

How to apply at SAHE?

Step 01: Prepare your application

If you are applying from overseas, we encourage you to start your application process at least 3 months before your course start date to allow time for collating required supporting documentation, arranging for accommodation, flight tickets and familiarising yourself with your new surroundings.

Step 02: Assessment of application

Once our Admissions team have received your completed application, a Letter of Offer will be issued within 2 business days of receipt.

Step 03: Letter of Offer

A Letter of Offer will be issued with the Written Agreement with payment details. Some International Applicants under SSVF will be required to submit financial evidence showing that they have the funds required for their first year in Australia.

Step 04: Acceptance and Payment

Once we have received your Acceptance Form and fee payment we will send you a Receipt of Payment, Confirmation of Enrolment, required to apply for your Student Visa.

Step 05: Applying for Student Visa

Information on applying for Student Visas can be found at the Department of Home Affairs. Once you have obtained your Australian Student Visa, you are able to book and pay for your flights to campus. You can also start to research accommodation options.

Step 06: Welcome and Orientation

Our Student Services team will be delighted to welcome you and your fellow students on campus as part of your orientation program.
