

Important Toastmasters Updates:

- 1. The latest Toastmaster Magazine confirms
  Pathways changes from Matt Kinsey's July 28, 2023
  email. A new Learning Management System (LMS)
  in Q1 2024 will enhance user-friendliness, including
  a Mobile App.
- 2. Pathways will now be accessible for visually-impaired members.
- 3. In the new Pathways, completed levels will be autosubmitted for recognition in Club Central, affecting Distinguished Club Program (DCP) credits. Be cautious about DCP credit allocation among your clubs.
- 4. Of the original 11 paths, the six are retained: Dynamic Leadership, Engaging Humor, Motivational Strategies, Presentation Mastery, Persuasive Influence, and Visionary Communication. Continue working on discontinued paths using the new LMS for credit.
- 5. Toastmasters introduces "explorations" in Pathways. Read more in the Education Programs FAQ at <a href="https://www.toastmasters.org/education/education-programs-faq">www.toastmasters.org/education/education-programs-faq</a>.
- 6. A new membership application (Rev 08/2023) reflects updated dues structure.




### DIVISION C Area 2


