Northrup vs Hayward, 102-307

Notice of lien to judgment debtor requires no special form, nor that it be given or served in any particular way. Actual notice to judgment debtor of claim of attorney whether verbal or in writing answers every purpose of statute and is sufficient to protect rights of attorney.

The payment by judgment debtor to judgment creditor of a judgment upon which the attorney has such a lien, with actual notice of attorney's claim is void as to the attorney and to the extent of his lien and the satisfaction of the judgment may be set aside and judgment re-instated to enable attorney to proceed by execution to satisfy his claim.

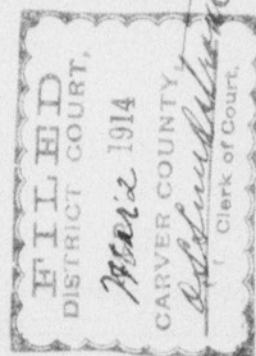



C O M P L A I N T

Now comes the plaintiff and for a first cause of
action against the defendants the plaintiff alleges.

That the plaintiff, Frances Schug, is a minor under
18 years of age.

That M.J.C. Nyborg was on the 26th day of September
1913 duly appointed the guardian of the said Frances Schug, by
the Hon. John A Dahl, judge of the Probate Court of the county
of Hennepin, State of Minnesota. That the said M.J.C. Nyborg
has filed a written consent to act as such guardian and given
a bond duly approved by the said Judge of the Probate Court
for the faithful performance of his duties and that he now is
and since the said 26th day of September 1913, has been the duly
qualified and acting guardian of said minor.

That the said Frances Schug the plaintiff herein, was
born on ^{August} ~~October~~ 31st. 1896, and lived with her parents until the
death of her mother and the remarriage of her father; that there-
after on or about the first of January 1905, she was sent ~~xxx~~ to
live with the defendants herein on a farm in Carver County, Minn.

That the defendants then agreed to take the said plaintiff into their family, to treat her kindly and in return for such work as she might be able to do, taking into consideration her strength and tender years, to clothe her properly, care for her and give her a good common school education.

That the said defendants were husband and wife and that during the time the plaintiff lived with them the family consisted of the defendants, one little girl two years old, a baby about nine months old, when the plaintiff first became a member of the family, and during a part of each year a hired man who worked on the farm and boarded with the family.

That the defendants owned and lived on a farm of 160 acres and kept nine or ten cows, four horses and other stock such as is usual on a farm of that size.

That when the plaintiff went to live with the defendants she was between eight and nine years of age, healthy, sound of body, and in good physical condition. That almost immediately thereafter the defendants commenced a systematic and continuous course of mistreatment as hereinafter stated, of the plaintiff which continued throughout the entire time she lived with them and which caused her great mental and physical suffering^{and} which resulted in serious and permanent injury to her body and health. That during the first year she resided with the defendants the plaintiff was a very small girl but she was ordered and required by the ~~xxxxxx~~ defendants to do all kinds of housework much of which was in excess of her strength and in addition thereto to care and carry about the nine months old child. That the child was sickly and for many hours at a time the plaintiff was required by the defendants to carry it about the house while she was engaged in other work.

That the plaintiff was never properly clothed or fed by the defendants but was provided with insufficient and improper clothing and food ~~xxx~~ and was constantly scolded, cursed and called vile and vulgar names and often struck and otherwise abused by the defendant, Martha Krammer who frequently struck her in the face and on the nose with her closed fist. That the said acts were often done in the presence of the defendant, William Krammer and with his consent and approval.

That during the second year that the plaintiff lived with the defendants she was by them required to do all the housework while the defendant, Martha Krammer was working ~~xxx~~ in the fields and in addition thereto to perform hard labor on the farm. That she was commanded and required by the defendants to pitch and load ^{manure} ~~manure~~ on a wagon, and to load hay during harvest time and at all times to milk nine cows and do various other chores about the house and barn. That much of this work that the plaintiff was thus forced by the defendants to do was ~~the~~ work suitable only for a man or a grown woman and entirely too hard and severe to be done by a ten or eleven year old child.

That the excessive labor which the plaintiff was thus required by the defendants to perform caused her to become round shouldered and misshapen and produced curvature of the spine from which she will never entirely recover.

That all the work done by the plaintiff as aforesaid for the defendants was done under and by the express orders and commands of the defendants and for their mutual benefit and the cruel, brutal and inhuman acts of the defendant, Martha Krammer, were often done in the presence of and with the knowledge, consent and approval of the defendant, William Krammer.

That the defendants refused to allow the plaintiff to visit or talk to her friends and often threatened to kill her if she told any person how she was treated by the defendants.

That the plaintiff continued to live with the defendants until on or about March 20th, 1908 when her friends and relatives having heard of the cruel way in which she was being treated took her from the defendants and placed her in a good home where she could receive proper care and have her injuries properly treated.

That by reason of the cruel and inhuman way in which the plaintiff was treated by the defendants ~~as aforesaid~~ and each of them as aforesaid, she was injured and damaged in the sum of \$8,000.00.


For a second cause of action against the defendants the plaintiff re-alleges all the facts, matters and things herein before stated as and for a first cause of action and further alleges that during the fall of 1907 while the plaintiff was living with the defendants as aforesaid the defendant, ~~Mrs~~ Martha Krammer, became very angry at the plaintiff without any just cause or provocation and struck her on the back and legs with a heavy rough stick of stove-wood and knocked her down and thereafter continued to strike her. That the blow from the stick of stove-wood badly injured the plaintiff's back and produced sores on her back which grew unto tumors which had to be cut out by a surgeon. That said beatings tumors and surgical operation inflicted permanent injuries on the plaintiff and caused the plaintiff to suffer very great pain. That all of said acts were done with the knowledge, acquiescence and approval of the defendant, William Krammer.

That by reason of all the foregoing the plaintiff suffered injuries and damages to the amount of \$8,000.00.

For a third cause of action against the defendant~~s~~ the plaintiff re-alleges all the matters and things hereinbefore stated as and for a first cause of action and further alleges that during the spring of 1908 while the plaintiff was living with the defendants as hereinbefore stated the defendant~~s~~, Martha Krammer became very angry with the plaintiff without any just cause or provocation and thereupon threw a butcher-knife at the plaintiff which struck her on the nose, cut it and caused it to bleed badly. That the said injury caused the plaintiff great pain and inconvenience and so injured her nose that her breathing has ever since been difficult and unnatural and that a surgical operation will be necessary before she will be to any extent relieved from the inconvenience and suffering caused by the said injury. That the blow with the knife disfigured the plaintiff's nose and left a permanent scar thereon. That all of the said acts were done with the knowledge, acquiescence and approval of the defendant, William Krammer.

That by reason of the aforesaid acts of the defendants the plaintiff suffered injuries and damages to the amount of \$48,000.00.

WHEREFORE The plaintiff demands judgment against the defendants and each of them for the sum of \$24,000.00 together with costs and disbursements of this action.
