

South Central Region Fall Conference

South Central Region Fall Conference October 4-5, 2024; Tulsa, OK Lori Donnell

Friday was full of education sessions and fellowship. I started out the day with Empowered Women presented by Karen Keith, Tulsa County Commissioner and Mayoral Candidate. Empowered Women be the best they can be for each other. Empowered women persist, give back and create change. The bulk of the presentation was an overview of all the building happening in the Tulsa area. They are booming!

Next, I attended a session on Ageism in the Workplace. There are currently five generations in the workplace. This can create tension and misunderstandings between the generations. The key is to understand the value each generation has to offer. As a Boomer, I have different values and skills from the younger generations. We must develop multi-directional support to utilize each generation's (and individual's) strengths. This includes formal and informal sharing, two-way mentorship and identifying subject matter experts. Another section of the presentation covered developing social standards of behavior, including:

- Shared values
 - Acknowledge bias Am I limiting myself or others?
 - o Avoid stereotypes & assumptions Am I being unfair because of age?
 - o Challenge limiting beliefs & attitudes- Avoid using limiting language (lazy generation; Ok, boomer; etc.)
- Communication norms
 - o Establish preferred communication pathways for the team (phone, text, instant messaging)
 - Discuss boundaries and preferences outside of work hours
- Physical norms
 - Discuss boundaries touching, hugs, handshake
 - Discuss boundaries & preferences with working late and weekends

After lunch, I attended the Strength Finders Workshop. I had never done any type of assessment before and was interested to find out what my top 5 strengths meant and how to use them the most effectively. Our strengths work together and blend. Also, strengths cannot be learned, or acquired, they are just who you are naturally. The top 5 strengths account for 70% of how we respond (thoughts, feelings and behaviors). In any situation or goal, we can identify which strengths we need to use and tune them for greater success. We can also combine our strengths with the strengths of others on the team to make collaborations more effective. There was a lot more to this session, but too much to write. I plan to upgrade to my top 24 strengths and gain even more insight on how I can use them to be more effective in my future endeavors.

Saturday morning started off with some announcements and awards presentations during breakfast. After the Call to Order, we proceeded with our standard order with the National Anthem presented by a girl's accapella choir, pledges, inspiration, recognitions, registration report and adoption of rules and agenda. This was followed by reports from the president, national board, and then our keynote speaker. Leslie Reyes, from the Houston chapter and an engineer with Zachry, talked about her journey and struggles to Have It All. It was interesting to hear her struggles and how she finally came to realize no one has IT all, but she found HER all. This was the focus of a workshop at the end of the day where those who stayed did an exercise to try to figure our own All and where we are willing and unwilling to compromise to have it

After lunch, we heard from a couple of committee chairs and the region fund report. We also approved the region budget and adopted the region SOX policies. Our last order of business was the invitation to the Tri-Region Forum 2025 in Atlanta and Annual Conference 2025 in Boston. Both Greater Little Rock and Dallas/Fort Worth put in bids for Forum 2026. It was disappointing, but DFW only lost the bid by one vote! The session closed out with raffle drawings of which the Fort Worth ladies ruled. Jamie Greenway won the Region Fund raffle and Raina Webb won the NEF raffle. The meeting was adjourned and we held the Having It All workshop.

The Margaretville Farewell to Fall Conference party was the perfect ending to the conference.



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
