





Chapman is the subject of Identification Order #1456 issued September 8, 1937.

Irving Charles Chapman was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Shreveport, Louisiana, on February 21, 1933, for the violation of the National Motor Vehicle Theft Act, in that, on or about December 5, 1932, he transported in interstate commerce a stolen Chevrolet coach from Shreveport, Louisiana, to Texarkana, Arkansas, knowing it to have been stolen.

Irving Charles Chapman was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Tyler, Texas, on October 9, 1936, for the robbery of the First National Bank at Atlanta, Texas, on August 31, 1936.

Irving Charles Chapman was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Beaumont, Texas, on March 19, 1937, for the robbery of the First National Bank at Atlanta, Texas, on June 6, 1934.

MERIDIAN, MISS. (P)—F.B.I. agents fanned out over Neshoba county hills Monday in a swift roundup of persons suspected of befriending Charles Chapman, Public

Enemy No. 1, during the three-year search ended when he was shot to death Sunday night.

Police announced six persons had been jailed here, including Chapman's wife, who was not informed of his death, and said that at least 25 might eventually be jailed on suspicion of harboring or aiding Chapman, one of the south's most elusive criminals.

Considered a Hero.

Percy Wyly II, F.B.I. agent in charge of Mississippi, who personally led officers in the final reckoning with Chapman, said the entire area would be combed for his confederates and friends, some of whom had considered him a hero.

Federal agents and state and local police poured 19 bullets into Chapman's head and body after he refused to surrender and emptied his gun without effect. Alfred Ward, the fugitive's chauffeur, surrendered uninjured.

Chapman had robbed banks, filling stations and stores, stolen cars and kidnaped persons, shot law officers and led bloody prison breaks in a half dozen southern states for the last decade. He was labelled Public Enemy No. 1 on Sept. 9, 1939 by the F.B.I., which said his specialty was bank robbing.

Chapman shot his way out of one police trap and eluded many others.

The F.B.I. always felt Chapman was hiding in his native Neshoba county, but friends suspected of helping the outlaw made detection difficult.

Ward a Decoy.

Shooting of a Meridian police officer Jan. 14 brought Chapman to the end of the trail. He escaped then but Ward, who was with him, was arrested and later apparently became a decoy as he was released recently and was with Chapman when he was killed.

Chapman's largest bank haul was at Tupelo, Miss., where he took \$18,000 in cash and \$26,000 in securities. He once was a moderately wealthy Arkansas contractor who lost his money on a Florida road contract during the depression.
