

Difficulty: Easy Trail length: **5.5 km** Estimated time: **2 hours** 

The route (approximately 5.5 km) starts near the small port of Framura, just steps from the train station where bicycles can be rented - and ends on the seafront of Levanto, after passing through the charming fishing village of Bonassola.

The path offers stunning views of the typical Ligurian coastline and the opportunity to reach some hidden beaches nestled among the rocks.

Difficulty: Easy Trail length: **5 km** Estimated time: 1 hr 10 min

This is not a trekking route, as it mostly follows a paved road, but it's highly recommended — it's one of the most beautiful walks in the Tigullio area, offering spectacular views along the way.

You can also start the walk after Santa Margherita, parking your car near the Covo di Nord Est.

Difficulty: Moderate Trail length: **4.5 km** Estimated time: **1 hr 45 min** 

Starting from Portofino, you can reach one of the most charming spots in Liguria: the Abbey of San Fruttuoso.

The suggested itinerary is a beautiful nature trail that, without too much effort, allows you to enjoy breathtaking views and reach this enchanting place on foot.

Camogli - S. Fruttuoso Difficulty: Difficult Trail length: **6.5 km** Estimated time: **3.5 hours** 

This is a spectacular route, among the most beautiful and iconic in the entire Eastern Ligurian Riviera. It crosses the southern slopes of the Portofino Promontory, sheer above the sea, passing through the Cala dell'Oro valley and climbing over the steep pass of Costa del Termine. Cala dell'Oro is the wildest corner of the promontory: towering conglomerate ridges, partly covered by Mediterranean scrub, plunge directly into the sea with impressive cliffs.

Portofino Center - Portofino Lighthouse Difficulty: Easy Trail length: 1.3 km

Estimated time: **25 min** 

This walk leads to the Portofino Lighthouse, one of the most beautiful spots in all of Liguria. It follows a comfortable paved path - with some sections of steps - and takes about 25-30 minutes at a regular pace. It's ideal both for those looking for a relaxing stroll and for nature lovers who enjoy discovering stunning views.
