the matter may be turned over to the State's Attorney General if payment is not made. The Board turned the matter of collection over to its attorney, Mr. Trench.

Mr. Trench reported to the Board indicating the proper procedure for reply in the matter of the revocation of the license of Pharmacist Elboom.

After some discussion Mr. Trench reviewed for the Board the provisions of Chapter 15 with respect to necessary procedures in conducting a hearing.

The Board then entered into a discussion about the hearing at which Mr. Lawrence G. Johnston had previously appeared. After a thorough discussion and review of the statements made, and evidence presented at the hearing, Mr. Nelson moved and Mr. Bearman seconded that Pharmacist Lawrence G. Johnston be found guilty of the charges numbered one, two and three contained in the citation issued to him on September 14th, 1965, and that his license to practice pharmacy be revoked as of November 15, 1965. The motion carried unanimously.

At approximately 12:45 o'clock P.M., Mr. Bearman moved, and Mr. Quistgard seconded that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried unanimously.

Four Hundred-Eighth Meeting

November 23, 1965. The Board met in its offices at 1965 Ford Parkway, St. Paul, at 8:30 o'clock A.M. Members present were: President William F. Appel, Max Bearman and Mrs. Kitty Alcott. Also in attendance were the Board's counsel, Mr. James J. Trench and its secretary, Paul G. Grussing. A quorum was present.

The meeting was called to order by President Appel who began by reporting the activities of the University Committee for selecting a new Pharmacy Dean. The secretary was instructed to distribute appropriate correspondence and information received during interviews with prospective candidates.

The next regular meeting, scheduled for January 17th through January 21st, was discussed.

Mr. Trench reported on the progress of the proceedings involving Vernal R. Durand. Mr. Bearman moved and Mrs. Alcott seconded that if in the District Court, Mr. Durand pleads guilty, or is found guilty, and if sufficient time remains for proper notification, that a citation be issued to Mr. Durand indicating that he appear before the Board during its January meeting to show cause why his license should not be suspended or revoked, and that this motion be subject to the approval of members absent from this meeting. Motion passed. The secretary was instructed to poll the absent board members for their consent.

Counsel reminded the Board of the full rights to practice pharmacy presently guaranteed Mr. Durand. The secretary indicated that the location of Mr. Durand will be adequately reviewed per Regulation No. 9.

The need for reviewing the involvement of Mr. David Strate, former partner of Mr. Durand was agreed to be deferred until ater the Durand proceedings.

Counsel explained the status of the Writ of Certiorari in the matter of Mr. Morton S. Elboom, indicating a continuation of the hearing is scheduled for December 9th.

The secretary was instructed to prepare a review of application forms for licensure and reciprocity and report on changes, if necessary, to insure that applicants certify as to their past record of pharmacy law violations, civil and criminal actions.

Counsel reported on the discussions with Mr. Casey, Deputy Attorney General, and with the attorney for Mr. William Schapiro in the matter of making payment for his license renewal, fines and re-instatement fees. The secretary was instructed to inform the city attorney of South St. Paul about the non-compliance with requests for payment.

Motion was made by Mrs. Alcott and seconded by Mr. Bearman that progress toward holding a hearing no later than February for the purposes of promulgating a modified version of Regulations 18 and 19 continue by informing the state association of the opportunity to provide testimony, and that this motion be subject to approval by members absent from this meeting. Motion passed.

Mr. Bearman moved and Mrs. Alcott seconded that a citation be issued to Mr. Frank Fulmore indicating that he appear before the Board during its January meeting to show cause why his license to practice pharmacy should not be suspended or revoked and that this motion be subject to the approval of members absent from this meeting. Motion passed.

The secretary was instructed to schedule a "call-in" for the January meeting in the matter of Mr. Seymour Milavitz and Manor Nursing Home. If, in surveying pharmaceutical service for nursing homes, additional evidence of violations is discovered, the Board members are to be so notified.

The secretary was instructed to provide time on the January meeting agenda for a program report of major projects, for the purpose of obtaining a mandate on priorities for various projects.

A request from Dr. Arthur C. Skjold, Minneapolis, for an outline of procedures needed to re-instate his license as an assistant pharmacist was reviewed. The secretary was instructed to contact Dr. Skjold indicating the normal procedure for re-instatement.

At approximately 12:15 o'clock P.M., Mrs. Alcott moved and Mr. Bearman seconded that the meeting be adjourned, Motion passed.
