

My goal this year is to make Division B a strong division by working with my team. I am working on perfecting 'impromptu speeches' and another DTM is not out of the question!

## KATHI ZWICKER, DTM

My DTM project is revitalizing a small historic neighbourhood on the northside of Fredericton. In 1981 the city erected the Westmorland Street Bridge. St. Mary's Ferry Landing has been neglected by the city since that time. As the volunteer animator with St. Mary's Ferry Landing Neighbourhood Association, I presented a vision to the Economic Vitality Committee City of Fredericton that included a number of requests. Our requests were largely passed by the Council of the City of Fredericton. We are currently awaiting interpretive panels and are advocating for a peace park, speakers' corner, butterfly garden on both sides of a walkway joining the two, and a second active transportation bridge on the site of the old Carleton Street Bridge piers. We are working with our main partners Rotary Club, the Trails Coalition and Fredericton Heritage Trust to see further progress on bringing our vision forward.

I am presently revitalizing a Rotary Club that has dwindled to two members with a new vision, a name change and the promise of growth in numbers and substance. Gamechangers Atlantic Rotary will do Rotary in a new way. We will have online meetings and work in small clusters throughout the Atlantic Provinces. I also am the co-chair of Women + in Politics Fredericton. It seems as I age, all my volunteer work is related. What would have been separate endeavours in the past, are becoming whole direction now а representing my values. I love it!



My energy is now focussed on getting Gamechangers Atlantic off the ground, continue to work on expanding the Rotary-Toastmasters Alliance in my Toastmasters District 45 and across the globe, getting the vision for the Speakers Corner-Peace Park accepted by the city council, and working on an active campaign for the 2nd walking bridge.

# MULTIPLE PATH COMPLETIONS HEATHER PERKINS, DTM

As a member of Toast of the Coast Toastmasters Club, Dartmouth TIC Talkers Toastmasters Club, and Schooner Toastmasters Halifax, Heather has achieved excellence by completing the Effective Coaching (EC5), Motivational Strategies (MS5), and Persuasive Influence (PI5) paths within the current Toastmaster year!

Heather's achievements reflect her hard work and determination in becoming a standout leader and communicator.

Q - WHAT PERSONAL GROWTH HAVE YOU NOTICED AFTER COMPLETING MULTIPLE PATHS? **A** - After 45 years in Toastmasters, it's hard to attribute my personal growth to any particular aspect of it. Much of the growth has come from serving in officer roles in the club, in multiple leadership roles in the District and as Region Advisor. I have certainly developed much better speaking skills, self-confidence, and experience in dealing with adverse situations and difficult people. One big change over the time is the ability to add humour to my speeches.

**A** - My approach is to figure out how I can make a project work for me. I believe there is the flexibility to stretch the boundaries of a project to ensure it meets one's needs.

Q - HOW HAS YOUR APPROACH TO NEW PROJECTS EVOLVED AS YOU'VE PROGRESSED THROUGH MULTIPLE PATHS?

Q - WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO SOMEONE STARTING THEIR SECOND OR THIRD PATH? A - Even though some of the projects you will be doing are the same, think about how you can approach it differently. For the IceBreaker, I doubt that anyone told everything about their life in 4 - 6 minutes. What different aspects can you share each time you give another Icebreaker (I've given at least 50 over the years)? Your communication or leadership style may change over time. Share how it's changed and why when you give a 2nd or 3rd or 10th speech on your communication style. Each time you repeat a project you should be learning something new while

approaching it with all you have learned from previous projects.

## Q - Can you share any skills you developed during this journey that you find valuable in other areas of your life?

The most important skills I learned while completing this path are when to be persuasive and influential, when to back off, and (the hardest part!) how to be okay with whatever transpires.

We only have so much influence over what others think, say, and do. No matter how much we believe it to be an exciting and worthy topic, we only have so much power to persuade. In a volunteer organization, if we insist, manipulate, or coerce, we run the risk of alienating our audience.

This Pathway taught me that it's not how much I have to share but how much I am willing to listen. It was during this time that I realized how important it is to speak through my heart, in an open-hearted, emotionally intelligent manner, and to pay attention to my audience's feedback, both verbal and nonverbal.

It is a challenging skill to master, and I am a work in progress. With each speech I deliver, I am training my brain to pick up on my audience's nonverbal cues. Granted, this can happen more easily in-person, but if you stop there, you've lost a huge portion of your audience and, subsequently, your ability to persuade and influence. Simply stated, if you do not believe you can connect online, through an electronic medium, you will not.

You must believe it to achieve it and achieve it to feel it.

If you do this - get over your reluctance to engage in a forum you find uncomfortable, to deeply consider your audience, and as Joe Grondin says, Speak to Reach, you will connect. You will be even more persuasive and influential than before because you have learned how to project your personality and intention through an electronic platform. With this skill, think about how much more influential you will be in person!

This is how I think of it - social media influencers have millions of followers that hang on their every word for a reason. There is a definite skill to connecting immediately with your audience, and the most skilled among us establish that connection from their first facial expression, word, or gesture. When I watch the World Championship of Public Speaking contest online, it feels like I am there, and that is due to the speaker's skill at projecting themselves through this electronic forum. That is a skill I have worked on during this Path. It is one that applies directly to my life outside of TM as I speak to non-Toastmasters audiences.

## Q - Which part of this Pathways experience did you find the most rewarding?

What I found the most rewarding about this Pathway was my HPL project, Effective Evaluations.

It was designed to help new members overcome their reluctance to evaluate another member, especially our more seasoned members.

I delivered the 1st speech to my home club, Riverside Toastmasters, outlining the key steps to a great evaluation. I shared the resources I use.

I conducted an Effective Evaluation workshop and invited a guest speaker to give a speech so that our members could each give her an evaluation.

I then invited Past International President, Jim Kokocki, to speak to our club and share his thoughts on delivering effective evaluations. I invited guests from our District. It was a success! Subsequent evaluations delivered by newer members were effective and delivered with confidence.

This project became another way I could exercise persuasive influence on my audience by sharing what was beneficial to them - by providing something they needed.

In summary, the Persuasive Influence pathway is a superb opportunity to focus on your ability to exemplify the core values of Toastmasters – respect, integrity, service, and excellence.

There is one more, very important item that I would like to share – Persuasive Influence cannot be achieved alone. ## Fall Workshop






Horace, thank you for everything. You have made this world a better place, and you will be deeply missed by your Toastmaster family.
