


LOVE YOUR SPOUSE AS THEY WISH TO BE LOVED


THE FIVE LOVE LANGUAGES

- Words of affirmation
- Quality time
- Receiving gifts
- Acts of service
- Physical touch

LOVE TANK - We each have a "love tank" that needs to be filled.

PRIMARY LOVE LANGUAGE

– one's preference for how to give and receive love.



DIALECTS – variations on the love language.

SECONDARY LOVE LANGUAGE – other love languages you value.

LOVE

• Love can exist only where there is the **freedom to choose**. It cannot be **coerced**. It does not demand, it **requests**.

• Allowing oneself to be used or **manipulated** by another is not an act of love. It is, in fact, an act of treason".

 Some one who is your doormat "can be your servant but not your lover."

THE LOVE LANGUAGE

 "What makes one person feel loved emotionally is not always the thing that makes another person feel loved emotionally".

• "Ignoring our partner's love language is like ignoring the needs of a garden".

THE LOVE TANK

• We each have a "love tank" that needs to be filled.

- The need to feel loved is an essential part of our human development.
- When our spouse's emotional **love tank is full** they feel secure in our love... the world looks bright and they can then move out to reach their highest potential.

FALLING IN LOVE

- The "in-love" euphoric experience (infatuation) typically lasts about two years and is often worn away by routine and resentment.
- The **character traits** that first attracted us to our partner can become annoying.
- When the euphoria of the "in-love" experience wears off the hard work of "real love" must occur. "This kind of love is emotional in nature but not obsessional. It is a love that unites reason and emotion. It involves an act of the will and requires disciple, and it recognizes the need for personal growth"... ""True love" cannot begin until the "in-love" experience has run its course."

WORDS OF AFFIRMATION

- Words of affirmation build up the other person.
- Encouraging words inspire courage.
- Kind words communicate love.
- Humble words "Love makes requests, not demands."
- "A soft answer turns away anger" Proverbs 15:1
- "Forgiveness is the way of love"...only when we "choose to forgive can intimacy be restored".

QUALITY TIME

- We make time for what (and who) we love. Scheduling quality time together is an essential ingredient to a healthy marriage.
- Quality time gives someone your undivided attention... it requires focussed attention amid competing distractions.
- "Quality conversation is empathetic dialogue where two individuals are sharing their experiences, thoughts, feelings and desires in a friendly, uninterrupted context."

[&]quot;There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens" – Ecclesiastes 3:1

QUALITY TIME

- Learning to talk quality conversation requires not only empathetic listening but also self-revelation".
- It means doing something with the other person that they enjoy and doing it whole heartedly.
- Quality activities do not require that you enjoy the activity equally... you take turns loving each other by doing what the other enjoys.

RECEIVING GIFTS

- Giving gifts is not about materialism, they are a visual symbol and tangible reminder of love.
- Gifts need not be expensive, nor must they be given weekly"... for some individuals, the worth of a gift has more to do with the love with which it is given than it's monetary value.
- The gift of self "being there when your spouse needs you speaks loudly to the one whose primary love language is receiving gifts".

[&]quot;A gift opens doors for the one who gives it and brings him into the presence of great people." – Proverbs 18:16

ACTS OF SERVICE

- Acts of Service is doing things you know your spouse would like you to do. You seek to please by serving.
- Acts of Service, "if done with a positive spirit... are indeed expressions of love".
- "What we do for each other **before marriage** is no indication of what we will do after marriage".

PHYSICAL TOUCH

- "Physical touch can **make or break** a relationship. It can communicate hate or love".
- "Do not make the mistake of believing that the touch that brings pleasure to you will also bring pleasure to her".
- Crises provide a unique opportunity for expressing love... tender touch will be remembered...failure to touch may never be forgotten."




RANDOM ACTS
