





Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12–14; 2:18–26

²Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity....

¹²I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an unhappy business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. ¹⁴I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after wind. . . .

¹⁸I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, ¹⁹and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰So I turned about and gave my heart up to despair over all the toil of my labors under

the sun, ²¹because sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²²What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? ²³For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

²⁴There is nothing better for a person than that he should eat and drink and find enjoyment in his toil. This also, I saw, is from the hand of God, ²⁵for apart from him who can eat or who can have enjoyment? ²⁶For to the one who pleases him God has given wisdom and knowledge and joy, but to the sinner he has given the business of gathering and collecting, only to give to one who pleases God. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.










Holy Gospel Luke 12:13–21

The Parable of the Rich Fool

A Meditation on the Word of God | Luke 12:13-21

Take a look at the bulletin cover for today. The artist captured Jesus' parable well. A man peers at his own possessions with a devilishly greedy look on his face. He strokes his beard, calculating all his wealth. Little does he know the Angel of the Lord stands behind him with sword unsheathed, ready to slay him that very night. The artist calls the painting 'The Man Who Hoards.' This is an apt description for the parable. The man hoards treasure on earth. He accumulates for himself earthly possessions and finds his security in his full barns, his stockpile of earthly goods. As the Lord requires his soul that very night, he is revealed to be a fool. Why?

Because he failed to inwardly digest the wisdom of Solomon in today's Old Testament reading. What are the things of this world? Vanity. A Hebrew word which means 'vapor.' Try to catch vapor and put it in your pocket. Earthly possessions are like vapor because the one who slavishly devotes himself to gathering them dies and leaves them to someone else: they vanish like morning mist. "You can't take it with you." "There are no U-Hauls behind hearses." The sinner gathers and collects, only to give his possessions to the one who pleases God. This is a sad business Solomon says, because even the gathering and collecting is unsatisfying. The pursuit of greedy gain does not satisfy. Those who are motivated by greedy gain are not happy and satisfied people, even though they might find wealth on earth and get rich.

Who is the happy one? He who finds enjoyment in his toil with which he toils under the sun. The one who lives by the faith that recognizes the Lord as the Giver of every good gift is the one who finds true enjoyment in his work—the one whose sights are trained, not on the things of this world, but on God. He or she finds, not the shallow happiness that comes from acquiring possessions, but the real and deep happiness that comes from faith in the promises of the Gospel. The things we have are transitory, but the love of God for his people is everlasting.

The hymn of the Day sets before us true versus false wealth. What is the world to me/ with all its vaunted pleasure / When you and you alone / Lord Jesus, are my treasure! In another parable, there was a man who found buried treasure in a field and sold all he had to buy that field, so he could have that priceless treasure. Jesus is that treasure. He is worth losing everything for. He calls his disciples to give up all to follow him. Even more, the Lord is the one who lost his very life to have us again in his kingdom. Look at what he spent to purchase you from your sins for God! The world seeks after wealth/ and all that mammon offers/ yet never is content/though gold should fill its coffers. This stanza so faithfully conveys the wisdom of Solomon. We pursue earthly wealth like the Rich Fool, but what contentment does it buy our souls? Devoting ourselves to greedy gain, the contentment we seek proves elusive. Try to catch the wind. I have a higher good. / Content with it I'll be/ My Jesus is my wealth...in Christ, we find every blessing both temporal and spiritual. We find true joy, lasting peace, deep contentment. A life wholly given over to his service is not a vain life, but a rich life. Even those who go without the things of this world and suffer here are rich in the hereafter. See the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus for proof of this. Those who die to self and the idolatry of money find in Jesus a God much more worthy of our devotion. Faith in Christ and not in money is the key to true joy, both in this life and in the life of the world to come.
