
Amos C. Wilson, a member of The West

On a former day, to-wit, February 21, 1991, came the respondent, Amos C. Wilson, a member of The West Virginia State Bar, by Daugherty, Tantlinger & Daugherty, and George A. Daugherty, his attorneys, and presented to the Court his petition for voluntary resignation from The West Virginia State Bar thereby surrendering his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia, effective immediately, pending resolution of annulment proceedings scheduled for hearing before this Court on the 2nd day of July, 1991, for the reasons stated therein.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby grant the respondent's petition for voluntary resignation from The West Virginia State Bar. It is therefore ordered that the license of the respondent to practice law in the State of West Virginia be, and the same hereby is, suspended, effective from this date, pending resolution of the annulment proceedings scheduled for hearing before this Court

on the 2nd day of July, 1991; all of which is ordered to be
certified to The West Virginia State Bar.


Amos C. Wilson, a former member of The
