CARROLL IDENTIFIED IN \$46,000 S. D. RAID

Two Others Also Linked by Witnesses With Robbery in Sioux Falls.

Positive identification of Tommy Carroll and two others as members of the gang of machine-gun bandits who robbed the Security National bank in Sioux Falls, S. D., of \$46,000 March 6 was announced by the sher-iff's office at Sioux Falls Saturday, the Associated Press reported.

Carroll, who was arrested in St. Paul in September and released two days later, is said to be a former confederate of Verne Miller, slain gangster and once sheriff at Huron, S. D. Wanted with Carroll for the Sioux Falls robbery are Frank (Porky) Dillon, one-time Touhy gangster, and George (Baby Face) Nelson, escaped Illinois convict.

Pictures shown to witnesses of the raid led to identification of the trio. From a stack of photographs of suspects, twelve witnesses unhesitantly picked out the picture of Nelson as

picked out the picture of Nelson as the gunner who shot Hale Keith, motorcycle patrolman, through bank window while the holden was in progress. Keith is recovering

from his wounds.

Dillon and Carroll were named as the outside guards who held nearly 1,000 townspeople at bay in the streets during the robbery, occasionally firing intimidating bursts from machine-guns. Carroll, with machine-guns who capally firing intimidating bursts from their machine-guns. Carroll, wit-nesses said, was the man who cap-tured four police officers during the


