

PRE-PROCEDURE ADVICE FOR LIPS

- Please avoid the following for at least 48 hours prior to your appointment:
- Although a numbing cream and gel is used during the procedure, slight sensitivity/discomfort may still be felt. Delicate or sensitive skin may be red and/or swollen after the procedure.
- For the best results, clients will be required to return for at least one re-touch appointment. This will take place anywhere between 4-6 weeks after the initial procedure.
- Cosmetic Lip Tattooing (Lip Blush/Aquarelle Lip) procedures may require multiple treatment sessions.
 - Alcohol
 - Caffeine
 - Energy Drinks
 - Aspirin, Ibuprofen, Niacin
 - Vitamin E
 - Exfoliating and/or Microdermabrasion Facial Scrubs
- Please discontinue the use of Omega3/Fish Oil at least one week prior to your cosmetic tattoo session.
- Do not tan or have intense sun exposure 3 days prior to your cosmetic tattoo session.

Important Lip Blush/Aquarelle Lip Information for Clients:

- Lip Blush tattoo is used to enhance the natural lip shape, symmetry, and color.
- A customized pigment is applied to add definition to your lips and conceal imperfections based on your skin tone and personal preference.
- Your lips will look like lipstick on the first day, and soften as they heal to become a very subtle, natural-looking lip tint.
- Apply a little gloss or balm and your lips look beautiful 24-7! If you are prone to cold sores, lip tattooing can cause outbreaks.
- We ask that our clients take their prescribed anti-viral medication a few days prior to their appointment and after the procedure to prevent any cold sores. If you have an outbreak or any other type of scratch/acne we ask that you reschedule your appointment.
- There may be moderate swelling, redness and bruising for the first 3 days. If you experience swelling, use an ice pack for no more than 15 minutes at a time to reduce swelling.
- During the initial healing period, there should be minimal scabbing or flaking of the skin. If there is some scabbing or flaking, do not pick, and allow the scab or dry skin to come off on its own. This usually takes place within the first 3 days.

- Expect the color to lighten up to 50-70% once the healing process is complete. Color may appear uneven at different stages of healing.
- Be patient. This is a process that does not yield immediate results. Permanent makeup ink is not the same as body art ink, and by design, it does not last as long as body art ink.
- Permanent Makeup does fade and is expected to last 2 to 5 years before requiring a touch-up. Maintenance touch-ups are suggested for best results. It can take 2 sessions prior to achieving the level of saturation you may desire.
- Additional touch-ups are not included in the cost of the initial Lip Blush procedure.

Topical Anesthetic Advice

Allergic Reaction:

Topical Anesthetic Advice

This can occur from any anesthetics used during the procedure. If you do suffer from an allergic reaction, you should contact your doctor immediately. Allergic reaction response may show through as redness, swelling, rash, blistering, dryness or any other symptoms associated with an allergic reaction.

Numbness:

We cannot accept responsibility if the area to be treated does not respond to the numbing cream. Each individual is different according to skin types. Some clients report the area to be completely numb, while others may experience some discomfort.

Procedure:

For all services, numbing cream and gel is used. The products are formulated to be perfectly safe and can be purchased over the counter from any pharmacy or store. The anesthetic is placed over the treatment area for 20-25 minutes and is carefully removed prior to treatment. As a result of the treatment, combined with the use of the anesthetics, you can expect to experience some redness and/or swelling that may last for 1-4 days.

You should always follow your aftercare for the best results.
