The Oxenford and Coomera Community Youth Centre Inc (OCCYC) has continued to flourish, providing a welcoming and vibrant space for our community to gather, learn, and grow. Our association has ensured that the building is highly activated by the diverse and essential free community services we provide. It has become a vital hub where people of all ages can connect, learn, and thrive through the programs provided on-site.

The Northern Gold Coast Communities for Children (CfC) funded programs remain a cornerstone of our association's offerings at the Centre. These programs include Parent Education and Lifeskills workshops, Self Esteem and health & wellbeing sessions, Game of Life programs, and our playgroup hubs, which support thousands of families. Most importantly, our free counselling and psychological support services are deeply needed and highly valued in the community. These services provide crucial mental health support to individuals and families, making a profound impact on the well-being of those we serve.

We continue to deliver our Emergency Relief and Intake program, supporting families in need and vulnerable members of our community. Over the past year, we have seen a significant rise in demand for emergency relief and case management services. This client journey is an example of the interrelated pathways that we offer vulnerable community members.

The proceeds go to our emergency relief program ensuring we support the changing needs of our community. 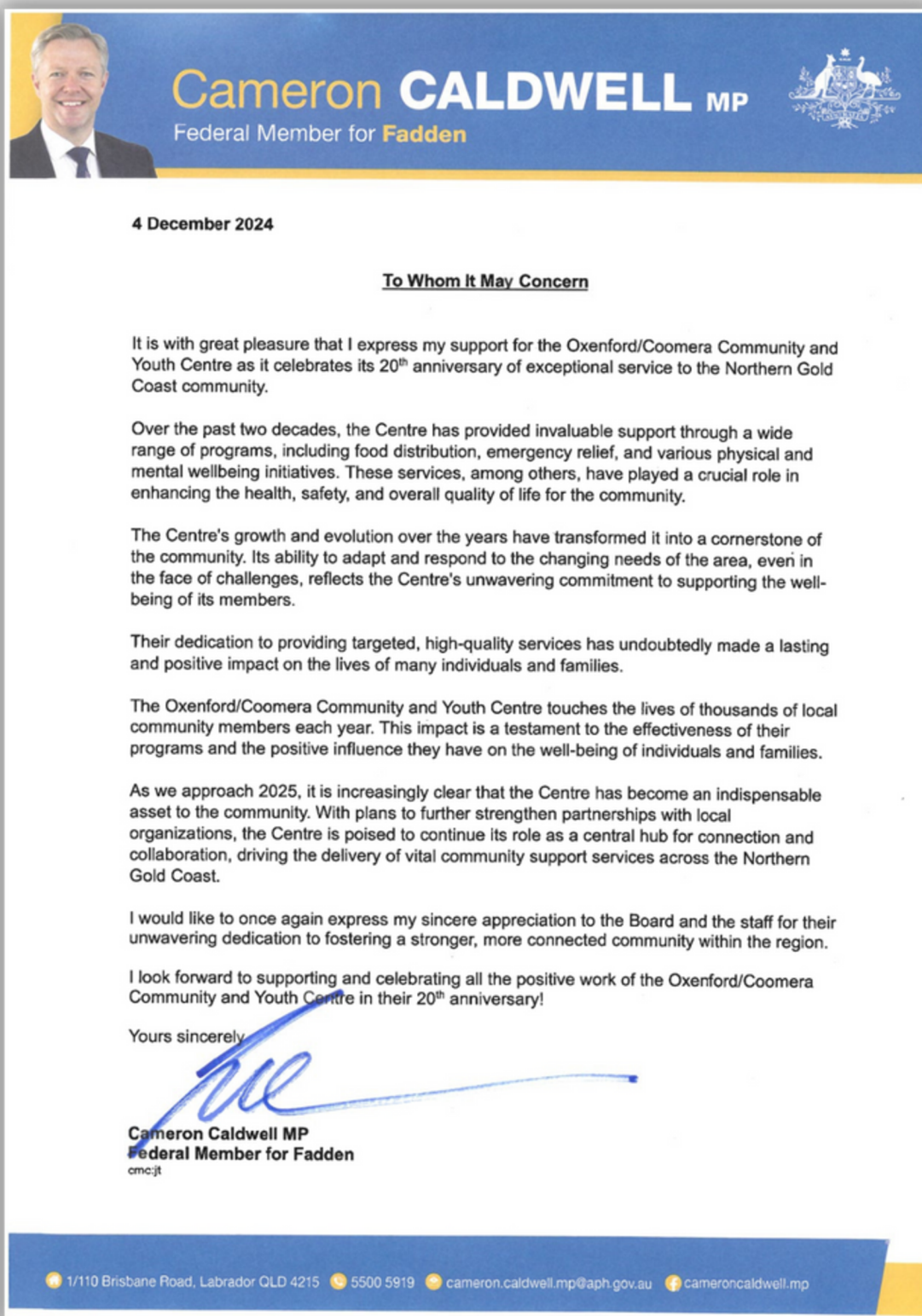

The Family Support and Counselling Service works with families with children aged 0-18 years in the Northern Gold Coast region.

Our team works collaboratively and in consultation with support agencies, schools, families and other professionals.

We offer:

- Emergency Relief and Food Box Program
- Family Support and Counselling services
- Case Management
- Group parenting and life skills programs
- Facilitated social gatherings
- Christmas hampers

We regularly follow up with participants in our life skills programs, and the feedback remains overwhelmingly positive. Participants frequently highlight the high quality of the programs and the dedication of our compassionate facilitators. Many parents have shared how these programs have had a ripple effect, positively impacting other areas of their lives and significantly boosting their confidence in parenting.

For fourteen years, the Second Step program has evolved to reflect the shifting priorities of our community. As we move forward, our focus remains on expanding its reach and refining its approach to ensure it provides meaningful, inclusive support for children's development. By staying responsive to the diverse needs of families, we aim to keep the program impactful and relevant for years to come.

## EARLY YEARS HUBS

The Integrated Early Years Hubs provide a 'soft entry' point for parents and young children, offering a welcoming space to engage in skill-building activities. These hubs include supported playgroups, Cook, Learn & Nutrition sessions, Move to Music, Read and Grow, and Health & Wellbeing workshops, as well as special Family Fun Days. Parents are also supported with a quarterly newsletter filled with actionable tips to foster stronger parent-child connections and enhance language development.

This year, the Early Years Hubs were proud to host events like the Child Protection Week Family Fun Day, National Simultaneous Storytime, and festive Easter and Christmas celebrations, continuing to bring families together in a meaningful way.

## PROGRAMS

### COMMUNITY CARE PROGRAM (EMERGENCY RELIEF)

Demand for our Emergency Relief program has remained high, with many vulnerable and at-risk families seeking food and financial assistance. With Bendigo Bank as the major sponsor, alongside the generous support of Communities for Children, Silverdale Realty, Energy Queensland, Rotary Club of Coomera River and fresh food deliveries from OzHarvest and the 12 Baskets outreach program, we continue to provide vital support to the community. The program supplies fresh and dry food boxes weekly, distributes food parcels, pays for allied health services, and provides food vouchers. This year we commenced an additional program of monthly large scale , soft entry food distribution events (Stock-Up Social)

In addition to these essential services, clients accessing Emergency Relief can also benefit from counselling services and case management support, including a robust referral service. This comprehensive approach ensures that families receive the support they need during challenging times.

# PROGRAMS



## PRESENTING ISSUES

"Being a single mum with 3 children at home and the cost of groceries can be hard and my rent going up for the third time being able to access free food is so much help"

"Single mum of 5 doing it abit hard atm, with bill's & Christmas coming up fast & still have to get kids gift's & 3 nights ago I had to rush my dog to the emergency vet & that costs was \$600 which was the money I have saved up for the last 6 month to do my kids Christmas shopping & food.. it just hasn't been my year."

"Married family of 5 still feeling the affects of the tomato last year at our home."

"3 kids. Cost of living is killing us."

"Homeless for 3 months. Cashless for 2 weeks"

"Im a single mum with 3 kids one is 22 16 and 15 struggling every week to try and put food in my cupboards and fridge any kind of help I appreciate so much"

"Became single mum recently and everything is so hard"

"Looking for work only just managing most of the bills but trying to save for a car for transport, food hampers are brilliant and will help manage better so I can save for car to get job for the long term solution. Thank u I really appreciate it."





## PROGRAMS

### FAMILY SUPPORT CASE STUDY

A 35 year old mother presented to therapy with relationship issues and struggling with parenting. Therapy supported her with these issues and the client was recommended to attend the Circle of Security parenting program at Community Centre to provide support and education regarding attachment with her child.

The client stated that “the Circle of Security Parenting was the most eye opening program I have attended in a long time. It has brought up the most important, key elements of parenting. I have a better understanding of myself as a parent and how I was parented and of the emotional needs of my child”

The client then suggested that her sister attend the next Circle of Security parenting program at Community Centre .

Her sister stated that “Circle of Security has helped me feel calmer and less overwhelmed by my triggers and “shark music”. I have noticed a profound change in my daughter with the tantrums she was having compared to now. I am able to remain calm(mostly) and be there with her in order to meet her needs. My daughter has changed so much and so have I but I know it is something that I will need to continue working with to grow as a person for myself and my daughter”.

Six months later their mother (grandmother to the children) attended the Circle of Security parenting program as she had seen such profound changes in the way her daughters were parenting and in their self-worth and boundaries.

One sister is now confident to return to her law practice. The other sister is pregnant with her second child and confident in her parenting abilities. The grandmother has a sound understanding of attachment and feels confident in supporting her daughters with their parenting.

This is generational change in this family system.

## House OF GOOD THINGS

- **Emergency Relief and Food Support:** With the backing of OzHarvest and 12 Baskets, we continue to distribute fresh and dry food boxes twice a week to families in need. Monthly Community Socials, featuring a free BBQ and takeaway food boxes, provide not only practical assistance but also opportunities for community connection and awareness of the Centre's programs.
- **Comprehensive Emergency Relief Services:** The Emergency Relief program continues to assist families across the Northern Gold Coast by providing food boxes, petrol and food vouchers, and funding for allied health services. This program also offers a robust referral system and complements our busy counselling and case management services.
- **Expanding Parenting and Life Skills Programs:** We successfully reintroduced the popular Circle of Security Parenting program, which has been well-received by families. Additionally, we launched new parent coaching sessions to help graduates of our parenting programs integrate their learnings into everyday life. These initiatives have strengthened parenting confidence and brought positive changes to families.
- **Early Years Hub Expansion:** Our Early Years Hub groups run from Monday to Friday, featuring bi-weekly gross motor skills programs that are highly valued by local families.
- **Community-Focused Partnerships:** Through free venue hire, we proudly support initiatives like Read and Grow facilitator training and Pop-Up Speech Clinics, which provide free developmental screenings for families. We also assist groups such as the Breast Cancer Group - Bosom Buddies, Neighbourhood Watch, and the Complex Needs Assessment Panel (CNAP), ensuring these vital services remain accessible.
- **Fitness and Wellbeing Programs:** In collaboration with the City of Gold Coast's Active & Healthy program and supported by CfC funding, we continue to deliver affordable, high-quality fitness classes, fostering both physical health and social connection.
- **Ongoing Impact of Life Skills Programs:** Regular feedback from participants highlights the lasting impact of our life skills programs, with many parents noting improvements in other areas of their lives and enhanced confidence in parenting.
- **Strengthening Key Partnerships:** We continue to build relationships with schools, community service organisations, and early childhood education centres (ECECs) to enhance the reach and impact of our initiatives.



## PROJECTS

### CHRISTMAS STORM RECOVERY

In response to the devastating Christmas Day storms, we expanded our Emergency Relief Program with funding from the Gold Coast City Council to meet the increased community needs. Additional team members were brought on to provide timely support, and we organised large-scale food distribution days, easing the financial burden for families recovering from the disaster.

Beyond material aid, we prioritised mental health support through referrals and assistance, serving as a central hub for connecting individuals with the resources they needed to rebuild their lives. We also collaborated with Rotary District 9640 to distribute funds to community members in need.

In partnership with Varsity Lakes Community Centre, Palm Beach Over 80s Centre, the City of Gold Coast, and the Queensland Government, we created an Emergency Cookbook featuring community-sourced recipes for use during power outages. Thousands of copies were distributed, offering practical solutions while fostering resilience and community connection.

## COMMUNITY COFFEE SHOP



The Community Cafe is back in full swing, and we're excited to announce that we are building a diverse volunteer team that spans multiple organisations, not just one. This collaboration brings together individuals from various backgrounds, fostering a stronger sense of community and shared purpose. The cafe continues to serve as a vital hub for connection and fundraising, supporting our Emergency Relief Program while providing a welcoming space for people to come together and contribute meaningfully.

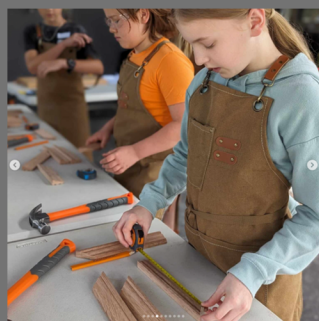




## PROJECTS

### HOMESCHOOL HUB FOR THE GOLD COAST

This year, we have deepened our connection with homeschool families and networks across the Gold Coast. Following the success of our Homeschool HUB initiative, we are now pursuing funding to create a dedicated hub for the homeschool community. Designed around principles like empathy, communication, emotional management, and problem-solving, this hub will serve as both a resource centre and a dynamic space for connection, collaboration, and support.



### AUSTRALIA DAY EVENT



Once again, our Australia Day event, funded by the Australia Day Council, was a huge success. Embracing the theme "Reflect, Respect, Celebrate," the day offered family-friendly activities that entertained and celebrated Australia's rich cultural diversity. Performances, interactive workshops, and culinary experiences highlighted traditions from various cultural groups, creating a vibrant and inclusive atmosphere. Youth organisations played a key role in fostering understanding and respect, while the event provided a space for meaningful connections, shared stories, and new friendships. This year's celebration perfectly captured the spirit of Australia Day, uniting the community through diversity and shared values.



## PROJECTS

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT THROUGH NEW STRATEGIES

Over the Christmas break, we implemented a new software platform that has transformed how we manage programs, clients, and contacts. For the first time, the Centre now has a centralised database, improving communication and ensuring attendees of one program are informed about others.

The platform includes an online learning portal, hosting parenting program modules with automated features like progress tracking, quizzes, and certificates. This convenient format has proven popular, with over 1,000 participants registering in our online programs in six months. Additionally, our internal network of participants has grown by 78%, reflecting better engagement and increased awareness of our full range of services.

The system streamlined processes, from venue hire to counselling, now ensuring faster outcomes and improved efficiency in intake processes.

Combined with our redoubled promotion strategies, this system upgrade has been a game-changer, significantly boosting program participation and strengthening connections within the community.

## FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

### VENUE HIRE

The OCCYC remains committed to offering versatile venue hire opportunities for local community groups and businesses. We prioritise collaboration with our venue hirers, working together to support their initiatives and strengthen their impact within the community. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all our hall hirers for their continued support and partnership.

The Centre serves as a hub for a diverse range of activities, hosting local fitness groups, dance academies offering styles like contemporary, tap, ballet, Irish, and circus skills, as well as performance art groups and various martial arts programs.

Venue hire is a vital component of the Centre's operations, helping to offset the rising costs of building maintenance while enabling us to work closely with other community organisations. Through free venue hire, we proudly support programs and projects that deliver significant benefits to the wider community.

- **Busom Buddy Cancer Support Group** - Provides support and information for people who have breast cancer, their families, carers and support network
- **Wesley Mission Australia, Complex Needs Assessment Panel (CNAP)** - Interagency, case planning support for children and young people with complex needs
- **Northern Gold Coast Rotaract** - Youth based charity using the Centre as their home and base of operations.
- **Oxenford Neighbourhood Watch** - Oxenford Neighbourhood Watch quarterly meetings to bring local residents together to build a safer community.
- **Youth Trivia Night for the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards** - Supporting the youth based team to raise funds for their annual youth leadership seminar.
- **Northern Gold Coast Rotary Book Fair Fundraiser** - Working with the Rotary Club of Coomera Valley and the Northern Gold Coast Rotaract Club to raise \$15,000 for community projects.

# QLD NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE SENSUS REPORT



## SECTOR IMPACT REPORT

The Queensland Neighbourhood Centre Sector Impact Census, organised by Neighbourhood Centres Queensland, evaluates the collective impact and value of neighbourhood centres across the state. This essential tool captures data on services and volunteer contributions, highlighting how centres bolster community well-being. Its findings support advocacy efforts by demonstrating the economic and social value these centres provide, thus influencing policy decisions and enhancing public awareness of their vital roles in community development.





# QLD NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE SENSUS REPORT

In 2024, The Meeting Place significantly enriched our community, providing an estimated \$3,394,218 in community value. It's important to clarify that this figure does not represent direct financial expenditures. Instead, it quantifies the output and impact of our center's activities in monetary terms. This approach helps illustrate the substantial value of our services and volunteer contributions to the community, including enhanced social connections, emergency relief, and other vital services, despite not receiving Queensland Government Neighbourhood Centre funding. This calculation estimates the equivalent economic value our center generates, highlighting our significant role in supporting and enhancing community life.

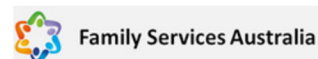
