The Club Coach Program

Club Eligibility:

- Have between 1 and 12 members in good standing at the time of appointment
- Not be suspended or closed
- Vote with a quorum present prior to requesting a coach
- Not have more than two coaches appointed at one time

Member Eligibility:

- Cannot be a current member of the club
- Must be in good standing
- Must request the District Director or Club Growth Director submit their appointment to World Headquarters for processing. Note: The Club Growth Director may appoint a Club Retention Chair to administer all process requirement prior.

The power behind the unconscious psychological contract between a Club Coach and Club Members



A psychological contract is the first effort that needs to be established when attempting to guide a struggling club through a recovery, this is accomplished by making sure important action steps are followed.

When we are in a struggling situation, it is natural to be unconsciously in defense mode and have unconscious defense armors up, when these armors are up, we have a hard time seeing forward because they block any outside view, all we see is our struggling situation. The more we see our

struggles, the harder it gets to move forward and eventually we can get mentally stuck. Simple action steps can break the cycle, they act similar to a peace treaty in the unconscious mind, they lower the unconscious defense armors and establishes a sense of security and trust, which in turn unlock the mind to be able to see new possibilities that were being prevented before.

How does this type of contract get established in a struggling Toastmaster Club?

- Action Step 1, the club vote on accepting a club coach, everyone should be part of the process, this act established a group peace treaty in the unconscious mind. *The action brings down the unconscious armors that can stop us from moving forward.*
- Action Step 2, the club accept a club coach that is appointed, everyone should be part of the process, the act establishes trust unconsciously in the mind. This unconscious power moves people forward in the ability to see new ideas and new possibilities that were being prevented by the mind before.

The previous simple actions steps taken creates an unconscious psychological contract that unlocks creativity, imagination, and new possibilities.

Division B is ready to spread the FUN of Toastmasters throughout our Division and District, **HELP** struggling clubs with numbers to fill roles and ATTRACT new members.

Truro Speakeasy Rotary Team Up

Toastmasters International announced an alliance with Rotary International in 2019 with new educational programs to support Rotary members when they join Toastmasters coming in 2020 and 2021.

Rotary service projects may offer leadership opportunities for Toastmasters to fulfill many leadership requirements.

How can an international alliance benefit your Toastmasters club? Rotary has local clubs and districts (like Toastmasters). Jennifer McClare, President of Let's show Rotary what Toastmasters can do. Truro Speakeasy Toastmasters took initiative to contact the Rotary club in their community. Jennifer invited Rotary Past-President, Alana Hirtle, to address their club in a Zoom gathering.

Because Speakeasy has a low membership, Jennifer called for assistance from their Division leaders and prior Area Directors who had helped sustain their club in the past. Their attendance was bolstered by 5 guests. A full Toastmasters meeting was demonstrated for Alana: Table Topics, Speeches and Evaluations. Alana even took on a Table Topic and reached the green light. Bravo!

Summary: A club showed initiative to push their personal boundaries speaking and leading within a larger group. Joint ventures with Rotary are planned. Speakeasy Toastmasters may reach a Rotary club of 60 to 70 members when they get to speak to them. Some Rotary clubs have waiting lists for speaking opportunities of 5 months! (How does rotary do that?)

We learned Rotary has 45 clubs in Atlantic Canada. Would it be worthwhile for your Toastmasters club to become allied with a Rotary club in your community?

Taking it to the Next Level

Toast of the Coast Advanced Club, chartered in February 2000, currently meets online and will be changing to a hybrid club once in-person meetings resume. Our trial run of a hybrid meeting in August went very well.

What sets Toast of the Coast apart from other advanced clubs? We initially struggled with this question and finally settled on round table evaluations. Each speaker receives the project evaluation. They then get feedback from every member in attendance. This feedback may reinforce what was said in the project evaluation or it may offer a different perspective. After the round table evaluation, the speaker has the opportunity to respond to the feedback. This method of evaluation gives much greater diversity in the feedback that each speaker receives. It also helps all members improve their evaluation skills by learning from the perspectives of other members.

The membership of Toast of the Coast is unique. Every member is, or has been, a District (or higher) leader. This provides a wealth of support to emerging leaders. If you are currently serving as an Area or Division Director, you will develop a support system for your leadership development. You have a built-in resource to help you with any challenges you may face in your leadership role. If you are thinking of taking on a leadership role outside the club, developing this support network in advance will help you know what is involved and whether such a role is right for you. We can help you be successful.

Becoming a member of Toast of the Coast will help you take your speaking skills to the next level. It will round out your skills development by providing that much-needed support for your leadership development.
