WHY APPLY FOR A CLUB COACH?

Some of the first words that appear on Toastmasters International web site are, "Build A Better You." We have heard the words time and time again. Toastmasters is a learning journey in communication and leadership. How often do we forget those words? As members, we are all responsible for reminding ourselves of the importance of those words. We are all here to share what we have learned from each other. The Toastmasters program is all about "Build A Better

You" for all members.

Some of you may have had a Club Coach appointed to your club before with varying degrees of success. We often forget we are all in a learning journey; not everyone learns or grows at the same rate. Why not open your club to a Club Coach when you qualify for it?

Three reasons to apply for a club coach:

- 1. As individuals, we are all unique. Everything changes with time, therefore; individual experiences will be unique, not necessarily the same as previous results. A Club Coach could bring positive results.
- 2. The club coach has a vested interest in your club. He or she will arm themselves with the tools needed for successfully restructuring your club, while quite possibly, bringing in a new level of energy.
- 3. This is a great way to open your club to an individual from another club. That individual will step out of the (Club Comfort Zone) and use the skills of communication and leadership in a non-authoritative role and a safe learning environment.

Last month District 45 had fifty clubs that could have applied for a club coach. There are plenty of opportunities for a win-win situation in District 45. Let's all work together for our Toastmasters members and "Build A Better You."

WHY BE A CLUB COACH? WHAT IS IN IT FOR YOU?

I remember when I was approached to coach a club, I accepted the challenge without knowing what I was getting myself into. I believed it was about saving a sinking ship! I started by attending a few meetings then, with my good intentions I told the executive team what I believed where good solutions. My solutions were like offering everyone a life jacket. The reality was, I was the one who needed the life jacket. In this new role, I found myself in uncharted water. What worked in my previous leadership role did not work in this type of environment. I had to lead leaders without the element of control; this was an area for me that needed to be refined. This coaching experience gave me a chance to learn some of the skills needed to lead without the element of traditional authority.

Why be a club coach? What is in it for you? This journey will expose you to an environment where you can learn and master the skills of leading without the element of traditional authority. There is a big difference between leaders and followers; club coaching can teach you those differences. Toastmasters international has tools available for coaching. You can learn in a safe environment. You learn by doing and applying what you have learned along the journey.

Successful Coaches demonstrate their learning when they have helped clubs achieve Distinguished status or higher in the Distinguished Club Program. For recognition, club coaches receive credit in the education program and receive a club coach certificate of accomplishment. In District 45 we also publish the name of successful club coach in District 45 monthly Newsletter.

IN MEMORY OF WENDY HARDING, DTM

Past District Governor, Past International Director Wendy Harding, DTM died on August 24, 2020. Wendy joined Toastmasters in 1996 and never looked back. She helped organize many of the fall conferences held in Fredericton. Wendy served as District Governor for the 2009 – 2010 District year. Following her service as District Governor, Wendy ran successfully for International Director in 2011 at the convention in Las Vegas. She took some time out from her campaigning to get married in Paris (that would be the Paris hotel in Las Vegas). DTM Joe Grondin and DTM Heather Perkins stood for Wendy and Karl at their lovely wedding service. Everyone in attendance was a Toastmaster which is what Wendy wanted and why they got married at an International Convention.

Wendy always maintained a keen interest in Toastmasters and was unstinting in helping individuals and the District to achieve success. She served on Guidance Committees for High Performance Leadership projects and as an individual mentor to many members over the years. Wendy served on the International Leadership Committee and on the Discipline committee for Toastmasters International. This year, Wendy had early volunteered to serve as the District Leadership Committee Chair — a role she was greatly anticipating. One of her last comments to Heather Perkins the day before she died was to ask her to apologize to DD Jonathan Bohm for not being able to fill the role. That was




typical of Wendy's commitment and dedication to Toastmasters. In the words of PD45 Director Sandra Hachey (written before Wendy's death) "This world is going to be less of a kind and loving place when she leaves us."

Wendy was in the hospital for the six weeks prior to her death and knew that she was unlikely to recover. Wendy, again in typical Wendy fashion, took the time to put things in order. She accomplished that task and was able to see the people she wanted to see. With her husband Karl, and some other family members by her side, Wendy said her goodbyes, closed her eyes and stopped breathing. Wendy was a dedicated Toastmaster and a true friend. Wendy's death leaves a hole in the Toastmasters organization and in the hearts of everyone who knew her. Our hearts go out to her husband, Karl Stewart. Wendy, you will be missed. We love you.

If you had to choose ready or willing for the members in your club which would you pick?

- Ready... because of the commitment and preparation it takes to craft a speech?
- Willing... because members will be more likely to speak or cover a role?

There are deeper questions:

- 1. Why do members wait until the last minute to commit to roles?
- 2. Why the resistance to setting and tracking goals?
- 3. Why do members keep putting off speeches?

The answers may be found in the gym. A visit to the gym is not a performance. It is a place to do some reps, stretch and build endurance. Afterwards it feels good. People get stronger the more they go. The gym is all about preparation to feel better in the other parts of life.

Some members may resist speaking because it feels like a performance. Speeches never seem ready for the glare of evaluation. What if the Toastmasters club experience was more like the gym? What if roles and speeches were simply assigned at the end of each meeting. A third speaker slot is left open. Everyone shows up, works out and does their best. Expectations are set from the moment a new member joins that regular attendance, meeting roles and speeches are part of membership.

This will prepare members for the other parts of their life. Preparation for the presentations, social occasions and community involvement that motivated them to join Toastmasters.

Six-years ago our Area Governor, Cali Crowley, visited Kennebec Valley Toastmasters and challenged us to Sign up... Show Up...Step Up. A battle cry that rings true to this day.

"Having an online advanced club provides an opportunity for all Toastmasters, especially those in rural areas who otherwise would not have the opportunity to participate in an Advanced club," she said.

Sherry, a Distinguished Toastmaster, is also a charter member of Provincially Speaking and joined Toastmasters in 2015. During the COVID-19 quarantine, she took advantage of clubs going digital and spent time visiting clubs within and outside the District. Interacting with new people gave her the inspiration for the new club.

"I thought of this after visiting several online clubs around District 45," she said. "I realized that I was getting very comfortable with our club and members and wanted to stretch myself—and others may be feeling the same. I reached

To finish his Advanced Leadership-Silver designation, Paul's High-Performance Leadership project was a membership drive in Area 20 after in-person meetings were not allowed. The project's mission was to bring Area 20 to Distinguished

status. Falling a bit short of that, the area claimed success when it received the Online Ovation award and all four clubs were each awarded the Online Trailblazer award!

Paul's participation in Toastmasters has had a tremendous influence in his professional life. At the NH Department of Transportation, he is well-known as a Toastmaster and is frequently asked to facilitate meetings. Recently he was named to the DOT Commissioner's special committee that was formed to write the department's guidelines and procedures for online public meetings and hearings.

Last year, Paul was given his *Certificate of Proficiency* in the Pathways "Innovative Planning" path, and this year is enrolled in an additional two paths as well as the Pathways Mentor Program.


