THE QUESTION

Can't I just stay neutral about Jesus?

THE TENSION

We want neutrality. We want Jesus as an inspirational figure, not a decisive force. But He won't allow it. He said, "No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6). That's not neutral, that's absolute.

THE STORY BENEATH IT ALL

In **Creation**, He is the source of life itself (Col. 1:16).

In the Fall, humanity chose independence, but He remained the promised Savior (Gen. 3:15).

In **Redemption**, His death and resurrection split history in two (1 Cor. 15:3–8).

In **Restoration**, His return won't be optional; "every knee will bow" (Phil. 2:10).

THE GOLLIZION OF IDENTITY AND INFLUENCE

Jesus unsettled the powerful, comforted the marginalized, and demanded a response from everyone He met. He still does.
