The Red Lake river within the city area originally flowed in rapids over boulders. There is now a dam, with a head of 15 feet, which supplies valuable water power. Through erroneous pronunciation of the name, with a misunderstanding of its intended significance, the French and English fur traders, and afterward also the Ojibways, changed it to "Stealing Earth River," and thence to Thief River.
