

The Holy Baptism

of Ezra Paul Skove

The candidate, sponsors, and family gather with the pastor at the font.

P Dearly beloved, Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In the last chapter of Mark our Lord promises, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." And the apostle Peter has written, "Baptism now saves you."

The Word of God also teaches that we are all conceived and born sinful and are under the power of the devil until Christ claims us as His own.

The Exorcism

Therefore, depart, you unclean spirit, and make room for the Holy Spirit in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen.

The pastor makes the sign of the holy cross upon the forehead and heart of the candidate while saying:

- P Receive the sign of the holy cross both upon your + forehead and upon your + heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified.
- **P** Let us pray.
- P Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing this washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin.

We pray that You would behold <u>Ezra Paul</u> according to Your boundless mercy and bless <u>him</u> with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood all sin in <u>him</u> which has been inherited from Adam and which <u>he himself has</u> committed since, would be drowned and die. Grant that <u>he</u> be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in

Your promise, <u>he</u> would be declared worthy of eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

- C Amen.
- P Hear the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

They brought young children to [Jesus] that He might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, He was greatly displeased and said to them, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it." And He took them up in His arms, put His hands on them, and blessed them.

The pastor places his hands on the head of the candidate, and the congregation joins in praying:

Lord's Prayer

C Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The pastor addresses the candidate and asks the following questions:

- **P** *Ezra Paul*, do you renounce the devil?
- R Yes, I renounce him.
- **P** Do you renounce all his works?
- R Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce all his ways?
- R Yes, I renounce them.
- **P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?
- R Yes, I believe.

- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- **P** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?
- **R** *Yes, I believe.*
- **P** <u>Ezra Paul</u>, do you desire to be baptized?
- **R** Yes, I do.

The pastor pours water three times on the head of each candidate while saying:

- **P** <u>Ezra Paul,</u>
 I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

The pastor anoints the newly baptized with oil while saying:

- P The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with His grace to life

 → everlasting.
- C Amen.
- Peace + be with you.
- C Amen.

Holy Gospel Luke 10:1–20

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the tenth chapter.



¹After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. ²And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. ⁴Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. ⁵Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' ⁶And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. ⁷And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. ⁸Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. ⁹Heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹⁰But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, ¹¹'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of

God has come near.' ¹²I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

¹³"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. ¹⁴But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. ¹⁵And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.

¹⁶ The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me."

Jesus Sends Out the Seventy-Two

A Meditation on the Word of God | Luke 10:1-20

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out the seventy-two. They are sent ahead of him because he himself is coming, and people need to be prepared for the coming of the Lord Jesus through repentance and faith. The seventy-two are a picture of the Church's mission unto the end of the age. They represent pastors. There is urgency to their mission. They are to greet no one on the road because there is no time to waste. The fields are ripe for the harvest. The harvest is the great ingathering of the world into Christ's kingdom through the preaching of the Gospel. Pastors preach the word. People are converted from unbelief to saving faith. They are the laborers we, the Church, are commanded to pray that the Lord of the harvest would send.

They are being sent as lambs in the midst of wolves. Jesus is the Lamb of God. Theirs is a cruciform (cross-shaped) ministry that will look like Jesus' ministry. That is, they will receive the hostility of the world and their preaching result in violence just as it did for Christ. They will suffer as their Lord suffers, even as they carry the death of Jesus in their bodies. They are to carry nothing with them because they have forgone the things of this world and are dependent upon the care and protection of their fellow Christians. They have renounced home and family. Their new kin are those who receive the message of peace they proclaim. They are not to depend on themselves, but their trust is in the Lord of the mission and the promise that the devil will not hurt them. Why carry nothing? Jesus encourages them to understand that they live by the grace of God alone and not by any human strength. This is an exercise of faith.

As his ambassadors, the seventy-two represent Jesus. Where they preach, Jesus is preaching: "He who hears you, hears Me." The Lord's ministers are to say to those who receive them, "Peace be to this house." This word "Peace" is not "hello." Peace summarizes the whole Gospel. The peace they proclaim is the peace of God—the peace of sins forgiven—a new, peaceful relationship with God, effected by Jesus' death on the cross. As Christians believe, they live in the peace of Jesus. Meanwhile, the people of God who receive the Lord's ministers show hospitality. They provide food, shelter, and drink to the seventy-two. So do congregations receive and care for the Lord's pastors. The eating and drinking is a picture of the table-fellowship we share together in the Lord's Supper. In the first century, all Churches were House Churches. What goes on in this house—preaching, table-fellowship, hospitality, healing, works of mercy—this is the activity of the Church, even as she exists today in the world. This is Word and Sacrament ministry. This is the loving people of God bearing one another's burdens.

What is the effect of the mission of the seventy-two? Satan falls like lightening, verse 18. That is, with the activity of the Lord's pastors the kingdom of Christ advances and the kingdom of the evil one is rolled back. True spiritual warfare happens not with physical weapons but with the Gospel, preached and believed. Jesus sees Satan fall like lightening because he sees with divine sight. He sees more than we can see or recognize. He sees the goodness of the mission, and how the devil is driven away from God's people by the word and sacraments and prayer. The Church is never not in need of pastors to preach, absolve, baptize, feed the Lord's sheep in Jesus' name, and prepare the people of God for the visitation of Jesus Christ on the Last Day. At Christ's command, we pray that God would raise up men for the work of ministry.
