COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of this course is to examine Tupac Shakur's life and legacy by tracing back the history of Hip Hop. In order to do this, we must examine African American history. Although this history is rich and expands much farther back than European contact, for the purposes of this class we will start with the African American experience in America and continually make connections on how this history is relevant to the hip hop lifestyle today. We will examine genres within hip hop, the difference between mainstream and underground, and who key players in the game are. Finally, we will examine the art of rap by discussing what bars are, how to count them, and what exactly makes a good rap. We will do close readings of lyrics to observe both the techniques used in crafting them as well as the meaning behind them. Students will take the combination of these activities to develop skills that will allow them to find what flow is right for them, and craft a 2 verse rap song.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Gain basic factual knowledge about Tupac Shakur, the culture of hip hop, and the Bay Area.
- Develop critical thinking skills through connecting concepts from the class to the real world
- Develop and practice leadership and decision making skills through group work
- Know the basic mechanics of rap (structure, bars, content, rhyme scheme)
- Gain greater self awareness and expression
