## Introduction to SAN

Senior All-Nighter – Established in 1988 the Lewis and Clark Senior All Nighter is a 501 C 3 non-profit offering graduates a memorable, sober and safe way to celebrate. This important event is a gift from senior parents and the community. Entertainment, games, prizes, food, beverages are provided throughout the event with generous contributions of 100s of volunteer hours, business donations and extensive fundraising.

- What does SAN look like?
  - Party organized and staffed by parents with casino, inflatables, games, bingo, cash grab, raffle, etc. in the field house and outside behind the field house (outside is supposed to close by 10pm)
  - SAN suggested time is open for recommendations (9pm 3am?)
  - Kids get tired and 3am is a bit late but don't want kids to leave too early during prime time to go out after and get in trouble
  - Goal to raise \$150 per kid or about 60K in a perfect world.
  - Can we avoid charging for tickets? (We have charged \$40-\$75 in years past.)
    - Reason to charge SOMETHING for tickets is to get a firm count of attendees and to get kids to commit to attending. No decision reached on what to charge.
    - Ridgeline HS sells a "senior bundle" with the party ticket, yard sign, t-shirt...

- Where does the budget go?
  - Food trucks, inflatables, games, casino, bingo, hypnotist, art room, spin to win, prizes, leave \$5000 for next year's party costs that have to be paid ahead of start to next SAN group taking over (such as insurance, continuation of PO box, etc)
- New ideas for this year?
  - Discussion of Triple Play or locations (would need to include a bus from LC to event and back). Heather Beznaiguia (and others?) will investigate and bring back more information (to October meeting?) about options and cost
  - Eliminate some of the activities from last year that were not as popular or didn't involve as many students such as the mechanical bull. Reference wrap-up document from 2024.
  - Earn funds by working concessions at events at Podium/Arena/Stadium.
    Each volunteer would need to get a food and alcohol handlers permit before volunteering.
    - Andrea and Deanna looking into it
  - Survey students for interest in activities for party
  - Send out a one-time donation ask to SAN (QR code?) use letter from 2019/2020 to create a new ask; include estimate of cost and consider amounts (\$150 per kid) plus "scholarships"; keep letter short with links to more information; share with relatives; include mission statement
    - Deanna will start working on this; Megan will help; need to get donation link/QR code figured out
    - Deanna to connect Lisa Moore and Mike Hogan
  - Create a video to advertise and fundraise gather pictures from past SANs to and send to Gomez production class to create a video
    - Who will coordinate this??
