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Why this matters?

INCREASED RISK OF EXPLOITATION

Studies show that disabled individuals are 3–4 times more likely to be victims of cybercrime, including scams and grooming, compared to non-disabled individuals.



TARGETING VULNERABLE GROUPS

43% of parents of neurodivergent children report concerns about their child being targeted by online predators or scams.



DIGITAL INCLUSION GAP

Only 38% of disabled individuals feel confident using online safety tools, compared to 70% of non-disabled users.



IMPACT OF ONLINE HARASSMENT

60% of neurodivergent adults report experiencing online harassment or bullying, often leading to increased anxiety and isolation.

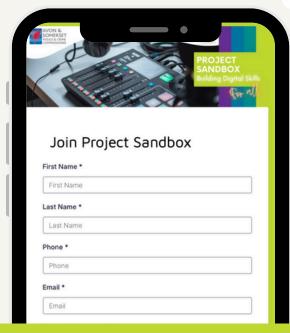
