Last month, our Canadian members celebrated Thanksgiving Day. This month, our American members will celebrate their Thanksgiving. At Thanksgiving, we traditionally offer words about the people and circumstances for which we are grateful and thankful. Perhaps we should speak about those we want to thank.

Toastmasters is a volunteer organization. We don't pay members so recognition or a big "thank you" is the reward we can offer. Recognizing someone is a way of saying "thank you" to that member for their

contribution to the club, to a committee, or to their community.

Does your club have a culture of recognition? Do you recognize members when they complete a level in Pathways? Do you recognize them when they achieve something outside of your club? Building a culture of recognition is an important step in creating quality meetings.

What's the value of a "thank you"? Would you imagine that it might be worth as much as \$25,000? Do you think that saying thank you is not so important? A friend of mine does fundraising for a not-for-profit organization. She calls donors to thank them for their donation. One donor said, "It was only \$25.00." My friend said, "You've been donating \$25.00 every year for 10 years. If everyone in the province donated that amount, we'd have the funds we need to provide our services." The donor then said she wanted to make another donation. That simple thank you didn't just get the organization another \$25. It got them \$25,000!!

You are highly unlikely to get \$25,000 for your club by saying thank you. It will, however, get you more committed and enthusiastic members. Your \$25,000 "thank you" will create a valuable opportunity for your club and your members to achieve success.



# **ROLES, ROLES, AND MORE ROLES**

### Did You Know?

Taking roles on the agenda is an important part of your Toastmasters Journey. In the Toastmaster's Promise, one of the points is, "I promise to prepare for and fulfill meeting assignments". Not only did you make a promise, taking roles on the agenda is also going to help you improve your skills.

As you move through the different levels, some projects require you to take on a role on the agenda such as Toastmaster or Speech Evaluator. For example, in the "Evaluation and Feedback" project, in Level 1 of every path, members must serve as a speech evaluator. Did you know that to move into Level 4, you must complete Level 3 but also take on four different roles on the agenda?

The roles you need to complete before moving into Level 4 include:

- Toastmaster
- Speech Evaluator
- General Evaluator
- Table Topics Master

When you complete one of these roles, you can update your meeting roles on your Basecamp profile page, including the date you performed the role. Your club's Vice President of Education (VPE) then must verify that you fulfilled the four meeting roles required to successfully complete Level 3.

Please take the time to update your Basecamp profile and plan to complete these 4 roles on the agenda so that when you have completed your speeches and want to submit your Level 3 completion, your VPE can easily approve because you have met all the requirements!





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# **GUEST PACKAGES**

Have you ever walked into a room where everyone else seems to know what is going on except you? I suspect that is how some guests may feel attending their first Toastmasters meeting. Do you remember the feeling walking into your first meeting? Now ask

yourself..." What if you had some information prior to the meeting?" Information that told you what to expect, what the roles are, or just to know you didn't have to share if you didn't want to. Guest packages may be your answer!

Guest packages can be provided through email to potential members prior to coming to the meeting. Don't forget to have packages ready for those who just "show up" if you are holding an in-person or hybrid meeting. When you are considering the materials for your package, remember the basics and try not to overwhelm the individual by providing them too much. Explain the roles that are part of your club as well as some of the benefits they may receive as a member. You also may want to include the Toastmasters meeting video as opposed to trying to provide an explanation.

No matter what you include in your guest package, • ensure it reflects your club's roles and is the right amount of information for a guest to absorb.





Are you looking for ideas to publicize your club? There are many different options available to you and your club. Here are some examples:

Virtually - Social media platforms: Facebook, Instagram or LinkedIn, Instagram; event management software: Eventbrite or Meetup.

**Locally** - Newspaper, radio, television, community bulletin board, coffee shops, churches, universities/ colleges, Chamber of Commerce, and more! You can also publicize at a local Newcomers to Canada office as newcomers may be looking for opportunities to improve their English or French speaking skills.

**Corporate clubs** – Publicizing posters on a bulletin board at your work is a great way to post some information about your club and its meetings. Ask to add material in new members' training package or to speak during new member orientation training. Showcase how the club can help members advance in their career.

Now that you have a list of places and platforms to publicize, what will you publicize? There are so many options:

- Host an Open House, invite a special guest to speak. It's a great way to invite the public to check out your club. Don't forget the District 45 <u>Incentive</u> for hosting an Open House!
- Special event/themed meetings (Halloween, Thanksgiving, etc.)
- Speech-a-thon or speech contests
- Club/member anniversary
- Member educational achievements
- Other member special achievements
- Officer election/installation
- Personal success stories from members on how Toastmasters helped them personally or professionally








# **AWARDS AND INCENTIVES**

There are several awards presented each year and the district also has various incentives during the year. Each month, some of these awards and incentives will be highlighted in each issue so that clubs and members know what there is to strive for.

### Awards

Terry Chinnery award – This award is presented in the spring to the club with the greatest percentage increase in members from the previous April. This award is automatically calculated by the district based on reports from Toastmasters International.

Ted Nichols award – This award is presented in the spring to the club with the greatest membership retention. The base membership on July 1 is the starting point and is compared to the membership after the April renewals with new members being considered. A club must have a minimum membership number of 20 to qualify. This award is automatically calculated by the district based on reports from Toastmasters International.

### Incentives

Youth Leadership Program - Be among the first twenty-five (25) Toastmasters to complete a Youth Leadership Program and you will be reimbursed for the cost of the YLP materials. This means that if you need sets of material for one YLP, you will be reimbursed for both.

*Club Coach Recognition* – To earn this incentive, you must serve as club coach for two (2) or more clubs and:


- Attend a meeting of the coached clubs at least once per quarter.
- Conduct a joint meeting with both/all clubs' executive committees once per month.
- Coaches must start in the club role no later than March 1<sup>st</sup> •

The incentive is \$25 US/\$30 CDN per club served to be used for the benefit of Toastmasters.

Level 1 award – To be eligible for this award, complete a first Level 1 in any path by December 31, 2021. You will be entered into a draw for a Travel Mug. There will be two (2) winners per month.

**Open House** – This is for boosting your Open House on Facebook. You need to set up the Open House as an event. Boost the event and then submit the bill for boosting. You will be reimbursed.


# **Around the District – Division C**


