# **Educator Expenses**

Teachers and educators can deduct up to \$300 for out-of-pocket expenses on classroom supplies.

#### Student Loan Interest

If you're paying off student loans, you might be eligible for a deduction of up to \$2,500 on the interest paid.

#### **Charitable Contributions**

Donations to qualified charities can be deducted when itemizing deductions, so keep track of your contributions throughout the year.

#### **State Sales Tax**

If you live in a state without income tax, you may be able to deduct sales tax instead when itemizing deductions.

#### **Medical Expenses**

Certain medical expenses, including healthcare premiums and long-term care expenses, may be deductible if they exceed a certain percentage of your income when itemizing deductions...

#### **Home Office Deductions**

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If you work from home, you may qualify for a deduction based on the square footage of your home office.

### **Energy-Efficient Home Improvements**

Installing energy-efficient windows, doors, solar panels or insulation might make you eligible for tax credits.

#### Child and Dependent Care Credit

If you pay for child care or care for a dependent, you may qualify for a credit that helps offset those costs.

## **Job Search Expenses**

If you're searching for a job, certain expenses like resume printing or travel for interviews may be deductible.

# **Self-Employment Expenses**

If you're self-employed, you can deduct business-related expenses such as office supplies, advertising, and travel.
