Epistle *Hebrews 11:17—12:3*

¹⁷By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, ¹⁸of whom it was said, "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." ¹⁹He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back. ²⁰By faith Isaac invoked future blessings on Jacob and Esau. ²¹By faith Jacob, when dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, bowing in worship over the head of his staff. ²²By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones.

²³By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. ²⁴By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. ²⁷By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible. ²⁸By faith

he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them.

²⁹By faith the people crossed the Red Sea as if on dry land, but the Egyptians, when they attempted to do the same, were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had given a friendly welcome to the spies.

³²And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets— ³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵Women received back their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. ³⁶Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword. They went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, mistreated— ³⁸of whom the world was not worthy—wandering about in deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.

³⁹And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.


¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

³Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.

The Noble Army of Martyrs Praise You

A Meditation on the Word of God | Luke 12:49-56

We could call it 'Martyr Sunday.' The Epistle reading from the Book of Hebrews gives us the **great cloud of witnesses**—all the many saints who have gone before us in death, who stand for us as examples of faithfulness to Jesus. The writer to the Hebrews calls the saints 'witnesses'. And then he goes on to describe how they, in many and various ways, suffered unimaginably for the Lord they love.

The martyrs went to their deaths with the confession of Jesus on their lips. We need the example of the holy martyrs to show how the Lord was with them in their trials, how he lent them the strength needed to face their sufferings, and how they boldly and fearlessly confessed Jesus at the price of their own blood. We want to follow their example of fearless obedience. The martyrs lived by faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus. That faith gave them courage to be faithful to the Lord who bought them, even unto death. They are witnesses to us.


Very much unlike the martyrs are the 'false prophets' Jeremiah speaks about in today's Old Testament reading. These false prophets do not preach the true Word of God but a 'false peace' to people who despise the word of the Lord. They say to scoffers, 'It shall go well with you,' and to everyone who stubbornly follows his own heart, 'No disaster shall come upon you.' The false prophets are telling people who stand under the judgment of God that there is no judgment for them. In Lutheran terms, they fail to preach the Law to sinners. They refuse to

warn the wicked from his wicked way. They do not preach God's Word because they want the approval of men and are afraid of the consequences of being faithful. So, there are the martyrs who give a true witness at the cost of their own lives. And there are the false prophets who failed to preach the true Word of God and suffer for it. We are to be like the martyrs, not the false prophets.

When Jesus says, 'I came not to bring peace' in today's Gospel, he is not referring to the <u>TRUE</u> peace which he most certainly came to bring between God and Man by his death on the cross. Truly and certainly, Jesus came to bring THAT peace to the world—the peace of sins forgiven in his blood—peace with our Father in heaven. Jesus also came to work a true peace between fellow believers through his Holy Spirit. The angels at his birth proclaimed, 'Peace on earth,' because indeed, Jesus came to bring us peace with God and peace with one another.

The peace Jesus is speaking of when he says, 'I came not to bring peace,' is *false* peace: the kind of false peace Jeremiah preached against: the peace that is preached to those who need to hear the Law, who need to be warned of the impending judgment of God. Jesus then goes on to show how his kingdom will actually not bring peace but division, as members of one household or family will be divided because of him. How many of us know of that division painfully and personally? You have people in your family whom you love who do not know the Lord Jesus

by faith. So, there is a division in your family. Jesus does not want you to proclaim false peace to them. He does not want you to tell your loved ones that all will go well with them. Jesus wants you to speak Law and Gospel. He wants you to tell your family members about God's coming judgment but also about God's grace. He does not want you to hide the truth of the coming judgment (hell) because sharing that hard truth will be uncomfortable to you. You may have to suffer for it. Are you willing? You should be willing. Jesus wants you to take a lesson from the cloud of witnesses, the martyrs. See how they suffered. See how they proclaimed Christ fearlessly in the face of death. Follow in their footsteps and warn, admonish, teach the ones you love even when it hurts. Maybe one day because of your witness you will see those you spoke the Word of God to on earth in heaven with you.
