
HISTORIC BOOKS FOR KIRS Teens



Historical fiction for older teens by time period

In case you're wondering which books are more suited for older kids, we put together this comprehensive list. The list has grown (and will continue to grow) over time.

I would love to say I've read them all, but there are simply too many books and not enough hours. However, most come recommended as appropriate for "teens". In keeping with our "Historic Books for Kids" theme, it was necessary to omit some recommendations if they seemed too adultish. However, I retained many and labeled them "YA to Adult" if they are typically studied classics or the historic topic is an important one (and the characters are younger men and women).

Cold War, Space Race to Present

Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy by John le Carre. Cold War era after World War II.

<u>Hidden Figures Young Readers' Edition</u> by Margot Lee Shetterly. 1950s touches on civil rights, space race, cold war, and gender equality topics.
