2 MIN - RIVERBEND ROTARY PRESENTATION

Introduction (2 minutes total)

- Personal Introduction: Name, profession, and a brief personal history. (30 seconds)

Interactive Element (3 minutes total)

- Depending on the format and timing, consider including an interactive element such as a Q&A, activity, or discussion. This can make the presentation more engaging and memorable. (3 minutes)

Conclusion (3 minutes total)

- Summarize the main points of the presentation. (1 minute)
- Call to Action: What do you want your audience to do with the information you've provided? This could be a personal action, a way they can get involved in the community, etc. (1 minute)
- Thank the audience for their time and attention. (1 minute)

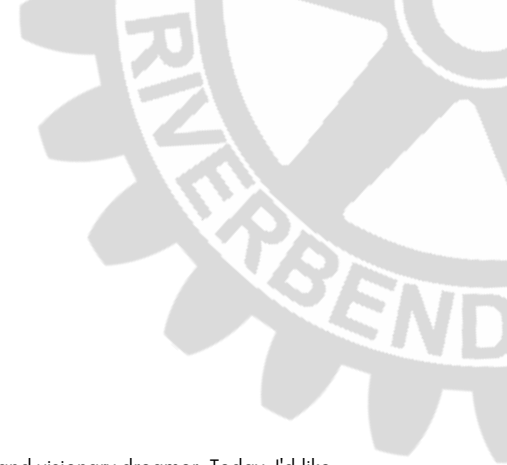
Q&A (1 minute total)

- Body Language: Stand tall, make eye contact, and use gestures to reinforce your words.
- Voice: Speak clearly and vary your tone, pitch, and volume to keep the audience engaged.
- Authenticity: Be yourself and let your passion for the topic shine through.
