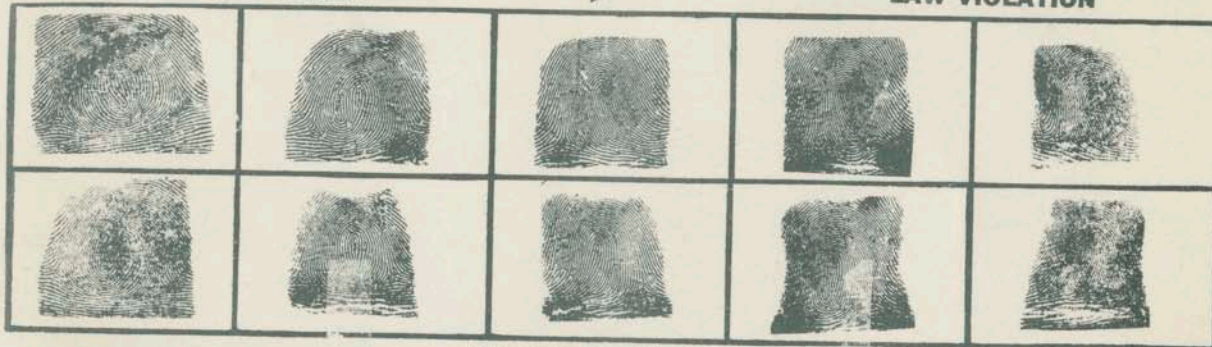

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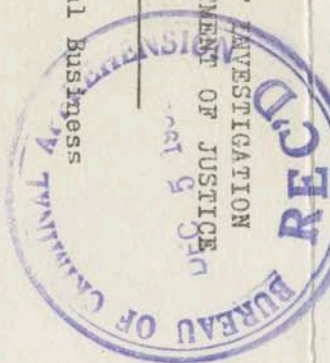

# WIFE HELD AS DUTCH SCHULTZ DIES OF WOUNDS

## Gangster Bullets Kill Fourth Victim in Feud Over Rackets

Newark, N. J., Oct. 25.—With Dutch Schultz, king of the metropolitan underworld, and three of his lieutenants lying dead, and the wife of the arch racketeer held for questioning, police of the greater New York area and federal G-men today prepared to cope with the bloody outburst of gang warfare.

Thirty-five leading mobsters, not only in New York and Newark, but in Detroit, Cleveland and Chicago are scheduled to be wiped out in the wake of murderous gunfire that spelled doom for the Dutch Schultz gang, according to information gleaned by the police over the gangland grapevine.

### Four Are Dead

One report has it that a new underworld dictator has vowed to take over all the major rackets in the United States and has decreed the "execution" of every key racket man in the east.

Schultz, whose real name was Arthur Flegenheimer, was shot down in the Palace cafe here Wednesday night along with Bernard Rosencrantz, his No. 1 trigger man; Otto Berman, race track handicapper, and Leo Frank. Schultz died last night. Berman and Frank died Thursday a few hours after the shooting, while Rosencrantz succeeded in hanging on until this morning when he too died.

### Wife Is Held

A few hours after Schultz and his trio of aids felt the bite of bullets in Newark, Martin Krompfer, his chief lieutenant in Manhattan, and Sam Gold, a racetrack man, were shot down in a Broadway barber shop.

At the Polyclinic hospital in New York the latest word was that Krompfer had only a "bare, fighting chance," but that Gold was out of danger.

The detention of Mrs. Schultz, the police said, solved the mystery woman angle of the case. An hour before the shooting, they said, the former showgirl visited the boss mobster at the restaurant where he was to meet his doom.
