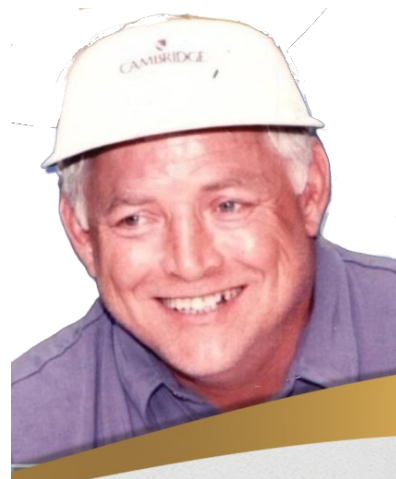

Linwood Jerald began his athletic administration career in the Guilford County School System where he served as the Associate Athletic Director at Greensboro Smith for two years and at Greensboro Grimsley for one year before becoming the Athletic Director at T.W. Andrews High School on two separate occasions. In between his two stints at Andrews, Jerald worked as the Athletic Director at Atkins High School in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County School System from 2008—2013. In 2014 Linwood Jerald was hired as the Athletic Director at his high school alma mater, Parkland Magnet High School, where he served in that role until his retirement in 2023. Linwood Jerald spent more than 50 years in coaching and athletic administration combined.

Northwest NC team 1981 - Gained fame as a wide receiver when his 11 TD receptions in the last six games of the year pushed North into the playoffs, but with opposing defenses concentrating on him, his biggest contributions were on defense. Contributed by returning kicks and by his play on offense often serving as a decoy for North's other offensive weapons. 472 yards on 30 catches, scored 4 touchdowns.

Among 4 North Forsyth players selected All-Conference.

1981- All-Forsyth Team Super 25 County Player of the Year

1982 – Selected to play for the West team in the Annual East West All Star football game.

His junior season he caught 10 touchdown passes on 21 Receptions for 493 yards and another touchdown on a rush. Senior year 30 catches for 472 yards, scoring twice on pass receptions and once rushing on a reverse. A standout on defensive at safety, intercepting a dozen passes.

Ed Weiss spent 24 years of his 31 year education career at Mount Tabor High School. Weiss began his official teaching career with Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools in 1993 as a physical education/health teacher and coach at Paisley Middle School. Before Weiss got into administration he coached soccer and baseball. After receiving his master's degree in school administration his first principal assignment was at Wiley Middle School, five years later he was named the principal at Mount Tabor High School. Weiss choose education as a career path because he had some incredible role models and coaches in high school that he wanted to be like. "There was no doubt I wanted to be a teacher and a coach, Weiss said." As the principal at Mount Tabor High, he strived to do everything in his power to give his students the same gifts he received from his parents, teachers and coaches. The one thing he wanted to try to teach kids was to learn how to assert themselves.

A statement from Assistant Principal Chris Applegate sums up Weiss's value as a leader. "He loves every part of his job as principal. He is very involved in all aspects of the school. He has an energy and a drive that fuels his passion for the school. People see it. From staff, to students, to parents to the community, they all can agree that Ed gives his all to Mount Tabor High School and inspires those around him to have the same energy and pride for the school."
