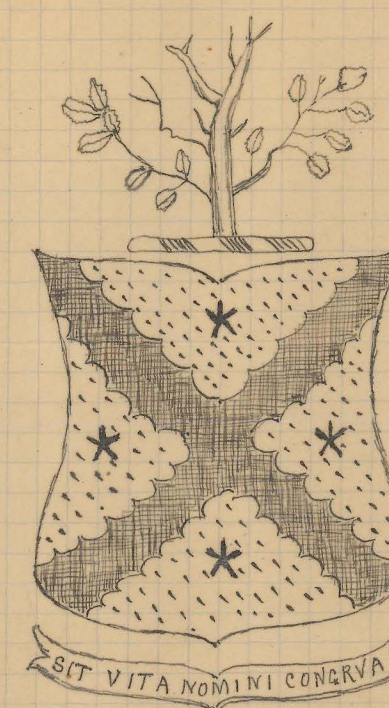
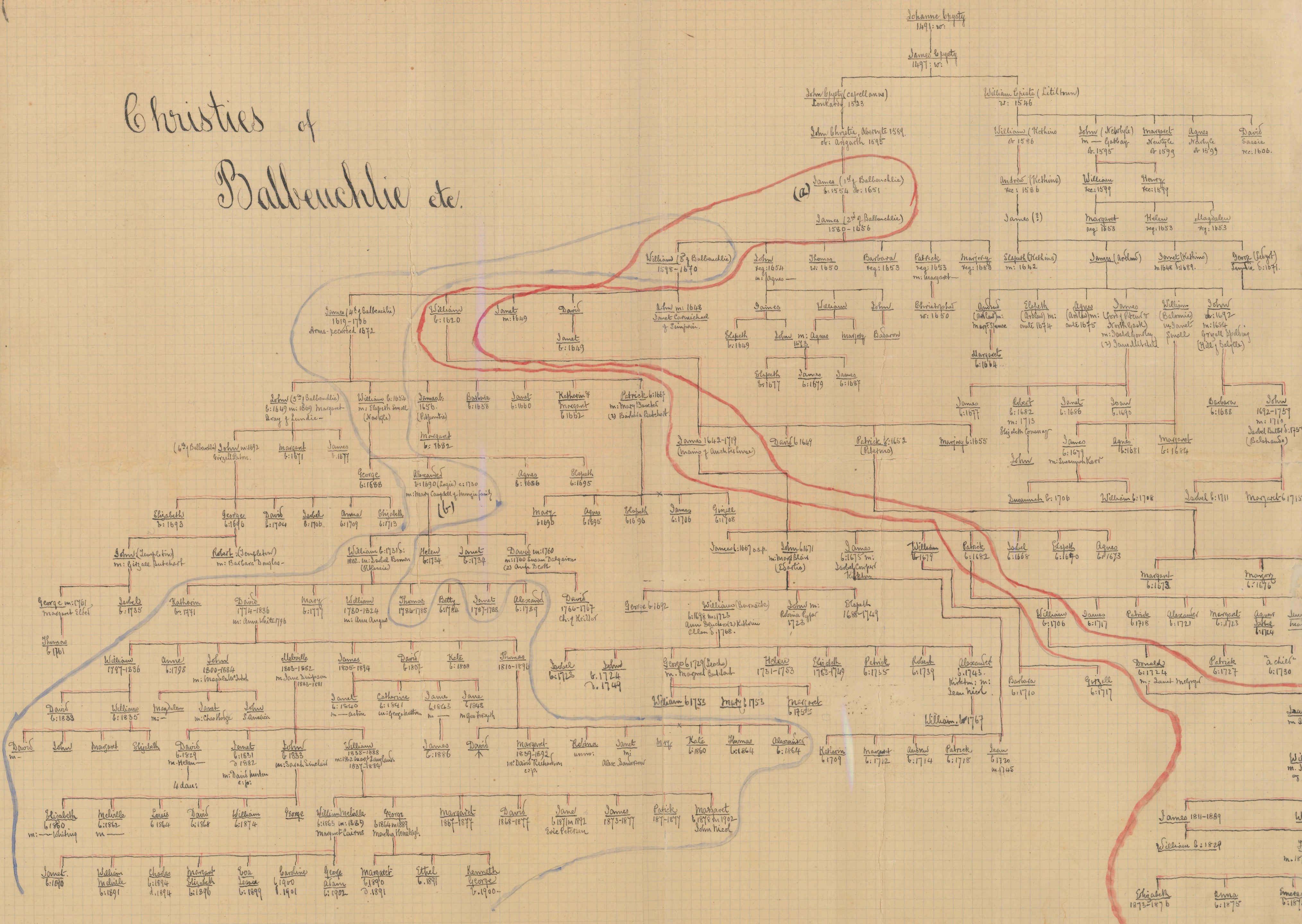
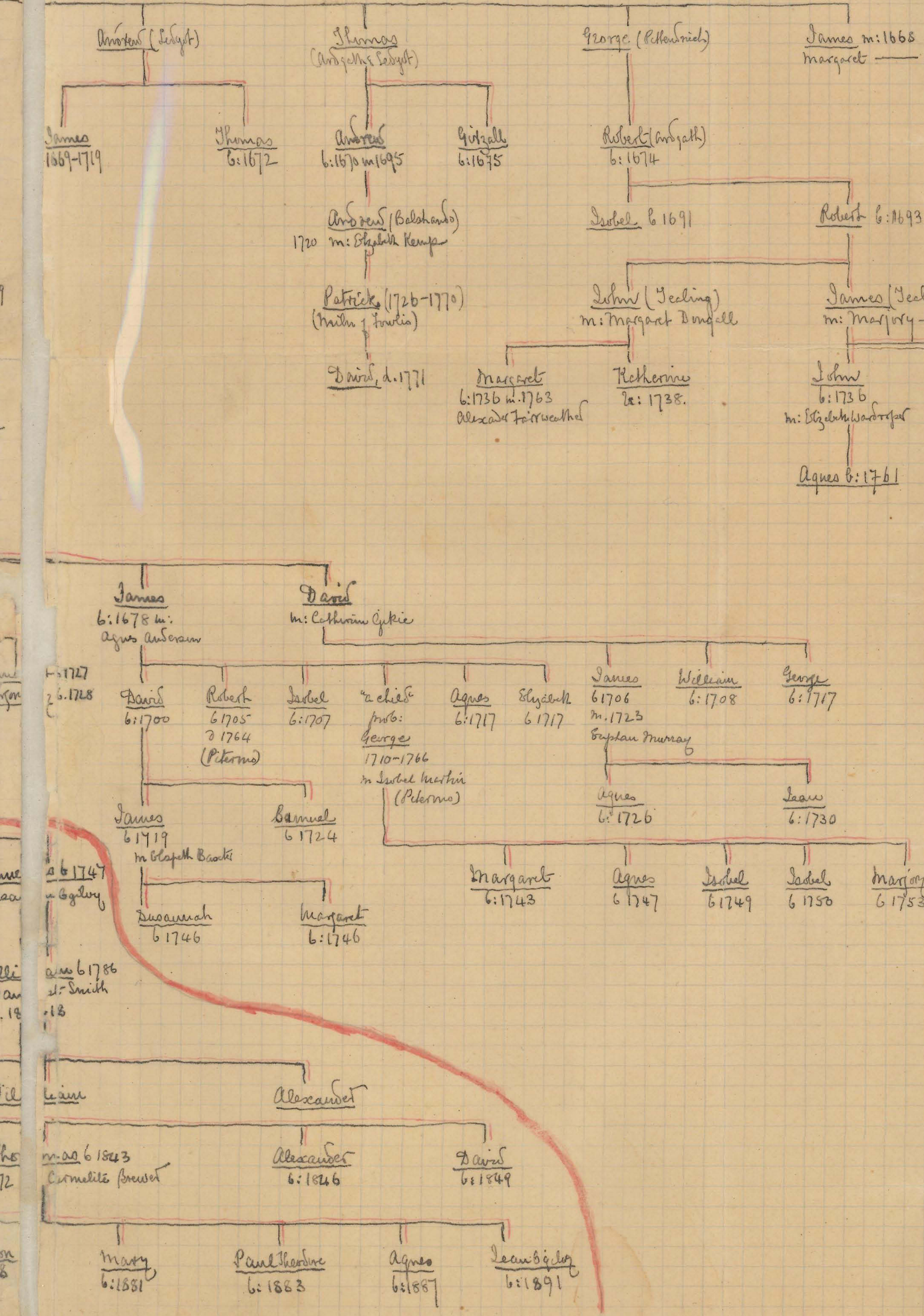


Christies of Balleuchlie etc.



Given Register 1672.

"James Christie of Balleuchlie, Beasts, Or, a
Sichine engrailed, embowed with four mallets pale
marking, gules beehive argent. Motto in an
escrolle Sit tibi nimis congrua. No crest
is given. "Holly thump leaves & prickles left" is given
in 1721 and later but it seems that another crest is
"Crossed with a cross, in three quarters pale."

James: - Every name mentioned exists in Register or Records -

- (a) James Christie 1st seems to have acquired Balleuchlie about 1633. He seems to be mentioned in
King's Court Records July 1613 in connection with Andrew or David Christie. The connection
with previous John Christie of Balleuchlie see St Andrews Commissariat Records vol. II.
James Christie & all his living descendants in the parish of Balleuchlie have signed
the Covenants. James may have been a lawyer - similar city records should be searched -
- (b) Through this marriage family of Alexander Fraser descent from Borne & Earl of
Rango of Scotland & Plantagenets of England - see Peerage and/or Baronage and
old chart.

It is to be noted that Balleuchlie is part of the parish of Caputh (why
I cannot tell) and that probably something may be found in its registers -



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
