

# Breakout Study Session

Theme: Introduction: The Names That God Calls You

## Key Scripture

Isaiah 43:1 – “Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine.”

## Discussion

What are some names—good or bad—that people have called you in your life?

How do those words compare to the names God calls you?

## Session 1 – Hearing God’s Voice Over the World’s

Questions:

1. Why do negative words from others tend to stick with us longer than God’s truth?

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2. What difference does it make when you believe what God says about you instead of what the world says?

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3. What does it mean to you personally when God says, “You are Mine”?

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**Challenge:**

Write down three negative names or labels you've believed about yourself. Now, find three scriptures that reveal what God really calls you instead (for example: chosen, loved, redeemed).

## **Session 2 – God Speaks Life, Not Labels**

Scripture: Proverbs 18:21 – “Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.”

Questions:

1. What harmful labels has the enemy used to make you doubt your worth?

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2. How can you begin speaking God's truth over yourself daily?

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3. Who in your life needs to hear the life-giving names that God speaks over them?

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### **Challenge:**

Each morning this week, declare aloud one name that God calls you—such as “I am chosen,” “I am forgiven,” or “I am loved.” Let His truth drown out every lie.

## **Session 3 – Living Out Your God-Given Identity**

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:17 – “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.”

Questions:

1. What changes when you start to live like the person God says you are?

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2. How can your renewed identity impact others in your family, church, or community?

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3. What can you do this week to reflect your new name in Christ through your words and actions?

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**Challenge:**

Ask God, “Who do You say I am?” and write down what He speaks to your heart. Keep that truth somewhere you’ll see it every day.

## **Closing Thought**

Names have power. But when you let God speak your name, that power brings life. Remember—what God calls you is stronger than what the world has ever said about you.
