**Core Purpose** - NEF provides education opportunities and programs to benefit and promote the construction industry, "*Educating the construction industry today...and tomorrow*"

Adult certification programs are available to anyone, not just NAWIC members. Programs include:

- · Construction Bookkeeping Technician
- Construction Industry Technician (CIT)
- · Estimating and Scheduling Practitioner
- Construction Document Technician (CDT) (ESP)
- Now you know what those initials behind some of our names mean!
- Construction Industry Specialist (CIS)

All NEF certification programs are certified by the American Council for Construction Education Professional Development Certification Program.

K-12 & College programs are perfect for introducing children and youth to the construction industry. Programs include:

Block Kids National Competition (K-6<sup>th</sup> Grade) – Block Kids can be sponsored by a NAWIC Chapters or individual sponsor. Students create something construction related without adult help and using approved materials.

Create-Design-Build (8<sup>th</sup> Grade – 12<sup>th</sup> Grade) – Create-Design-Build is a construction project for group learning. Students are exposed to construction trades including engineering, design, and architecture. In addition, the program improves and reinforces skills including math, English, leadership, teamwork budgeting, time management, and research.

Design Drafting National Competition (High School & College Undergrads) – The Design Drafting competition provides recognition to students for creative design, successful problem solving and craftsmanship in preparing architectural drawings. Entries are evaluated for detail, accuracy and originality of work. Mentoring programs between students and educators are encouraged. The competition can be sponsored by a NAWIC chapter, school or individual. A "Design Problem" is designed by a licensed Architect or Engineer and is generic enough to meet the needs of all areas of the US and our international affiliates. 

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
