Section 8, Chapter 197, Laws 1935 to be known as Section 9950-22 of Mason's Minn. Statutes. If any public official charged with the duty of furnishing to the bureau fingerprint records, reports or other information required by this act shall neglect or refuse to comply with such requirement, the bureau in writing shall notify the state, county or city officer charged with the issuance of a warrant for the payment of the salary of such official. Upon the receipt of such notice, such state, county or city official shall withhold the issuance of a warrant for the payment of the salary or other compensation accruing to such officer for the period of thirty days thereafter until notified by the bureau that such suspension has been released by the performance of the required duty.

This law should be strictly adhered to.

Two Shot to Death, Third Gives Up at Bangor-U. S. Agerst Wounded

Bangor, Maine, Oct. 12 .- (AP)-Federal sleuths, operating with today characteristic precision, erased with a hail of machinegun fire the notorious Al Brady gang of Indiana outlaws. Swept to swift death as the fed-

leader of the gang, and Clarence Shaffer, Jr., one of his henchmen. A third member, James Dalhover, threw down his pistol and surrendered after a machinegun bullet flecked his nose. He was

erals struck suddenly were Brady,

quickly lodged in a jail cell. Only one G-man suffered injury and he, Walter Walsh, was shot in the shoulder. At a hospital, surgeons said they believed his wound was not serious.

The showdown between the government and the gangsters came as the latter left a sporting goods store they had visited to purchase pistol cartridges. A federal officer and a member of the Bangor police were in the store and three gunmen became suspicious and fled

As Brady emerged, pistol in hand, they were met by a hail of machinegun slugs directed by Gman concealed in a vacant building across the street. The gunmen returned the fire.

Brady then lay writhing on the pavement, blood gushing from his chest. Shaffer lay beside him, his head and chest riddled. Dalhover fled up an alley and attempted to hide, but he offered no resistance when Inspector Frank Golden of the Bangor police came up and snapped handcuffs about his wrists. Two Machineguns Found

In an automobile the gunmen had parked outside the store, officers found two army machineguns, a can of engine oil and blankets. The car bore Ohio registration

After the coup, the officers said 17 federal officers, headed by Myron Guerney, had been in the city working on the case during the last four days. They sprang into action today when Inspector Frank McClay of the Bangor police reported the bandit carewas entering the city.

Long Terrorized Midwest

The gangsters, who long have terrorized the midwest with their forays upon banks and their armed bravado against officers of the law, had been traced to Bangor by the department of justice agents, working with Indiana state police.

Deputy sheriffs and Bangor police hastily cleared the streets of passersby, who miraculously escaped injury, and kept curious onlookers beyond range.

But the destruction of Brady and his men was not as simple as the killing of the more famous Indiana-born gangster, John Dillinger, who also fell before G-man guns.

Citizens See Gun Battle

The firing today went on for five minutes before Brady and Shaffer lay dead before the horrified gaze of scores of Bangor citizens on their way to work.

In the killing of Brady, the department of justice ended a career which they charge included the murder of an Indianapolis police sergeant, Richard River, and an Indiana state policeman, Paul Minneman, and Edward Linsey, a

Piqua, Ohio, grocery clerk. Brady also led his mob in numerous raids on banks in the midwest, the officers said. He was known like Dillinger, as a desperate criminal with a "nervous trigger finger."

It was recalled that Brady on one occasion boasted:

"I'll make John Dillinger look

like a punk." But today the federal men made

Al Brady look like John Dillinger that Chicago night when federal fire cut him down as he fled from the "finger woman," the storied "lady i nred."

The spectacular coup, which federal agents said wiped out Indiana's Brady gang, was engineered in the holiday atmosphere of a New England main street. hardware store clerk's tipoff to the police chief was credited with ending an 18-month hunt.


20 Holdups Laid To Brady Gunmer

ing future bank forays, Donald F Stiver, state police superintendent today ordered Indiana state police to "use every means" to capture the three fugitives of the Al Brady

He biamed the Brady gunmen for at least two slayings and a score or more of bank and jewelry store holdups in Indiana and Ohio within the last nine months.

He declared Brady had been iden-

tified as one of three braggart bandits who held up the Carthage State Bank yesterday, escaping with approximately \$2,000.



LOGANSPORT, Ind., May 26.— (UP)—Officers and volunteers armed with shotguns, machine guns, radios and airplanes patrolled highways of four states today to halt depredations of a gang whose lead-er boasted he would out-Dillinger the infamous John Dillinger.

Somewhere in Indiana backlands Alfred Brady, James Dalhover and Clarence Lee Shaffer were believed hiding with the \$2,500 they scooped from the vaults of the Goodland, Ind., state bank Tuesday. One of their guns was the ,30 caliber automatic rifle which pumped 51 slugs in a pursuing state police car, wounding State Policeman Minneman critically and Deputy Sheriff Elmer Craig less seriously.

\$ 1,500.00 REWARD

On June 15, 1937, Homer Cummings, Attorney General of the United States, under authority vested in him by law, offered the following rewards:

\$500 for information furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation resulting in the apprehension of ALFRED BRADY;

\$500 for information furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation resulting in the apprehension of JAMES DALHOVER;

\$500 for information furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation resulting in the apprehension of CLARENCE LEE SHAFFER.

The photographs and descriptions of the above named persons are hereinafter set out.

A complaint was filed at Cleveland, Ohio, on October 13, 1936, charging the above named individuals with the interstate transportation of stolen property. These men are also wanted in the State of Indiana upon murder charges and are sought for several bank robberies.

No part of the aforesaid rewards shall be paid to any officials or employees of the Department of Justice. The right is reserved to divide and allocate portions of any of said rewards as between several claimants. The offer provides that all claims to any of the above described rewards and all questions and disputes that may arise as among claimants to the foregoing rewards shall be passed upon by the Attorney General and that his decisions shall be final and conclusive.
