Thompson, of Mississippi, was in favor of "Jackson", while Winthrop of Massachusetts manifested much anxiety for the adoption of "Chippewa" in lieu of Itasca. The effect of so much diversity of opinion on the part of prominent members, was to cause the house to agree, without a count to the motion of Mr. Martin, who proposed to substitute "Minnesota". The bill, thus amended, passed the House, but was lost in the Senate.
