Income tax system

The IRS and the income tax system don't work the way most people think they do. There are old papers and opinions that show the IRS isn't a normal government agency and that it operates differently from other federal offices.

The 16th Amendment, the rule that created the income tax, was never properly approved by the states. The government should not have been allowed to collect income taxes in the first place.

The IRS isn't what it says it is, and the law that created income tax wasn't passed correctly.

The IRS and the federal income tax system operate very differently from what the public has been led to believe. Various older affidavits, legal opinions, and historical documents suggest that the IRS does not function as a typical U.S. government agency, and that its structure and authority are more unusual than most people realize.

The 16th Amendment, the amendment that established the federal income tax, was never properly ratified by the required number of states. That means that the federal government has been collecting income taxes without lawful authorization from the start.

The IRS is not organized like standard federal agencies, and the legal foundation for the income tax has not been validly established.
