The Holy Baptism

of Clayton James Walker

The candidate, sponsors, and family gather with the pastor at the font.

Dearly beloved, Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In the last chapter of Mark our Lord promises, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you."

The Word of God also teaches that we are all conceived and born sinful and are under the power of the devil until Christ claims us as His own.

The Exorcism

Therefore, depart, you unclean spirit, and make room for the Holy Spirit in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen.

The pastor makes the sign of the holy cross upon the forehead and heart of the candidate while saying:

- **P** Let us pray.
- Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing this washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin.

We pray that You would behold <u>*Clayton James*</u> according to Your boundless mercy and bless <u>*him*</u> with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood all sin in <u>*him*</u> which has been inherited from Adam and which <u>*he himself has*</u> committed since, would be drowned and die. Grant that <u>*he*</u> be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in Your promise, <u>he</u> would be declared worthy of eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

P Hear the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

They brought young children to [Jesus] that He might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, He was greatly displeased and said to them, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it." And He took them up in His arms, put His hands on them, and blessed them.

The pastor places his hands on the head of the candidate, and the congregation joins in praying: **Lord's Prayer**

C Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The pastor addresses the candidate and asks the following questions:

- **P** <u>*Clayton*</u>, do you renounce the devil?
- **R** Yes, I renounce him.
- **P** Do you renounce all his works?
- **R** Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce all his ways?
- **R** Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?
- **R** Yes, I believe.

- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- **P** <u>*Clayton*</u>, do you desire to be baptized?
- **R** Yes, I do.

The pastor pours water three times on the head of each candidate while saying:

P <u>Clayton James</u>,

I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The pastor anoints the newly baptized with oil while saying:






Holy Gospel

The Final Goal of the Christian Life *A Meditation on the Word of God* | Revelation 21:1-7

The present heaven and earth is filled with evil. The beast rules here. Satan is king, and God's name is not glorified in the world. When God's glory appears on earth, it usually appears negatively: as God's destructive judgment against evil. We do not see God or experience his presence on earth. God is with us but only in a hidden way, beneath word and sacrament. We walk by faith and not by sight. This present heaven and earth is destined to be burned by fire. This is God's plan for the world. He must purge it of evil. He must create a new heaven and a new earth. Only after evil is purged and the kingdom comes can God dwell with man.

The distinctive feature of the new heaven and the new earth as St. John describes it in Revelation *is the immediate presence of God*. Note this. For the first time, since the Fall into Sin, God is described as dwelling with his people immediately, without barriers or anything separating him from them. God is making his home with man in a new heavenly city (V3). This city is filled with God's holiness for evil has been fully banished from it. The city is marked by an absence of mourning and death, for these are described as **'the former things'** (V4)—results of sin and evil that have no place in the new creation. In our present world, God is with his people, but only in a hidden way: working through intermediaries like pastors, parents, Christian friends. In the new heaven and the new earth, God is present immediately for his people, to put away their grief and replace it with heavenly joy (V4). There is nothing separating them from him, for evil has been banished forever. The new heaven and the new earth might be described as *theocentric*, which means, God is at the center of it. His glory is seen, his presence is evident to all. This is how it was in the first creation, before the fall into Sin (Genesis 1-2). The new heaven and the new earth is creation restored to its original purpose and glory, as all creatures are destined to live and move and have their being before God.

Jesus says, **I am the Alpha and the Omega** (V6). These are two Greek letters (look at the bulletin cover for today and you will see them artfully drawn and entwined). They are the first and last letter of the Greek alphabet, like our letters A and Z. So, when Jesus says he is the Alpha and the Omega, he means that he is the first and last, the beginning and the end. Not only was Jesus present at the *beginning* of creation as the Word of God through whom God the Father spoke this creation into existence. Jesus is present as the *final goal* of creation. He is our <u>Creator</u>—our beginning. But he is also our <u>Destiny</u>: the goal of our lives. All things are from him—he is the Source of all things, and all things are going back to him—he is the Goal.

Life in the immediate presence of Jesus will be life in its fullest sense. It will be life beyond the reach of all that threatens and contradicts life now. It will be eternal life because it will be life that is *immediately joined to its source in God*. The thirsty are bid to drink from the spring of the water of Life (V6). This is a river which flows out of the Temple (22:1), and ultimately, out of the riven side of Christ. The picture here is of man being made full partakers of the divine life—God's life flowing into ours, and our lives, reflecting his glory. In the new heaven and earth, that blessed hope will be fully realized. Don't let the sorrows of this present life get you down. These promises are **trustworthy and true** (V5) for the one who speaks them to you is trustworthy and true. Hold onto these promises and all the more as you face evil in your life.
