Boat Registration & Storage Updates

All boats stored at the WLPOA beach or on the storage racks must be registered and display a current WLPOA boat sticker and getting your sticker is easier than ever!

Join us for **Beach Clean-Up Day on Saturday, May 3, from 9 AM-1 PM** and during this event, you'll be able to purchase your boat sticker and place it directly on your boat. Boat inventory is in process, and boats without a current sticker will be tagged.

Special Incentive: If you remove an old or unwanted boat from the beach storage area by June 1, you'll receive \$50 off your annual dues. The final deadline for all boats to have a current sticker is June 1.

Lake Quality

Wing Lake Inc. is the parent association committed to protecting our lake's health. Fertilizers used by residents on and around the lake add to already high phosphorus and nitrogen levels, fueling weed and algae growth that harms wildlife and water quality. Last year, we asked you to avoid fertilizers—and it helped. Let's keep up the momentum and continue preserving Wing Lake together!



Wing Lake Inc. Update

Every lake is unique and constantly changing—there's no one-size-fits-all solution for managing lake health or controlling harmful algal blooms (HABs). Our Lake Consultant, will be visiting, measuring, and monitoring the lake 4 times this year vs. our normal 2 times – the goal is to better understand what is going on with the ecosystem and being better able to target treatments including timing and dosages.

Reducing what enters the lake is key—nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus play a big role. Simple steps like using less fertilizer, planting native vegetation, and removing invasive plants can really help.
