We are proud of our Mary's Place® participants' achievements and very grateful for the support from our donors and well-wishers.

Mary's Place® empowers individuals by fostering gratitude, reflection, awareness, connection, and self-empowerment, helping them thrive, and remain in their new careers.

Key achievements and impact

& well being events in-person and online delivered.

48 participants have joined our live well being events.



We submitted our first grant application to the **Amin Abdullah RCN Foundation** in October 2023.

We were unsuccessful for this competitive award, but received very encouraging feedback about our work and aspirations.



Mary's Place® delivered a well received session in the Compassion Cafe at **Nursing Live**, in November 2023, a national event which attracts over 3,000 delegates.

Julie qualified as a **Sound Healing Practitioner** to enable Mary's Place® to include sound healing in future events.





Key achievements and impact (continued)

Hosted a **Fundraising Ball** in March 2024 in West Lancashire. Tickets sold out before we started any formal advertising and the response exceeded expectations, both in the income generated and feedback during and afterwards.



We worked with **Claire House Children's Hospice** to deliver a staff development day. We are looking forward to continuing this strand of our work with Claire House and other providers.

Challenges and learnings



We spectacularly underestimated the generosity of those attending the Ball.

We learned more about managing money as a CIC.

We learned a B2C approach where we work directly with newly qualified staff is powerful, but perhaps not the most efficient route to reach many people.



We are therefore developing a model to work with NHS Trusts and will share more news on that, soon.



Unexpected outcomes from this first year as a CIC...







Steven Bartlett, BBC Dragon and Entrepreneur was thrilled to hear about our work and wrote a lovely note in a card to inspire all Mary's Place® members. We used this as an opportunity for an April Fool's prank and created quite a stir on social media! What we learned from this experience was the power of engaging a high profile celebrity. Our social media referring to Steven Bartlett gained the most attention, to date. Support from those with influence is important to help us reach and help more newly qualified staff.



As Mary's Place® started to gain momentum, we were advised to **trademark the name**. This was surprisingly easy (in the UK). It cost £170 and took a couple of months. The name Mary's Place® is important. Obviously it is a huge link with Mary-Lou, but also our other inspiration...

Bruce Springsteen and the E Street Band. Bruce has a song called Mary's Place (based on a Sam Cooke song of the same name). Bruce and the band played it at Mary-Lou's first ever concert (aged 6) and at the time she said "mum, they are playing my song!". The thoughts of receiving a cease and desist letter regarding our use of the name Mary's Place® made the decision to trademark an easy one for our Directors!

In late September, Bruce released 5 UK tour dates for 2025, solely in the North West: Manchester and Liverpool. It's like he knows they need to be here to support Mary's Place®! Interestingly fellow band member Steve van Zandt, has an organisation 'Teach Rock' which supports teachers... seems timely to get the Mary's Place® teachers project on the go. Synchronicity?



Future Plans



Increase our online presence to grow reach; we were reluctant to consider Facebook initially as we needed to be sure that's where the potential participants would hang out - experience and research has shown us that it is, indeed, the platform of choice. Next six months: grow the audience and add further content.



Develop **our offer for teachers** in response to suggestions and our own observations: "8.8% of the profession left in 2022/23 for reasons other than retirement"
