THE QUESTION

If human beings wrote the Bible, how can it really be God's Word?

THE TENDION

We live in an age that trusts data but doubts ancient texts. Skeptics argue, "If flawed men wrote it, it must be flawed." But the Bible claims something unique: human authors carried along by divine breath (2 Tim. 3:16–17; 2 Pet. 1:20–21).

THE STORY BENEATH IT ALL

In **Creation**, God spoke creation into being (Gen. 1:3).

In the Fall, Satan's first attack was against God's Word (Gen. 3:1).

In Redemption, Scripture points to Christ, the Word made flesh (John 1:14).

In Restoration, God's Word endures forever (Matt. 24:35).

THE COLLIDION OF HUMAN AND DIVINE

Forty authors. Three languages. Fifteen centuries. Different continents, cultures, and careers—shepherds, kings, prophets, doctors, fishermen. They wrote from deserts, prisons, palaces, and battlefields. By all odds it should've been a mess of contradictions. Instead, it's one story with one voice. Men held the pen, but God breathed the message (2 Pet. 1:21).
