painter of Indian portraits, wrote the earliest printed description of this quarry, which he visited in the summer of 1836. Two years later it was visited by Nicollet, as noted in the report with his map of the upper Mississippi region. These description are reprinted in the Final Report of the Geological Survey of Minnesota (vol. 1, 1884, pages 62-70). The great veneration of many tribes of Indians for the stone here quarried, and the legend of its first use to make the peace pipe or calumet, are known to all readers of Longfellow's "Song of Hiawatha," published in 1855, which derived its account of the pipestone from Catlin and Nicollet.

The red pipestone, also called catlinite, occurs as a layer about eighteen inches thick, inclosed in strata of red quartzite. It has been quarried by the Indians along an extent of nearly a mile from north to south, their earliest quarrying having been done hundreds of years ago. This tract is now comprised in an Indian reservation, one mile square, which was set apart for the Yankton Sioux in accordance with a treaty made in Washington, April 19, 1858. The reservation was provided solely for this quarrying by the Indian tribes, and no trespassing there by white men is permitted. Pipestone, the county seat, is a flourishing city about a mile south of the quarry.
