



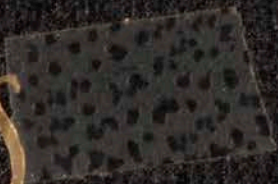

Breens to See How It stood Time

Fifty years ago tomorrow William H. Breen and Faustina H. Libby stood before the Rev. Samuel D. Smith in the St. Paul home of Maj. Elias D. Libby and exchanged marriage vows.

Twenty-eight years ago they came to Duluth from St. Paul and Mr.

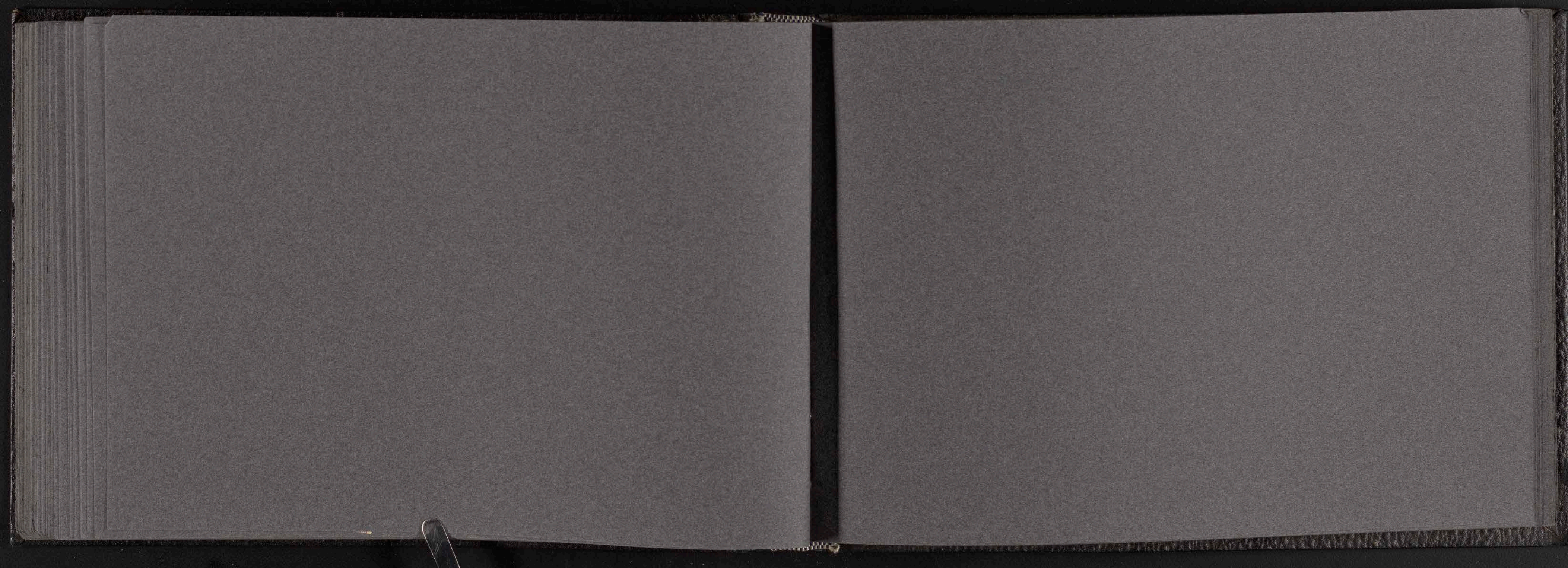
Breen became a member of the printer staff of The Duluth Herald, a vocation he followed for 20 years until his retirement from the post of head machinist in The Herald's composing room.

These events and more will be recalled when the Breens are honor guests at a family dinner Monday noon in the home of a daughter, Mrs. W. W. Clemens, 926 East Fifth street.

But the high spot of their golden wedding festivities won't come until 4 p. m. when they return to the Breen's home at 1317 East Ninth street, there to open two copper-bound, soldered tin cans Major Libby entrusted to the newlyweds that memorable Sept. 4, 1889.

"We're not sure what we'll find," Mrs. Breen chuckled yesterday. "All we know is that my father put pieces of our wedding cake in each can, packed them with granulated sugar, then soldered the lid on tight. We've been tempted to open it as each anniversary came along, but we kept putting it off and putting it off. Now we've decided to see what happens to a piece of fruit cake when it's sealed in sugar for 50 years."

Mr. Breen, who is 80 years old, and Mrs. Breen, who is 71, will be greeted at tomorrow's celebration by two sons, John, of Duluth, who has the same kind of position with The Herald his father had, and Willis L., of St. Paul; another daughter, Miss Faustina, and five grandchildren.
