To Philemon our beloved fellow worker ² and Apphia our sister and Archippus our fellow soldier, and the church in your house:

³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers, ⁵because I hear of your love and of the faith that you have toward the Lord Jesus and all the saints, ⁶and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. ⁷For I have derived much joy and comfort from your love, my brother, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you.

⁸Accordingly, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do what is required, ⁹yet for love's sake I prefer to appeal to you—I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus— ¹⁰I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in my imprisonment. ¹¹(Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) ¹²I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. ¹³I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, ¹⁴but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own free will. ¹⁵For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶no longer as a slave but more than a slave, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me. ¹⁸If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹I, Paul, write this with my own hand: I will repay it—to say nothing of your owing me even your own self. ²⁰Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in the Lord. Refresh my heart in Christ.










Holy Gospel Luke 14:25–35

Counting the Cost of Discipleship

A Meditation on the Word of God | Luke 14:25-35

When Jesus calls us to hate family members in today's Gospel, he is calling us to the death of self. What could be more central and essential to a person than one's family? Yet this is what discipleship requires: that we let go of everything dear to us in order to gain Christ.

Sometimes, the greatest gifts of God can become idols when we are tempted to love and serve those things the place of Christ. Family members can become hindrances to discipleship. Say, the family of a believing Christian does not share the believing Christian's faith. Say, the family rejects the believing Christian because of his faith. What should the Christian do? At this point he is presented with a choice: follow his earthly family, or continue to follow Jesus.

Jesus wants us to renounce even family for his sake. In a list of commitments and priorities, Jesus wants his Word to come first. He wants our primary loyalty and allegiance. He wants his Word to be the guiding principle of our lives. He doesn't want anything to separate us from him. He wants us to give up everything for the sake of following him.

The good news of the Gospel is that Jesus counted the cost of discipleship and renounced everything for the sake of our salvation. For our sakes, Jesus let go of his earthly family. He submitted himself perfectly to his Father's will to save us from sin and death. On the cross, Jesus even suffered abandonment from his heavenly Father. Jesus lost his life to gain us.

Now, baptized in Christ, we get a new heavenly family. God is our Father, and Christ is our elder-Brother. In Christ, we get a whole new family of brothers and sisters called the Holy Christian Church. And, when we die with Christ and rise to new life with him, we get our earthly families given back to us in a new and better way than we ever had them before. Now in Christ, we are free to love our family members as Christ loved them: not with an idolatrous and self-serving love, but with a selfless, self-giving love that is borne of the Gospel. In Christ we can be 'salt' to our families. We can encourage them in Christ, preserve them from error, and lead them spiritually with his Word. The only way we can love our families rightly is in Christ. When we idolize our families, we are sure to misuse them. But if Christ is first in our lives, then our loves will be properly ordered and we will be able to serve our families rightly.



The Anima Christi is a Communion prayer dated to the 14th Century. It is commonly prayed before or after receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.
